Sen. Oleen introduced Adjutant General, James F. Rueger, to give a presentation on the force reductions within the national guard. General Rueger discussed the force structure on the national level and how this structure effects Kansas (<u>Attachment 1</u>). General Rueger discussed several new national guard programs in which they were pleased to be involved. Some of these include being chosen as the first state to use the Paladin, a high-tech piece of artillery equipment; a Community Multi-media Learning Center program, which will in cooperation with Kansas State University provide satellite programming, the Internet, multi-media information to rural and urban Kansans; and being chosen for one of five sights in the United States for a Retro Europe program which seeks to rebuild military equipment which was previously being unused in Europe due to down sizing in the military.

Sen. Oleen asked for committee action on approving Committee minutes for the Committee Meeting on January 25. Sen. Tillotson made a motion to correct the minutes of January 25 to read that Sen. Vidricksen made a motion to amend the enactment date of SB 17 to be upon publication in the Register and to approve the minutes as corrected: The motion was seconded by Sen. Praeger; the motion passed.





Kansas Distributive Learning Center Demonstration Project Three Year Project


- Kansas State University (KSU) and the Kansas Army National Guard (KSARNG) will jointly create and operate Community Multi-media Learning Centers in 26 communities across the state.
- The learning Centers will provide Kansans Urban and Rural with equal access to educational satellite programming, the Internet, multi-media information and point-to-point and multi-point interactive videoconferencing.
- The pilot project will provide comprehensive and detailed evaluation of the feasibility of shared learning centers located in and operated by an assortment of federal, state and local agencies (Guard armories, county extension offices, libraries, hospitals, schools etc.).
- The pilot project will provide funds for the development, reengineering and delivery of critical programming to clientele served by Kansas State University, and the Kansas Army National Guard.
- The pilot project would provide the necessary equipment and the personnel to design, coordinate, install, maintain, and program the system during the three year project period.
