Chairperson Lawrence called the meeting to order.

Educators who were present for the Eighth Annual Education Technology Fair introduced themselves. Comments from these educators expressed enthusiasm for the youth who were involved in various programs and projects in technology and pleas for continued aid and support from the Legislature. These educators told of their vision for the future for these young students and the hope that all students scattered throughout the state, urban and rural, would have the funding that would provide learning opportunities.

Comments were forthcoming from the educators and committee members about funding. Some companies in sparsely settled communities are asked for help for every project that comes along. One of the comments on the disproportion in different schools and at different levels of education was that new ideas will have to be forthcoming on where to get funds. In rural areas, farmers and other community individuals have been asked to help and have enjoyed being involved.

Chairperson Lawrence expressed her gratitude to those present who had expressed their ideas and offered insights and information for the others and turned the Committee's attention to SB 38--compulsory attendance age.

Senator Oleen distributed an amendment and stated that it would retain the compulsory age at 18 and include a Disclaimer for Being a High School Drop-Out. Senator Oleen moved the amendment with a second by Senator Emert.

Discussion on the merits of raising the age to 18 by several committee members ensued. It was stated that this Disclaimer would be filed with the appropriate entity.

The motion carried.

Senator Oleen moved to pass SB 38 favorably as amended with a second by Senator Emert. The motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned.
