## Testimony on HB 2384 Senate Agriculture Committee March 9, 1995 Prepared by Joe Lieber Kansas Cooperative Council

Mr. Chairman and members of the committee, I'm Joe Lieber, Executive Vice President of the Kansas Cooperative Council. The Council's membership consists of nearly 200 cooperative businesses having a combined total of nearly 200,000 members.

The Council was happy with the old way the Board of Agriculture was selected and the hiring of the Secretary of Agriculture. But, since that was declared unconstitutional, our choice would be to have the Secretary of Agriculture appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate.

Our philosophy here is that Governor-in and Governor-out, we would usually come up with a good appointee that would have to be confirmed by the Senate.

We are opposed to HB 2384 because of the long range affects it will have on agriculture. In the not-so-distant future, Kansas will go through reapportionment. The first Congress district may end up having 80% of the farm production in the State but it would only be entitled to two board members. Other board members would come from urban districts.

Even though the Governor could pick three at-large from the first district, we feel he/she would probably like to have at least one consumer advocate and an "environmentalist" on the board.

We would like to take our chances with the Governor appointing one person to the position of Secretary.

The Council does like the idea of an advisory board because we feel the board would be a great asset to the Secretary and it would also enable the Secretary to feel the pulse of the Ag industry in Kansas.

We would like to see the board selected similar to the way the old board was selected at an annual meeting. We realize that an advisory board does not have as much teeth as the old board, but I think it is a realistic option.

For this reason, we oppose HB 2384.
