#### MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Tim Emert at 10:12 a.m. on February 9, 1998 in Room 514-S of the Capitol.

The minutes of the February 5 meeting were approved on a motion by Senator Petty and a second by Senator Harrington. Motion carried.

The purpose of this meeting was to consider the following bills which were previously heard:

### SB 413 - An act amending the eminent domain procedure act SB 448 - Amendments to the eminent domain procedure act

The Chair recommended merging <u>SB 413</u> into <u>SB 448</u> due to the similarity in their subject matter. At the Chair's request, Senator Oleen explained the origin of <u>SB 413</u>. The Committee discussed language changes in the bill. There was general consensus to use the term "contiguous county" at line 18, pg. 1 of <u>SB 413</u>. Further discussion regarding language changes and subject matter in <u>SB 448</u> followed, with clarification on the rationale supporting the changes offered by guest, Attorney John Hamilton. <u>Senator Goodwin moved to pass SB 448</u> as amended, Senator Feleciano seconded. <u>Motion carried.</u>

### SB 474 - Corporations relating to filing of articles of incorporation and other instruments

Following the Chair's brief review of <u>SB 474</u> and discussion regarding an earlier suggestion to add "retroactive" language to the bill, <u>Senator Pugh moved to pass the bill out favorably, Senator Harrington seconded. Motion carried.</u>

## SB 482 - An act concerning expungement; relating to diversion agreements; arrest records; violations of city ordinance

The Chair stated he had received a written request by David Brant, Securities Commissioner, for an amendment to <u>SB 482</u>. Since the wording for the amendment has not yet been received, the Chair suggested Committee revisit the bill later.

#### SB 515 - An act concerning district attorneys; relating to salary.

Following a brief discussion on SB 515, it was the consensus of the Committee to take no action on the bill.

## SB 516 - An act concerning crimes, punishment and criminal procedure; relating to conservation camps

Following brief discussion on <u>SB 516</u>, <u>Senator Pugh moved to pass the bill out favorably, Senator Oleen seconded.</u> <u>Motion carried.</u>

## SB 536 - Civil commitment; enacting the care and treatment act for persons with an alcohol or substance abuse problem

Following brief discussion on <u>SB 536</u>, <u>Senator Pugh moved to pass the bill as amended, Senator Harrington seconded.</u>
