## MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON FEDERAL AND STATE AFFAIRS.

The meeting was called to order by Senator Lana Oleen at 11:00 a.m. on February 28, 1995 at the rail of the Capitol.

Sen. Oleen directed the committee's attention to four names for confirmation: Jacqueline Sullivan, Human Rights Commission; James Cates, Kansas Lottery Commission; Homer Kruckenberg, Kansas Lottery Commission; and Sheila Frahm, Secreatry of Administration. Sen. Tillotson made a motion to recommend Jacqueline Sullivan for favorable confirmation and the motion was seconded by Sen. Vidricksen. The motion passed.

Sen. Ramirez made a motion to recommend James Cates for favorable confirmation and the motion was seconded by Sen. Tillotson. The motion passed.

Sen. Ramirez made a motion to give no recommendation on the confirmation of Homer Kruckenberg and the motion was seconded by Sen. Tillotson. Sen. Oleen called for discussion on the motion. Sen. Walker made a substitute motion to recommend Homer Kruckenberg for favorable confirmation and the motion was seconded by Sen. Jones. The motion failed. Sen. Oleen called for a vote on the original motion. The motion passed.

Sen. Ramirez made a motion to recommend Sheila Frahm for favorable confirmation and the motion was seconded by Sen. Tillotson. The motion passed.

Sen. Oleen asked the committee to direct its attention to <u>SB 252</u>, an act concerning animals; relating to certain crimes and penalties therefor; providing for dispositon of certain animals taken into custody; relating to the licensure and regulation of pounds and animal shelters. <u>Sen. Hensley made a motin to reconsider the bill and the motin was seconded by Sen. Jones.</u> <u>The motion passed</u>.

Sen. Oleen called for discussion on the bill. Sen. Gooch made a motion to amend the bill to remove the language which requires that the owner of an alleged fighting dog put up a surety bond and replace language to read that the court would order dog care costs to the winning party in the case. The motion was seconded by Sen. Ramirez. The motion passed.

<u>Sen. Gooch made a motion to recommend the bill as amended for favorable action</u>. <u>The motion was seconded by Sen. Jones; the motion passed.</u>

Sen. Oleen called for further discussion, and seeing none, the meeting was adjourned at 3:55 p.m.
