MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Phil Kline at 8:15 a.m. on March 20, 1997 in Room 514-S of the Capitol.

Chairperson Kline reported that the appropriations bills had been sent back for the committee to revisit and recommend realistic cuts to conform to the \$26.8 million difference between the \$112 million recommended by the Governor and the \$138.8 million tax relief package agreed to by the Governor and leadership members from the House and Senate. He reminded members that the LOB dollar amount is not known yet so it will be set aside for now and revisited before the Omnibus session.

Chairperson Kline recognized Alan Conroy, chief fiscal analyst, to explain the handouts prepared by the research department which included: a comparison of House and Senate appropriations recommendations, overviews of the state general fund, House committee adjustments to the amended Governor's recommendations, a list of tax relief packages, a list of 5 percent FTE reductions recommended by the House, and a list of items deleted by subcommittees to be reviewed at Omnibus.

Questions followed and some of the members requested additional lists from Legislative Research Department.

Chairperson Kline announced there would be a 10-minute break and then the members would split into majority and minority caucuses for approximately a half hour to develop recommendations. He requested research staff members to divide up between the caucuses and announced that since each caucus constitutes a majority of a quorum, the public was welcome to attend. The meeting recessed at 9:00 a.m.

The meeting reconvened at 12:25 p.m. The chairman recognized Representative Farmer who reported that there was an error in the numbers used to reach the \$138.8 million figure agreed upon earlier, but the committee would proceed as if there was no change until being notified of additional information. Chairperson Kline requested the caucuses continue their deliberations until one side finished. The meeting recessed at 12:28 p.m.

At 2:35 p.m. the chairman announced the numbers crunching would be complete shortly before 3:00 and the meeting would reconvene at 3:00 p.m.

The meeting reconvened at 3:20 p.m. A handout of Democratic Caucus Recommendations was distributed to the members. (Attachment 1)

Alan Conroy reviewed a handout titled, Tax Relief Packages Revision 2, and one called State General Fund Profile showing the compromise proposal figures.

Chairperson Kline described the procedure to be followed. A handout of Majority Caucus Adjustments to the Amended Governor's Recommendation was distributed. (Attachment 2)

Chairperson Kline reviewed each line item on the Majority Caucus Report and when there was a difference with the Minority Caucus Report, discussion was held until a general consensus was reached.

The first item of difference was the majority's recommendation to remove FY 97 funding for the implementation of privatized foster care services in the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services in the amount of \$4,000,000 instead of \$9,000,000. The Minority had recommended removing \$1,000,000. General consensus was reached at \$2,000,000.

The majority recommended reducing the Department of Administration's FY 97 funding for Year 2000 projects to \$2,916.673. The minority recommended reducing the entire \$6,416,673. General consensus was reached to remove all of the \$6,416,673 until the department reported back fully to the subcommittee prior to Omnibus.

For FY 98 the first item of change was the majority's recommendation to add back in \$74,100,000 to the State Department of Education. The minority agreed to the change.

The majority restored two positions to the State Board of Tax Appeals which changed the reduced amount to \$57,157 instead of a \$121,679 reduction. The minority agreed to the change.

The majority recommended shifting \$60,000 from the State General Fund for the Kansas State Fair to their fee funds for operating expenses. The minority agreed to the change.

The majority restored \$14,740 to the Kansas School for the Blind for computer equipment funding and restored \$109,325 for computer equipment funding for the Kansas School for the Deaf pending review of computer purchases at Omnibus. The minority agreed to the change.

The majority maintained the \$7,500,000 deletion for technology equipment in the Board of Regents' budget. The minority recommended deleting \$3,000,000. Discussion followed. Since there was division among the majority members on the issue, the chair declared the matter subject to amendment. Representative Farmer stated he would agree to the \$3,000,000 reduction of the minority if the regents provided a detailed plan to his subcommittee prior to Omnibus. Representative Edmonds requested a vote on the matter.

A motion was made by Representative Helgerson, seconded by Representative Farmer, to agree to reduce the cut to \$3,000,000 for the Board of Regents' technology equipment request. The motion carried. Representatives Edmonds and Landwehr are recorded as voting no.

The minority had recommended removing \$100,000 from the Regents' budget to allow them to join the Western Governor's Conference, but they agreed to the majority's recommendation of leaving that item in.

The majority agreed to a change in the Department of Health and Environment budget as recommended by the minority. The change involved deleting SGF funding and 9.0 FTE positions in the amount of \$300,000 (instead of deleting \$462,783) for activities related to oversight of animal feedlots, leaving \$162,783 for 3.0 unclassified temporary positions added in FY 97. The majority also agreed to delete moneys in the amount of \$60,000 (instead of deleting \$747,158) that fund a portion of the office of science and support pending further review and pending legislation, and add a proviso requiring the Department to reorganize the Division of Environment.

The majority eliminated the \$73,500 reduction for computer equipment for the State Historical Society pending review of all computer purchases at Omnibus. The minority agreed to the recommendation.

The minority recommended adding \$160,000 to Keys for Networking of the SRS Department for FY 98 with additional language that if they received other money through services rendered, then it would be deducted from the amount. The majority had not discussed the issue, and Representative Neufeld stated Keys did not request the money from his subcommittee. Representative Helgerson explained there was a misunderstanding on their part and requested the chairman write a letter telling them this is a one-year appropriation and they have to request it each year since it is not part of the base. Representative Neufeld suggested looking at small groups that are funded like this over the interim and trying to coordinate their services. Representative Neufeld proposed that if the \$160,000 could be taken from FY 97 savings in the Topeka State Hospital budget or reviewed again at Omnibus, then the majority members would agree to the money being given to Keys for Networking.

The minority asked staff to explain how to transfer the excess of the Lottery revenues and how to transfer the approximately \$1.7 million by spacing it out monthly instead of a lump-sum transfer which could have an adverse effect on the Lottery. The members agreed to increase the governor's recommended transfer by 1% in the FY 98 appropriations bill to ensure a smooth transfer of funds.

Chairperson Kline read the last page of the Majority Caucus Report listing their recommendations for 5 percent

FTE reductions in the Kansas Highway Patrol, Department of Corrections and Facilities, Department of Wildlife and Parks, and the Kansas Department of Transportation to be included in HB 2160. Discussion followed. There was no opposition by the minority to the reduction in the Kansas Highway Patrol positions since the issue will be revisited at Omnibus. Representative Kejr had a technical correction for a FTE position at Winfield Correctional Facility. Seeing no objection, the technical correction was included in the report. The minority agreed to the FTE reductions recommended for the Department of Corrections and Facilities, Department of Wildlife and Parks, and the Department of Transportation.

Chairperson Kline inquired if there were any additional items to be considered before voting on the bills. He recognized Representative Farmer who suggested on item of additional funding. He explained that Kansas would be the host state for the Council of State Governments' Midwest Meeting in Overland Park this year. Normally 13 legislators attend, but the leadership would like to invite the entire legislature this year which would cost \$165,000. Considerable discussion followed regarding Legislative Coordinating Council (LCC) expenditures. Representative Shriver filed for the record a notice of possible conflict regarding any issue involving the LCC and the legislative budget. (Attachment 3)

A motion was made by Representative Farmer, seconded by Representative Landwehr, to amend **HB 2160** by adding \$165,000 to allow all legislators to attend the Council of State Government meeting. The motion carried. Representative Shriver abstained from voting. Representative Edmonds voted no.

A motion was made by Representative O'Connor, seconded by Representative Weber, to amend HB 2160 by deleting \$324,122 from seven teen pregnancy prevention programs within the Department of Health and Environment. (Attachment 4) Discussion. The motion failed.

Representative Pottorff read a proviso to be included in <u>HB 2272</u> relating to the privatization of the certified public accountant examinations (which is a policy change contained in <u>HB 2298</u>) which would provide: that additional expenditures not to exceed \$120,000 may be made from the Board of Accountancy Fee Fund for FY 97 for the purpose of compensating certified public accounting examination services for the administration of the May 1997 certified public accountant examination, and provided further that all such expenditures shall be in addition to an expenditure limitation imposed upon the Board of Accountancy Fee Fund for FY 97. Seeing no objection, the chairman stated the proviso would be included. Representative Edmonds abstained from the action taken.

A motion was made by Representative Farmer, seconded by Representative Helgerson, to pass **HB 2160** and **HB 2272** as previously amended and then further amended today, and to make any necessary technical corrections. The motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 5:50 p.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 24, 1997.





ADOLESCENT PREGNANCIES among females aged 10-17 in SHAWNEE COUNTY




