SB 401 - AN ACT CONCERNING THE SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION; RELATING TO CERTAIN POWERS AND DUTIES; RELATING TO THE FEASIBILITY OF CERTAIN TOLL OR TURNPIKE PROJECTS

This bill was discussed briefly. Senator Brady made a motion to pass this legislation favorably as amended. (Attachment 1) A second was made by Senator Lawrence. Motion carried.

SB 548 - CONCERNING COUNTIES; RELATING TO ROAD WORK

The Committee discussed this bill at length. Considerable thought went into the idea of changing the word "may" to "shall" which, was thought, would alter the intent of the bill. No action was taken on this but Senator Lawrence made an amendment to change the amended version from \$30,000 to \$50,000 in line 15. <u>Senator Papay seconded this. Motion carried.</u> (Attachment 2)

Senator Rock voiced strong feelings that this legislation should be left to local discretion. Senator Jones wholeheartedly agreed.

A decision could not be reach so the Chairman announced that the Committee would take up this bill next Tuesday for further discussion and possible action.

AN ACT concerning counties; relating to road work; amending K.S.A. 68-520, 68-1104 and 68-1116 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 68-520 is hereby amended to read as follows: 68-520. The board of county commissioners may shall in constructing, surfacing, repairing or maintaining the county roads det contracts for such work when the cost for any one project for constructing surfacing, repairing or maintaining county roads shall exceed \$10,000. For any project that does not exceed \$10,000, the county commissioners may let contracts, for all or any part of such work, or said board may buy the materials and the contract all or any part of the labor, or may purchase or rent machinery and other equipment, and employ labor, under the direction of the county engineer: Provided, That Before beginning to construct, surface or repair any road by day labor, the approved plans and specifications and an estimate of the cost must be filed in the office of the county clerk. On all day-labor work the county engineer shall keep an accurate itemized account of the expenditures for labor, materials and work performed and file a sworn statement of the same in the office of the county clerk at the end of each month, and a final statement when the work is completed.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 68-1104 is hereby amended to read as follows: 68-1104. (a) The board of county commissioners shall construct, reconstruct, repair and maintain all county bridges and county culverts located on county roads and township roads and the cost of such work shall be paid from the bridge fund of the county. All township culverts shall be constructed, reconstructed, repaired and maintained by the township board of highway commissioners and the cost of such work shall be paid from the road fund of the township. Except as hereinafter provided, all approaches to culverts and bridges on township roads shall be constructed, reconstructed, and maintained by the township board of highway commissioners and the cost of such work shall be paid from the road fund of the township, except that where the payment of the costs of constructing such approaches has been authorized by a majority vote of the electors of the county in which such township is located prior to the effective date of this act, said cost of construction shall be paid from the county's bridge

(b) All projects for construction, reconstruction or maintenance of bridges or culverts and approaches thereto as referred to in section (a) in excess of \$10,000 shall be awarded on a public letting to the lowest responsible bidder. In determining the cost of any project for the purposes of this section, the board of county commissioners or township board of highway commissioners shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, the cost of labor, equipment, materials and overhead.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 68-1116 is hereby amended to read as follows: 68-1116. Except as provided in K.S.A. 68-1114, nothing in this act shall prohibit the board from buying materials and contracting all or any part of the labor or purchasing or renting equipment to do the work by day labor under the direction of the county engineer. Prior to beginning the construction or repair of any bridge or culvert work by day labor the approved plans and specifications and the county engineer's estimates of the cost must be filed in the county clerk's office, and the said county engineer shall keep an accurate itemized account of all expenditures for labor and materials and work performed and file a signed statement of the same in the office of the county clerk at the end of each month and final statement when the work is completed. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any work the estimated cost of which exceeds fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) \$50,000.
