Action on <u>HB 2607</u> - State long-term care ombudsman, attached to the Department of Administration

Staff briefed the Committee on **HB 2607**, and it was recommended by staff that three technical amendments needed to be made in the bill. On page 1, line 19, clean up language and delete, "for purposes"; on page 8, line 13, add a comma after the word "education", and on page 8, line 15, after the word "care", add "ombudsman".

After Committee discussion relating to the bill in regard to staffing, funding, creating a new agency, and advocates for nursing homes and staff, <u>Senator Lee made a motion to amend HB 2607</u> with the technical amendments as recommended by staff, seconded by Senator Jones. The motion carried.

Senator Lee made a motion that the Committee recommend HB 2607 as amended favorably for passage, seconded by Senator Jones. The motion carried.

Action on HB 2723 - Use of automatic defibrillators by certain persons

Staff briefed the Committee on proposed amendments as shown in a balloon of HB 2723. (Attachment 1) After Committee discussion relating to the liability issue, qualifications of individuals, and authority of the state Board of Healing Arts to establish rules and regulations in regard to training persons to use the defibrillators, it was suggested that the balloon be amended by striking "automatic" on page 1 of the bill in the title and inserting "automated", defining "qualified person" as a person who (1) has completed a course "of training approved by the state board of healing arts based on rules and regulations adopted by the state board of healing arts", and any additional clean up of language or renumbering of subsections as suggested by staff.

Senator Becker made a motion that the amendments in the balloon of **HB 2723** be adopted with recommended changes, seconded by Senator Langworthy. The motion carried.

Senator Lee made a motion that the Committee recommend HB 2723 as amended favorably for passage, seconded by Senator Langworthy. The motion carried.

The Chair announced that the Committee will discuss and possibly take action on **Sub HB 2609 and HB 2609** at the next meeting.

Adjournment

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HOUSE BILL No. 2723

AN ACT relating to automatic external defibrillators; authorizing use by certain persons; requiring training and activation of the emergency medical services system upon use of a defibrillator; encouraging certain persons and entities to register a defibrillator; providing immunity from liability for certain persons.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. |(a) It is the intent of the legislature that an An automatic external defibrillator may be used by any person who has satisfied the requirements of subsection (b)(1) for the purpose of saving the life of another person in cardiac arrest.

(b) In order to ensure public health and safety:

(1) All persons who have access to or use an automatic external defibrillator must obtain appropriate training to include completion of a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or successful completion of a basic first aid course that includes cardiopulmonary resuscitation training and have demonstrated proficiency in the use of an automatic external defibrillator;

(2) any person or entity in possession of an automatic external defibrillator is encouraged to register with the local emergency medical services medical director the existence and location of the automatic external defibrillator, and

(3) any person who uses an automatic external defibrillator is required to activate the emergency medical services system as soon as possible upon use of the automatic external defibrillator.

(c) Anylperson, including a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery, who gratuitously and in good faith renders emergency care or treatment by the use of or provision of an automatic external defibrillator, without objection of the injured victim or victims thereof, shall not be held liable for any civil damages as a result of such care or treatment or as a result of any act or failure to act in providing or arranging further medical treatment where the person acts as an ordinary reasonably prudent person would have acted under the same or similar circumstances.

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(b) "Qualified person" means a person who: (1) has completed a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or a basic first aid course that includes cardiopulmonary resuscitation training, and: (2) has demonstrated proficiency in the use of an automatic external defibrillator. Communities (c) No person licensed to practice medicine and surgery by the state board of healing arts shall be liable for any damages occurring as a result of the use or failure to use an automatic external defibrillator by any person.
