MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON FEDERAL AND STATE AFFAIRS.

The meeting was called to order by Senator Lana Oleen at 11:05 a.m. on March 21, 1995 in Room 254-E of the Capitol.

Sen. Oleen asked the subcommittee members to turn their attention to <u>SB 375</u>, an act concerning the Kansas Statutes Annotated, relating to distribution thereof. Mary Galligan distributed a break-down of distribution of statute books compiled by the office of the Secretary of State (<u>Attachment 1</u>). Sen. Oleen stated that there were cost savings which could be accrued from limiting the number of sets distributed each year to legislators and asked the subcommittee if they wanted to change the language of the bill concerning distribution to other departments.

Sen. Oleen called on Jerry Sloan, Office of Judicial Administration to discuss the unlimited amount of statute books which the judicial department can ask for each year. Jerry Sloan stated while they are allotted an unlimited supply of books, the practice has always been to receive only supplements and replacements of books as needed.

Sen. Parkinson clarified that the intent of the bill was to give freshmen legislators two complete sets of statute books their first year and only supplements in the following years they serve. Sen. Parkinson stated that he believed language needed to specify that a legislator could receive replacement volumes if needed due to damage or due to a volume becoming lost. Sen. Parkinson made a motion to amend the bill to read that legislators could receive needed replacement volumes and to recommend the bill favorably as amended to the full committee. Sen. Tillotson seconded the motion; the motion passed.

Sen. Oleen explained that <u>SB 346</u>, an act concerning state boards and commissions; relating to the powers duties and functions of members thereof; relating to the terms thereof, is on General Orders after amendatory language by the committee on Organization, Calendar, and Rules.

Sen. Oleen asked the subcommittee members to turn their attention to <u>HB 2527</u>, an act concerning alcoholic beverages; relating to revocation or suspension of a retailer's license. Sen. Oleen explained that the concern regarding the bill was the need to ensure consistency between the employee and the employer. Sen. Parkinson stated that he had a conceptual amendment which would allow for hotels and motel which meet certain requirements to place locked mini-bars in their rooms. Sen. Oleen stated that she would like for Sen. Parkinson to prepare a balloon. Sen. Parkinson made a motion to report HB 2527 for favorable action to the full committee and the motion was seconded by Sen. Hensley. The motion passed.

The subcommittee briefly discussed <u>HCR 5008</u>, a concurrent resolution memorializing Congress to cease imposing mandates on the states which are beyond the scope of Congress' constitutionally delegated powers under the 10th amendment to the Constitution of the United States. The subcommittee discussed retaining the resolution in committee until action is taken on <u>SCR 1606</u>, a resolution calling for a conference of the states.

The subcommittee briefly discussed <u>SB 365</u>, an act concerning certain taxes on alcoholic beverages; relating to disposition of revenues. Sen. Hensley stated that he would like to see an amendment which further defined enforcement to only include "apprehension". Sen. Oleen stated that she sees a need for the bill because there are communities which are not complying with the law and have no intention of changing their policies.

Sen. Oleen adjourned the subcommittee meeting at 11:45 a.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 24, 1995.
