MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Dave Kerr at 1:30 p.m. on March 27, 1995 in Room 123-S of the Capitol.

Board of Regents Reappointment Hearing for Sidney Warner

Mr. Warner briefly reviewed his qualifications. (See Attachment 1 & 2) Senator Emert asked Mr. Warner how he felt about his two years of service. Mr. Warner stated that it had been a tremendous experience. He has met a different economic class of people with different interests and knowledge. He has also learned the dynamics of how the university systems and Board of Regents system work.

Senator Lawrence asked him what the greatest challenge is for the years to come. He believes it to be funding to carry out the mission of the universities. She asked him how he felt about qualified admissions. He is not concerned with qualified admissions because he feels financial qualifications, that is rising tuition rates, will impact many students and lower the number of admissions. She asked him what the answer was for this problem. He replied the universities need to be financially sound so degree programs can be offered at the lowest possible cost, and increase state aid for students.

Chairman Kerr asked him if he had found any unwarranted duplication of programs in the Regent system. He replied home economics has been phased out at Fort Hays State University, and speech pathology has been phased out at Kansas State University. Many other programs are currently being reviewed.

Senator Oleen commended him for the time he has spent responding to individual's questions and talking to Kansans. He has done a fine job.

HB 2556 - School districts, county jails or state correctional institutions not required to provide educational opportunities for certain inmates

Representative Vernon Correll, sponsor of the bill, briefly explained it. He stated a school in his district had an 18 year old man, convicted as an adult of drug possession, sentenced to 15 months in county jail, suing the school district to be allowed to attend school on the school grounds. The school had offered to send teachers to the jail, but he rejected that as he does not want to be in jail. He had previously been let out of jail by the judge on his case to attend school on the school grounds, but was disruptive in classrooms, and was offering other students drugs. The school does not want him on the school grounds. (See Attachment 3)

Senator Corbin asked if there was a GED program offered at the jail. The answer was yes.

Gerry Henderson, USA, testified in favor of the bill. The circumstances in Oswego which prompted the introduction of this bill stretch the bounds of believability. Schools must have the right to deny admission to convicted adult felons at least until such time as they have served their sentences. (See Attachment 4)

A motion was made by Senator Oleen to amend the effective date to the date of publication in the register rather

than the statute date. The motion was seconded by Senator Corbin and the motion carried.

A motion was made by Senator Jones to pass the bill favorably as amended. The motion was seconded by Senator Walker, and the motion carried.

HB 2558 - Educational service contracts for youth centers, bidding exemption

Ben Barrett explained the background on the bill. The Division of Purchasing told SRS that they had to put their service contracts out for competitive bids. Previously, the rates had been agreed to through negotiation. No one really wanted to make a bid, and when coerced into offering a bid, the bids were higher than the negotiated rates agreed to previously. The bill is designed to put in the statute that services can be provided through a negotiation or bid process.

A motion was made by Senator Emert to pass the bill out favorably. Senator Downey seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

A motion was made by Senator Corbin to favorably recommend to the full senate that Mr. Warner be reappointed to the Board of Regents. The motion was seconded by Senator Lawrence, and the motion carried.

A motion was made by Senator Walker that the minutes of the March 21, March 22 and March 24 meetings be approved. The motion was seconded by Senator Emert, and the motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:15 p.m.
