APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Senator Martin made a motion to approve the minutes of February 9, 10, and 13, 1995. The motion was seconded by Senator Corbin. The motion carried.

GUEST SPEAKER

David Westbrook, Kansas Tax Policy Foundation, spoke to the committee concerning the Foundation. He said it is a 501c6 organization founded in the state of Kansas. He said it is funded by businesses across the state and is concerned with tax policy and long term solutions. One of the main goals is the creation of stability in the tax policy development. He listed the principles: Economic well being is dependent upon business investing in capital; companies making decisions about where to locate will go to the climate where they are treated the best; tax policy has a direct effect on capital investment; and capital decisions are not made in one year. He said when passing laws things to consider are what kind of effect will this tax have on the economy. There are certain taxes that will stimulate the economy and certain taxes that may not stimulate the economy. He said the Foundation has seven criteria:

- 1. Tax policy should offer stability
- 2. Tax policy should contribute to the creation of jobs
- 3. Tax policy should contribute to the orderly expansion of the economy
- 4. Tax policy should take advantage of the Kansas work ethics
- 5. Tax policy should be fair and represent the entire state
- 6. Tax policy should stimulate the ability of Kansas to compete with other states in getting businesses
- 7. Tax policy should be designed to fund government adequately

Mr. Westbrook said the Foundation is offering a cooperative effort that is needed and that is what he is bringing to the legislature today. He said they will not be ready this spring but hope to be ready to offer their assistance during the 1996 Session.

The committee had a number of questions for Mr. Westbrook and sincerely appreciated his effort in bringing this information to them today.

The meeting adjourned at 12:00 noon.
