MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Dave Kerr at 11:00 a.m. on March 24, 1998 in Room 123-S of the Capitol.

The meeting was called to order and Alan Conroy, Chief Fiscal Analyist, began by bringing the Committee up to date on what has been accomplished so far. He referred to the Comparison of Senate and House Appropriations Recommendations sheets. (<u>Attachments 1, 2 and 3</u>).

Mr. Conroy continued with a list of Senate Ways and Means Omnibus Items, (<u>Attachment 4</u>), and continued with an explaination of additional attachments (<u>Attachments 5, 6, 7 and 8</u>).

Mark Burenheide, of the Legislative Research Department, explained the amounts remaining in the Economic Development Initiatives Fund for Fiscal Years 1998 and 1999. (Attachment 9).

Reed Holwegner, of the Legislative Research Department, spoke next in regard to the State Water Plan Fund for Fiscal Years 1998 and 1999. (Attachment 10).

Paul West, of the Legislative Research Department, spoke to the Committee in regard to the Status of the State Budget Stabilization Fund. (Attachment 11).

Senator Kerr read from a list of additional items for consideration in SB 642. (Attachment 12).

It was moved by Senator Morris and seconded by Senator Jordan to amend the Subcommittee action for Fiscal Year 1998 into SB 643. The motion carried on a voice vote.

It was moved by Senator Morris and seconded by Senator Jordan to amend the Subcommittee action for Fiscal Year 1999 into SB 642. The motion carried on a voice vote.

It was moved by Senator Petty and seconded by Senator Salisbury to put the Governor's pay plan funding back in the individual agency budgets. The motion was adopted by a voice vote.

It was moved by Senator Morris and seconded by Senator Ranson to shift \$40,000 in expenditures from the State Water Plan Fund to the State Budget Stabilization Fund. The motion was adopted by a voice vote.

Senator Kerr explained to the Committee that **HB 2632** abolishes a Federal Grants Contracts Clearing fund that hasn't been used since 1989. The Governor has proposed that \$200,000 of the fund be moved into the State General Fund, \$300,000 into the Educational Building Fund and \$100,000 into the State Institutional Building Fund.

Senator Salisbury moved and Senator Lawrence seconded to incorporate the provisions of HB 2632 into SB 642. The motion carried by a voice vote.

The Governor's recommendations for K-12 enhancements are \$35 base aid per pupil, plus correlation and at-risk enhancements.

It was moved by Senator Lawrence and seconded by Senator Salisbury to put the Governor's recommendation of \$35.8 million for K-12 enhancements back into SB 642. The motion carried by a voice vote.

It was moved by Senator Lawrence and seconded by Senator Ranson that the additional funding of \$8 million for state school aid in HB 2249 as amended by the Senate Committee of the Whole be adopted into SB 642. The motion carried by a voice vote.

Senator Lawrence moved and Senator Ranson seconded that the \$975,000 for the HOSTS Program be amended into SB 642. The motion was adopted by a voice vote.

It was moved by Senator Feleciano and seconded by Senator Lawrence that SB 642 be amended to show that overages in the State Education Budget, before going back to State General Funds, go first to fulfill the fifty percent statutory in-service state aid entitlement. The motion carried by a voice vote.

Senator Jordan told the Committee that the Subcommittee on Appropriations for Fee Agencies had been advised that an additional \$30,000 was being requested by the Dental Board for legal fees, on top of the \$30,000 that was recommended by the Senate Subcommittee.

It was moved by Senator Jordan and seconded by Senator Ranson that this item be flagged for Omnibus. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Morris moved and Senator Salmans seconded that the limit of \$2,000 on the State Fair budget be transferred to their fee fund instead of their operating budget.. The motion to amend is adopted on a voice vote.

Senator Kerr told the Committee that he would like to request an SRS internal audit on the subject of hiring Kansas Legal Services to do the legal work to get people onto federal disability. The SRS uses this organization because they get additional services from them that are not compensated.

Senator Ranson moved and Senator Lawrence seconded to direct the SRS to do an internal audit on this contract and all of the services they are receiving from this statewide and consumer run organization's program. The motion was adopted by a voice vote.

Senator Morris moved and Senator Ranson seconded that an adjustment (the recapture of funds not spent by the Conservation Commission) be made in the Water Plan Funding, meaning an additional \$1.1 million in the beginning balance. The motion carried on a voice vote.

It was moved by Senator Morris and seconded by Senator Jordan to provide the authority to the Legislative Staff to make technical adjustments that are necessary to carry out the Committee's intent on SB 642 and SB 643. The motion carried on a voice vote.

It was moved by Senator Lawrence and seconded by Senator Ranson that SB 643 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried on roll call vote.

It was moved by Senator Ranson and seconded by Senator Lawrence that SB 642 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried on a roll call vote.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:30 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for March 25, 1998.


