MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Dave Kerr at 11:00 a.m. on MARCH 12, 1997 in Room 123-S of the Capitol.

Senator Salmans moved, Senator Lawrence seconded, that the minutes for February 27 and March 5 be approved. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Chairman Kerr informed Committee members of the updated EDIF handout which was for their review (Attachment 1).

University of Kansas Hospital Authority SB 373:

Senator Ranson distributed a balloon which addressed concerns regarding SB 373. Senator Ranson advised SB 373 changes the governance from KU Hospital and is a major step.

Senator Ranson recommended a mission statement for SB 373 which reads: "The needs of the citizens of the state of Kansas and of the university of Kansas medical center and its health sciences schools will be best served if the university of Kansas hospital is transferred to and operated by an independent public authority charged with the mission of operating a teaching hospital for the benefit of the university of Kansas medical center, providing high quality patient care and providing a site for medical and biomedical research".

Senator Ranson advised Section 4, subsection (b), (page 3), describes the makeup of the board and proposed the making of a 15 member board, 9 members would be representatives of the general public to include health care providers, and education or government. Of the nine members, there would be at least one member from each congressional district. Six members would be ex-officio members. Committee members reviewed the membership status of the board.

After a lengthy discussion among Committee members, Senator Ranson moved to amend the board so that 8 of the members would be representatives of the general public and three members would be ex-officio voting members, the Chancellor, the Executive Vice-Chancellor, and the Dean of the Medical School and there would be three ex-officio non-voting members, seconded by Senator Lawrence.

Senator Downey made a substitute motion to reinsert the clinical facility members to the voting member board and make the board a total of 13 members, seconded by Senator Gilstrap. Senator Downey clarified that the ex-officio voting members would include the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, Dean of the School of Medicine and the ex-officio non-voting members would include

Chief of Staff, President of Hospital Authority, and Dean of the School of Nursing. The substitute motion failed on a show of hands.

Chairman Kerr requested that Senator Ranson clarify the ex-officio members for the original motion. Senator Ranson advised the ex-officio non-voting members would be the Chief of Staff, the President of the Hospital Authority and the Dean of Nursing. Chairman Kerr called for a vote on the original motion. The motion passed on a show of hands.

Senator Ranson moved to delete Items 1-6 in Section 2, (page 1), and delete (a) in Section 2, (page 1), The motion was seconded and carried on a voice vote.

Senator Ranson moved, Senator Lawrence seconded, to delete Section 4 (e), (page 4), and change the rest of the lettering through the remainder of Section 4; and to change from five to seven in Section 4 (k). The motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Ranson moved to strike "not-for-profit" on line 31, (page 5), strike "state" on line 32 (page 5) and add the words "Kansas legislature", seconded by Senator Lawrence. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Ranson moved that the word "voting" be inserted between the words "total" and "membership" on line 18 (page 6), seconded by Senator Salisbury. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Ranson moved to clarify that any member of the board shall file a written statement of substantial interest, (page 7), seconded by Senator Salisbury. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Ranson moved that the authority shall submit a complete and detailed annual operating and financial statement and include any comprehensive information regarding all audit reports performed in the year, including any legislative post audit report (page 15), seconded by Senator Salisbury. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Ranson moved, Senator Lawrence seconded, to include the wording "may be" in line 31, (page 17). The motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Ranson moved that "care to the medically indigent" be taken out because of the possible ramifications of bonding issues, funding, etc.(page 9, line 25), After a brief discussion among Committee members, Senator Ranson withdrew the motion.

Victoria Thomas, Legal Counsel, University of Kansas Medical Center, appeared before Committee members with amendments to <u>SB 373</u> (<u>Attachment 2</u>).

Ms. Thomas asked that in Section 5 (b), amend (b) (1) and (b) (2) to provide that the records described in those subsections will be closed only when the disclosure of the information in the records would be harmful to the competitive position of the Authority. Senator Ranson moved, seconded by Senator Salisbury, to accept the amendment. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Ms. Thomas further asked that in Section 5 (b), amend (b) (1) and (b) (2) to provide that the items described in those subsections could be addressed in executive session when disclosure of the items would be harmful to the competitive position of the Authority. Senator Lawrence moved, seconded by Senator Jordan, to accept the amendment. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Ms. Thomas referred to Section 11 (c) and asked the Committee to amend the section to provide that all current university hospital employees shall transfer to the Hospital Authority and that the Authority and KUMC would jointly determine any other KUMC employees to be transferred. Senator Feleciano moved, seconded by Senator Salisbury, to accept the amendment. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Ms. Thomas asked that Section 11 (i) and (j) be amended to delete the authority of the Hospital Authority to establish a retirement plan for its employees and provide instead that the employees of the authority (either those currently employed by the university hospital or new employees of the authority) will participate in either the Kansas public employees retirement system, or the Kansas board of regents basic retirement plan, or any other sponsored plan providing retirement benefits to employees of KUMC. Further, provide that the Authority will be a participating employer for purposes of KPERS. Correct the reference to K.S.A. 74-4934 et seq. in connection with the

amendments otherwise necessary concerning retirement plans. Further, amend the provisions of K.S.A. 74-4910 (participating employers - KPERS), K.S.A. 74-4911 (eligible employees - KPERS), and K.S.A. 74-4925 (retirement annuities - employees of regents institutions). Senator Feleciano moved, seconded by Senator Petty, to accept the amendment. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Ms. Thomas asked that a new Section 16 be added to amend K.S.A. 75-6117 to provide that when a payment is made from the Kansas tort claims fund on behalf of the Authority, the Authority shall transfer to the tort claims fund an amount equal to the payment made by the tort claims fund on behalf of the authority. Senator Salisbury moved, seconded by Senator Lawrence, to accept the amendment. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Ms. Thomas asked for a new Section 17 to amend provisions of K.S.A. 76-745 (a) and (b) to delete references to collection services on for hospital revenue collection for KUMC. <u>Senator Ranson moved</u>, seconded by Senator Gilstrap, to accept the amendment. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Chairman Kerr advised Committee members that he had received a letter from Shirley Moses, Director of Accounts and Reports, Department of Administration, regarding the setoff fees which go to Accounts and Reports for write-offs and late payments. The letter stated the Division of Accounts and Reports expects to lose net funding of approximately \$120,000 in the first fiscal year and an additional \$96,000 in each of the next four fiscal years. This loss of funding is due to (1) the exclusion of the Authority from K.S.A.'s 75-3728a through 75-3728d which govern the write-off of uncollectible accounts receivable by state agencies; and (2) the possible loss of participation by the Authority in the Accounts Receivable Setoff Program. Two options existed to sustain the current level of funding and current service levels within the Division of Accounts and Reports: (1) replace the loss of funding with SGF monies; or (2) to amend SB 373 to include the Authority in the statutes which govern the write-off of accounts receivable and retain the ability of the Director of Accounts and Reports to require participation in the Setoff Program.

Ms. Thomas proposed a new Section 18 to provide that legislative authorization is required before leasing the hospital to another institution (in addition to what is currently provided in the section no sale or merger without legislative approval). Senator Lawrence moved, seconded by Senator Salisbury, to accept the amendment. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Chairman Kerr advised the Director of Architectural Services, Department of Administration has expressed concerns whether or not the Authority will be sufficiently subject to the Architectural Services review usually required for approval in capital projects to insure safety. Senator Petty made a conceptual motion, seconded by Senator Salmans, to make it clear that if it isn't made clear, that the Authority is subject to local code enforcement. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Ranson advised in Section 8, Subsection 15, (page 8), the Legislature is authorizing the power of eminent domain. After a brief discussion among Committee members, <u>Senator Feleciano moved</u>, <u>Senator Lawrence seconded</u>, to strike the eminent domain clause. The motion carried on a <u>voice vote</u>.

Senator Salisbury moved, Senator Ranson, seconded, that the bill be approved as amended. The motion carried on a roll call vote.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting at 1:30 p.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 13, 1997.

Amendments to Senate Bill 373

- 1. Section 5(b) amend (b)(1) and (b)(2) to provide that the records described in those subsections will be closed only when the disclosure of the information in the records would be harmful to the competitive position of the authority.
- 2. Section 6(b) amend (b)(1) and (b)(2) to provide that the items described in those subsections could be addressed in executive session when disclosure of the items would be harmful to the competitive position of the authority.
- 3. Section 11(c) amend the section to provide that all current university hospital employees shall transfer to the authority, and that the authority and KUMC will jointly determine any other KUMC employees to be transferred.
- 4. Section 11(i) and (j) amend these sections to delete the authority of the hospital authority to establish a retirement plan for its employees and provide instead that the employees of the authority (either those currently employed by the university hospital or new employees of the authority) will participate in either the Kansas public employees retirement system, or the Kansas board of regents basic retirement plan, or any other sponsored plan providing retirement benefits to employees of KUMC. Further, provide that the authority will be a participating employer for purposes of KPERS. Correct the reference to K.S.A. 74-4934 et seq. in connection with the amendments otherwise necessary concerning retirement plans. Further, amend the provisions of K.S.A. 74-4910 (participating employers KPERS), K.S.A. 74-4911 (eligible employees KPERS), and K.S.A. 74-4925 (retirement annuities employees of regents institutions).
- 5. New Section 16 Amend K.S.A. 75-6117 to provide that when a payment is made from the Kansas tort claims fund on behalf of the authority, the authority shall transfer to the tort claims fund an amount equal to the payment made by the tort claims fund on behalf of the authority.
