The Chairman called the meeting to order and asked for action on the March 15 minutes.

Another member commented that the committee should not act on the bill. It can be suggested to those groups who are interested in the bill to come to some kind of terms. The two different groups seem to be very far apart.

The comment was made that these groups cannot negotiate anything they want; they are subject to regulation. The Attorney General's office has no obligation to try and work out a bill that suits the private detectives. The Attorney General's office has an obligation for the public safety and the public interest at large.

Senator Reynolds moved there be no action taken on **SB 341**. Senator Papay gave a second to the motion. The motion carried.

The Chairman said he would contact the interested parties and inform them of the committee's decision.

HB 2462--rules and regulations; review by JCARR

Members commented that this was a way to save time and effort. They do not see the Secretary of State's job in regard to the bill as time consuming as the office thinks it will be.

Senator Steffes moved to amend HB 2462 with the Wildlife and Parks amendment. Senator Papay gave a second to the motion.
