Conferee Bybee testified on a proposed amendment to <u>SB 72</u> concerning an additional exclusion to the Kansas Open Record Act. (<u>Attachment 1</u>) Committee took no action on this proposed amendment.

Senator Harris discussed <u>SB 72</u> with committee. <u>Senator Emert made a motion recommending SB 72</u> favorable for passage, Senator Schraad seconded. <u>Senator Feleciano made a substitute motion to amend SB 72</u>, <u>Senator Gilstrap seconded.</u> Following discussion, Senator Emert proposed that Senator Feleciano's motion be stricken from the record. After further discussion and clarification, <u>Senator Feleciano withdrew his motion to amend, Senator Gilstrap withdrew his second.</u> Original motion by Senator Harris to pass <u>SB 72</u> out favorably, carried.

Proposed Amendment to SB72 Concerning an Additional Exclusion to the Kansas Open Records Act

A number of state programs, particularly those in which the state has a direct interest in the future viability of a business in connection with loan repayments and job creation or retention, require the state as part of its due diligence process to examine records that businesses and their owners consider to be of a confidential nature.

In an effort to encourage businesses to use the state programs established to aid in business growth, the state would like to be able to offer further assurance that sensitive materials provided by the business to satisfy our fiduciary duties will not be released to other, inappropriate parties through the Kansas Open Records Act.

Therefore, we ask that you consider amending Senate Bill 72 to include the following additional exclusion to Section 1 of the Kansas Open Records Act (KSA 1996 Supp. 45-221):

(45) Personal financial data; historical and projected business financial data; business marketing information and stategies; business proprietary information; business trade secrets; or other such information provided by individuals and businesses to state personnel in their official capacities, when the secretary of the Kansas department of commerce & housing determines that the release of such information could give an unfair advantage to competitors.
