
Merle Hill representing the Kansas Association of Community Colleges also testified in support of the bill (Attachment 2).

## SENATE FEDERAL AND STATE AFFAIRS March 28, 1996 Hearing on HB 3081

Chair Oleen and members of the committee:

Secretary Thornburgh appreciates the opportunity to comment on HB 3081. This bill provides for the registration and regulation of athlete agents by the secretary of state's office.

Our testimony is based upon interviews and a cursory examination of the industry and the proposed legislation. The public policy promoted by HB 3081 seeks to protect young athletes from unconscionable contracts and fraudulent practices.

Passage of this bill would assign new duties to the secretary of state's office. HB 3081 requires the secretary to "actively enforce" the act by conducting investigations, approving contracts, exercising subpoena power, issuing and revoking registrations and assessing fines up to \$25,000, among other duties, all pursuant to the Kansas administrative procedure act. These regulatory responsibilities have never been assigned to our office. However, the filing duties identified by HB 3081 are similar to other statutory filings performed by the secretary of state's office.

If the legislature adopts this legislation and determines that the secretary of state is the appropriate enforcement agency, we are capable of executing the regulatory scheme contemplated by HB 3081. All we ask is that, if we are assigned this duty, we be given the necessary enforcement tools and funding to establish the standard of "active enforcement" set out by the act.

The 19 community college athletic directors support House Bill No. 3081 and are pleased to see that such action is being recommended to protect the interests and rights of student athletes. One of the athletic directors informed me that what we know about sports agents and their contacts with young colleges athletes" is just the tip of the iceberg."

This individual, who played in the National Football League for eight years, said he got to know sports agents quite well during his professional sports career. He suggested that is certainly time for the state to restrict the activities of athlete agents and to protect young college athletes from the "vultures." He did not choose that word lightly.

The athletic directors of the Kansas community colleges strongly support HB 3081 and would request that you recommend it favorably for passage.
