#### MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Joann Flower at 9:00 a.m. on March 17, 1998, in Room 423-S of the Capitol.

Chairperson Flower asked committee members to review the minutes of March 11. If there were corrections or additions, members were asked to contact the committee secretary before 5:00 p.m. or they will stand approved as presented.

# Discussion and final action on SB 505 - Repealing the sunset provisions of the Agriculture Products Development Division in the Department of Commerce and Housing

Chairperson Flower opened discussion on <u>SB 505</u>. Representative Thimesch offered an amendment to extend the sunset provisions of the Agriculture Products Development Division for another year, or until July 1, 1999. (Attachment 1) The motion was seconded by Representative Dahl.

Committee discussion ensued. Patty Clark, Director of the Agriculture Products Development Division, responded to committee questions concerning a comparison of the budget of the Agriculture Products Development Division in the Department of Commerce and Housing with the former Marketing Division in the Department of Agriculture. (Attachments 2 and 3) She expressed her concerns about the effect another sunset provision would have on projects with long term investments and potential problems in hiring qualified employees. She reminded the committee that she must report to three advisory boards, as well as to the House and Senate Agriculture Committees on an annual basis.

Bill Fuller, Associate Director, Public Affairs Division, Kansas Farm Bureau, reported that Kansas Farm Bureau policy supports continuation of the Agriculture Products Development Division and urges adequate funding of the Division.

Representative Faber offered a substitute motion to recommend **SB** 505 favorably for passage. Seconded by Representative Correll, the motion passed. Representatives Dahl, Neufeld, and Thimesch requested that their "no" votes be recorded.

#### Discussion and final action on SB 149 - Creating the Kansas agricultural seed commission

Representative Ballou moved to pull SB 149 off the table. Seconded by Representative Correll, the motion carried.

Chris Wilson, Director of Member Services, Kansas Seed Industry Association, suggested changes to <u>SB</u> <u>149</u> which was introduced at the request of the association. As concern had been expressed regarding the assessments in Sections 4 and 5 of the bill, she recommended removing those sections, thus making contributions to the commission voluntary. She said that establishment of a Kansas Seed Council is very important and would allow the industry to better respond to the many changes which are occurring with the seed industry.

As the penalty provision in Section 6 of SB 149 was stricken by the committee on March 20, 1997, Representative Faber moved to strike the assessment provisions in Sections 4 and 5 of the bill. The motion was seconded by Representative Freeborn. The motion carried.

Discussion ensued concerning the deposit and management of funds of the commission. Staff thought this could be handled under Section 3 (h) of the bill.

Representative Ballou moved to pass **SB** 149 favorably as amended. Seconded by Representative Neufeld, the motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 9:55 a.m. The next meeting is scheduled for March 18, 1998.
