SB 19

The purpose of this legislation is to correct a mistake committed in the original authorizing legislation for the Kansas Information Resources Council passed by the 1994 Legislature. The problem was known at the time the bill was returned to the House for a motion to concur or nonconcur with the Senate changes in the bill, but since the bill was not placed in a conference committee due to the motion to concur prevailing, the problem was not corrected last year.

Currently, the two members of the Legislature who serve on the Council are not paid per deim compensation for attendance at the monthly meetings. This practice is contrary to the reimbursements provisions for legislators serving on most public entities, except a few such as the Kansas Tourism Commission.

It would appear that legislators were inadvertently included in the section of the bill which precludes the three private sector representatives from receiving per deim compensation for serving on the Council. The rationale was that these people were on the payroll of their companies and would be compensated by the firms when attending the Council meetings.

During the Sessions when both legislators are in Topeka, this provision is not important. However, as all of you know, during the Interim when legislators come to Topeka for statutorily mandated attendance for serving on public bodies other than legislative committees, per deim compensation usually is paid. There are a few exceptions, but in general, attendance at these public meetings is treated just like attendance at regular Interim legislative committee meetings.

I urge your favorable recommendation of this bill to correct this problem.

# TESTIMONY KYLE G. SMITH, ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL KANSAS BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION BEFORE THE HOUSE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND ELECTIONS COMMITTEE REGARDING SENATE BILL 19 MARCH 8, 1995

Madam Chairman and Members of the Committee:

I am Kyle Smith, Assistant Attorney General assigned to the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI). I appear today on behalf of Director Larry Welch to request this committee consider an amendment to SB 19.

The amendment we offer was originally requested as separate legislation and was introduced as HB 2444 in the Judiciary Committee. However, due to the large volume of bills before that committee, coupled with the observation that SB 19 appeared to be a good vehicle, we requested that no hearings be held on HB 2444, but rather we would try to amend SB 19.

As seen in the attached balloon, we are requesting that the Director of the Kansas Bureau of Investigation be designated as a member of the Kansas Information Resources Council (KIRC). As the committee is aware, the KIRC has an important and formidable job in managing the state's information resources. The Director of the KBI is in charge of some of the largest data bases in the state; the criminal history record central repository and the AFIS fingerprint repository. Further, the Director is by statute a member of the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council, which due to recommendations of the Koch Crime Commission and various federal legislation, is currently revamping, computerizing and designing a plan to bring computerized

AN ACT concerning the Kansas information resources council; amending K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 75-4740 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 75-4740 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-4740. (a) There is hereby established the Kansas information resources council which shall be attached to the department of administration for purposes of administrative functions.

(b) The council shall be composed of 20 [18] members as follows: The secretary of administration; the secretary of health and environment; the secretary of human resources; the secretary of revenue; the secretary of social and rehabilitation services; the secretary of transportation; the judicial administrator of the Kansas supreme court; the executive director of the Kansas board of regents; the chairperson of the joint eommittee on eomputers and telecommunications; the commissioner of education; four additional chief administrative officers of various state agencies; and three representatives from the private sector, the chief information architect and the director of the budget to serve as advisory, nonvoting members. In addition, during those periods of time when the ehairperson of the joint committee on computers and telecommunications is a member of the senate, one member of the council shall be a member of the house of representatives appointed by the chairperson of the eommittee on appropriations speaker of the house of representatives and during those periods of time when the chairperson of the joint committee on computers and telecommunications is a member of the house of representatives, one member of the council shall be a member of the senate appointed by the chairperson of the committee on ways and means president of the senate. Legislator members of the council serving on the effective date of this act shall continue to serve as members until July 1, 1995. The four chief administrative officers and representatives from the private sector shall be appointed by the governor for a term not to exceed 18 months. Members, other than members appointed to the
