Hearing on SB 50 - Continuation and duties of Joint Committee on Children and Families

SB 50 would extend the life of the Joint Committee on Children and Families by four years until July 1, 2001. Current law provides that the Committee would cease to exist on July 1, 1997. The bill also deletes several of the specific responsibilities assigned to the Committee by current law. It also provides that the Committee make recommendations to the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Ways and Means regarding funding of children's programs. The act also provides that the Committee report to the Legislature each year any findings and recommendations it has concerning children and families. After Committee discussion on the bill, Senator Becker made a motion the Committee recommend SB 50 favorably for passage, seconded by Senator Hardenburger. The motion carried.

Confirmation Hearing on Gary R. Mitchell, Secretary, Kansas Department of Health and Environment

The Chair introduced Gary R. Mitchell, Secretary, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, who outlined for the Committee his goals and qualifications as Secretary of KDHE. (Attachment 1) Secretary Mitchell noted that he is ready, willing and able to cooperate with the legislature and other agencies in order to fulfill his duties as Secretary. Committee discussion related to environmental issues, water quality issues, nursing home regulations, rules and regulations of the department, regulation vs. deregulation and issues involving the Environmental Protection Agency.

Written testimony was received from the Kansas Audubon Council expressing support in working with Secretary Mitchell. (Attachment 2)

Senator Hardenburger made a motion the Committee recommend Gary R. Mitchell favorably to the full Senate for confirmation, seconded by Senator Langworthy. The motion carried.

Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 9:45 a.m.

Thank you for the opportunity to offer testimony on the appointment of Gary R. Mitchell to the position of Secretary of KDHE. My name is Christopher Cokinos. I am a resident of Manhattan, Kansas, and the current president of the Kansas Audubon Council.

The mission of the National Audubon Society is "to conserve and restore natural ecosystems, focusing on birds, other wildlife, and their habitats, for the benefit of humanity and the earth's biological diversity." The KAC, as a state affiliate of the national organization, shares in this mission. Here in Kansas we have a variety of positive and a few negative aspects to our environmental situation.

On the positive side, we have a state with a lot of wide open spaces, beautiful views, overall good air quality, and a wonderful quality of life for most of our residents. A wide variety of plant and animal species dwell here and most of their populations are strong and healthy.

On a less positive note, there are some areas of significant concern regarding the Kansas environment. Chief among these concerns—and a major part of the KDHE mission—is water quality. Our water quality is now compromised by suspended solids, urban and agricultural chemicals, bacteria, and other human—generated contaminants. These contaminants are problematic for both human health and the health of our wildlife. In the long run, these contaminants also compromise our state's economic well—being.

KDHE is instrumental in protecting and advancing the health of the state through appropriate water testing, guidelines, and regulations that aid in monitoring and controlling contaminants. Many areas of KDHE oversight concern water quality: landfills, abandoned wells, toxic sites, household hazardous waste, mined lands, storm water run-off, municipal water treatment, hon-point

source pollution, public drinking water, and industrial pollution, to name just a few.

This partial list of KDHE's responsibilities, just on the environmental side of the agency, is key to both the agency's pivotal role in the state and to some anxiety about this appointment. Reading recent newspaper reports about Mr. Mitchell, we do have some concerns about the lack of science and health education in his background, concerns about his managerial experience in dealing with an organization the size and complexity of KDHE, and concerns about his reactions to stress. Mr. Mitchell must have a chance, of course, to address these matters in a public setting, and we look forward to his statements. But we feel compelled to raise these matters given that KDHE is an agency that is the focus of many strong feelings and viewpoints—and complex scientific issues.

We are certain that the Committee and the Senate will carefully examine these and many other issues, assuring the citizens of Kansas that such concerns are groundless, before confirming this appointment.

With these assurances from our state senators, Kansas Audubon will look forward to working with Mr. Mitchell, if he is confirmed. His experiences in Washington and his love for Kansas should be beneficial in helping set sound and fair policies regarding health and the environment. We are pleased that Mr. Mitchell has assured us that he will have an "open door" policy, encouraging input from all citizens, if the Senate confirms him. Such an attitude is vital in a democracy, especially given that so many people feel increasingly alienated from the very agencies that exist to protect people, their health, and the environment. We appreciate such openness and always welcome the opportunity to work with public officials who are committed to the well-being of all citizens.

Thank you for the opportunity to offer testimony today and thank you for your service to the public.
