MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Carlos Mayans at 1:30 p.m. on February 22, 1996 in Room 423-S of the Capitol.

The minutes of the meeting held on February 29, 1996, were approved.

HB 2692 - Licensing, master level psychologists, master level psychologists, marriage and family therapists, and professional psychologists

Chairperson Mayans asked the committee to consider action on **HB 2692**. He also thanked the sub-committee for their help and effort in developing the "balloon" amendments (see <u>Attachment 2</u>). Representative Gilmore, Chairperson of the Subcommittee for **HB 2692**, reported the amendments involved implementation of an education and training forum in which mental health facilitators would be able to effectively interact. In addition, the committee discussed an amendment increasing the licensure requirements for professional counselors to at least 4,000 supervised hours of professional experience. Finally, amendments regarding increased fees, temporary permits and the possible "grandfathering" of the bill were also discussed.

On motion of Representative Gilmore, seconded by Representative Morrison, the committee unanimously adopted the subcommittee "balloon" amendments.

Discussion continued on **HB 2692** with Representative Geringer questioning the viability of grandfathering the bill, along with Representative Henry's concern over increased fees. Also, Representative Kirk expressed concerns with the issue of credentialing and questioned the process of the licensure proposals.

Representative Mayans made a motion to pass the bill as amended; the motion was seconded by Representative Merritt and the committee voted for **HB 2692** be passed as amended. Representative Gilmore will carry the bill.

HB 2949 - Partnership for prevention of teenage pregnancy act

Chairperson Mayans asked the committee which bills they would like to take action on, with consensus to **HB** 2949. Representative Ballard, sponsor of the bill, proposed amendments replacing the following council members: elected officials with two legislators, law enforcement members on the council to physicians, and three citizens with three teenage students. Representative Henry moved to accept the amendments of the council members which was seconded by Representative Kirk.

There was further discussion and concerns expressed about the duplication of health care workers and the make up of the council members. Representative O'Connor express concern that parents were not included and offered a substitute motion to amend the members of the council to four parents, two health care workers, two clergy, and three students. Representative Hutchins seconded the motion and the committee voted to accept the substitute motion. The original motion failed.

Further discussion continued on **HB 2949**. Representative Henry moved to pass the bill out favorably which was seconded by Representative Goodwin. Representative Morrison offered a substitute motion to table the bill. Representative Landwehr seconded the motion and the committee voted to table **HB 2949**. The original motion failed.

AN ACT concerning the behavioral sciences regulatory board; relating to licensure, regulation and scope of practice issues of professional counselors, marriage and family therapists and masters level psychologists; amending K.S.A. 65-5801, 65-5802, 65-5803, 65-5804, 65-5806, 65-5807, 65-5808, 65-5809, 65-5810, 65-5811, 65-5812, 65-5813, 65-5815, 65-5816, 65-6401, 65-6402, 65-6403, 65-6404, 65-6405, 65-6406, 65-6407, 65-6408, 65-6409, 65-6410, 65-6412, 74-5361, 74-5362, 74-5363, 74-5364, 74-5365, 74-5366, 74-5367, 74-5369, 74-5371, 74-5372, 74-7501 and 74-7507 and K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 65-6411 and repealing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 65-5814 and 74-5368.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 65-5801 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-5801. K.S.A. 65-5801 through 65-5816 shall be known and may be cited as the professional counselors registration licensure act.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 65-5802 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-5802. As used in the professional counselors registration licensure act:

- (a) "Board" means the behavioral sciences regulatory board created by K.S.A. 74-7501 and amendments thereto.
- (b) "Practice of professional counseling" means assisting an individual or group for a fee, monetary or otherwise, through counseling, assessment, consultation and referral.
- (c) "Professional counseling" means to assist an individual or group to develop understanding of personal strengths and weaknesses, to restructure concepts and feelings, to define goals and to plan actions as these are related to personal, social, educational and career development and adjustment.

(d) "Assessment" means selecting, administering, scoring and interpreting instruments designed to describe an individual's aptitudes, abilities, achievements, interests and personal characteristics.

(e) "Consultation" means the application of principles, methods and techniques of the practice of counseling to assist in solving current or potential problems of individuals or groups in relation to a third party.

(f) "Referral" means the evaluation of information to identify problems and to determine the advisability of referral to other practitioners.



Sec. 38. K.S.A. 74-7501 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-7501. (a) There is hereby created a behavioral sciences regulatory board eonsisting which shall consist prior to June 30, 1998, of seven 13 members. Members of the board shall be appointed by the governor. The membership of the board prior to June 30, 1998, shall be as follows: Two members of the board shall be licensed psychologists; two members of the board shall be licensed to engage in the practice of social work social workers; two members of the board shall be licensed marriage and family therapists; two members of the board shall be licensed professional counselors; two members of the board shall be licensed masters level psychologists; and three members of the board shall be from and represent the general public. On and after June 30, 1998, the behavioral sciences regulatory board shall consist of seven members as follows: One member of the board shall be a licensed psychologist; one member of the board shall be a licensed social worker; one member of the board shall be a licensed marriage and family therapist; one member of the board shall be a licensed professional counselor; one member of the board shall be a licensed masters level psychologist and two members of the board shall be from and represent the general public. Each member of the board shall be a citizen of the United States and a resident of this state.

(b) The term of office of each member of the board shall be four years, except that the term of office of for the members first appointed pursuant to the first board this act shall be as follows: Three members shall be appointed for terms of two years, three members shall be appointed for terms of three years and one member shall be appointed for a term of four years. The governor shall designate the term of office for each member appointed to the first board One member licensed to engage in the practice of marriage and family therapy shall have a term of one year, the other member licensed to engage in the practice of marriage and family therapy shall have a term of two years as specified by the governor; one member licensed to engage in the practice of masters level psychology shall have a term of two years, the other member licensed to engage in the practice of masters level psychology shall have a term of four years as specified by the governor; the two members licensed to engage in the practice of professional counseling shall have terms of two years. All positions whose term of office expires June 30, 1998, shall terminate and no reappointments shall be made therefor, except that one position for a person licensed to practice professional counseling shall be retained and an appointment made therefor. Effective July 1, 1998, the board shall be seven members. No member of the board shall be appointed for more

than two successive terms. Upon the expiration of a member's term of office, the governor shall appoint a qualified successor. Each member shall serve until a successor is appointed and qualified. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the membership of the board prior to the expiration of a term of office, the governor shall appoint a qualified successor to fill the unexpired term. The governor may remove any member of the board for misconduct, incompetency or neglect of duty.

(c) The board shall organize annually at its first meeting subsequent to June 30 and shall select from its members a chairperson and a vice-chairperson. Other meetings shall be held as the board designates. Four seven members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

- (d) The board may appoint an executive director who shall be in the unclassified service of the Kansas civil service act and shall receive an annual salary fixed by the board, subject to approval by the governor. The board may employ clerical personnel and other assistants, all of whom shall be in the classified service under the Kansas civil service act. The board may make and enter into contracts of employment with such professional personnel as necessary, in the board's judgment, for the performance of its duties and functions and the execution of its powers.
- (e) Members of the behavioral sciences regulatory board attending meetings of the board, or attending a subcommittee meeting thereof authorized by the board, shall be paid compensation, subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto.

- (f) adopt and enforce rules and regulations for professional conduct of persons licensed under the licensure of psychologists act of the state of Kansas, registered licensed under the professional counselors registration licensure act, licensed under K.S.A. 65-6301 to 65-6318, inclusive, and amendments thereto, registered licensed under K.S.A. 74-5361 to 74-5372, inclusive, and amendments thereto, licensed under the marriage and family therapists registration licensure act or registered under the alcohol and other drug abuse counselor registration act;
- (g) adopt and enforce rules and regulations establishing requirements for the continuing education of persons licensed under the licensure of psychologists act of the state of Kansas, registered licensed under the professional counselors registration licensure act, licensed under K.S.A. 65-6301 to 65-6318, inclusive, and amendments thereto, licensed under K.S.A. 74-5361 to 74-5372, inclusive, and amendments thereto, licensed under the marriage and family therapists licensure act or registered under the alcohol and other drug abuse counselor registration act;
- (h) adopt rules and regulations establishing classes of social work specialties which will be recognized for licensure under K.S.A. 65-6301 to 65-6318, inclusive, and amendments thereto;
