HB 2612 Concerning audits; relating to audits of the KPERS.

Barb Hinton, Legislative Post Auditor appeared before the Committee to comment on **HB 2612** as amended by the House Committee of the Whole. (Attachment 1).

Senator Downey moved and Senator Morris seconded that HB 2612 be passed as amended. The motion carried on a roll call vote.

HB 2895 Amending Senate's Omnibus position into House Bill.

Senator Kerr advised the Committee that to be fair, he must remind them that a request for appropriations at the Block Grant Hearing on April 23 by the SIDS Network was overlooked. He pointed out that he was not recommending this but just noting it to the Committee.

It was moved by Senator Feleciano and seconded by Senator Downey that the requested amount of \$80,600 be made available from SGF for the SIDS Network.

A substitute motion was made by Senator Lawrence and seconded by Senator Morris that the Department of Health and Environment allocate the \$80,600 with funds from the \$5 million pool in the Maternal and Child Block Grant money for the purpose of funding the SIDS Network for one year.

The motion carried on a roll call vote.

Alan Conroy, Chief Fiscal Analyst, spoke to the Committee in regard to the comparison of Senate Committee Recommendations to the Governor's Amended Recommendations.(<u>Attachments</u> 2.)

Mr. Conroy also explained the 1998 Omnibus Appropriations Bill. (<u>Attachment 3</u>) and concluded his explanations with a comparison of House Committee Recommendations to the Governor's Amended Recommendations for FY 1998 and FY 1999. (<u>Attachment 4</u>).

It was moved by Senator Salmans and seconded by Senator Salisbury to amend the Senate's position on Omnibus into HB 2895 and make it a substitute bill.

The motion carried on a roll call vote.

TESTIMONY BEFORE THE SENATE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE HOUSE BILL 2612

Barb Hinton, Legislative Post Auditor April 29, 1998 Room 123-S

Mister Chairman and Members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to comment on House Bill 2612 as amended by the House Committee of the Whole. Those amendments deal primarily with audit requirements for the State Treasurer's Office and the Pooled Money Investment Board.

Our office got involved with this part of the bill when the current State Treasurer approached us about finding a cost-effective way of providing <u>both</u> agencies with the audited information they need, and of solving a problem noted in the most recent audit of the Treasurer's Office. That problem was that the financial statements included in the audit of the Treasurer's Office, which the Treasurer's Office is held responsible for, are based in large part on accounting records maintained by staff of the PMIB—a separate operation.

The amendments to House Bill 2612 would address that problem, and in my opinion would result in several other improvements, as well:

- Separate reports would be issued for the Treasurer's Office and the PMIB, with each report addressing only the financial-management responsibilities of the applicable agency. (For the Treasurer's Office, that would include the custodial responsibilities for and controls over moneys in the Treasury, the Office's receipt and disbursement of moneys, and its handling of unclaimed property. For the PMIB, that would include the Board's investment of moneys in the State Treasury—including information on average maturities and rates of return—its controls over the investment of moneys from the State Treasury, and the Municipal Investment Pool.) This would eliminate the problem noted in the recent audit, and allow the two ofices to meet their own fiduciary reporting responsibilities.
- Much of the audit work needed to issue those separate audit reports <u>already is being done</u> as part of the annual Statewide financial-compliance audit. (Only a few things, like the handling of unclaimed property, currently aren't being reviewed). Thus, any additional costs involved in issuing those reports aren't likely to be high. In fact, the TOTAL amount spent on the Statewide audit and on issuing these two reports in the future may be less than what's spent now for the Statewide audit and the separate audit of the Treasurer's Office.
- Our office would be responsible for obtaining and distributing the separate reports for
 these two agencies, just as we are for all other financial-compliance audits required
 by State law (i.e., KPERS and the Lottery). Current State law makes the Treasurer's
 Office responsible for distributing the report related to that Office, which has led to
 some confusion in the past.

H.B. 2895, as originally approved by the House, contained FY 1998 supplemental appropriations for a number of state agencies as recommended by the Governor and as adjusted by the House. Supplemental appropriations approved by the 1998 Legislature were subsequently amended into 1998 S.B. 495.

FY 1998 (Current Year). The Omnibus Appropriations bill reduces FY 1998 State General Fund operating expenditures by \$1,155,781 and reduces operating expenditures from all funding sources in FY 1998 by \$40,216,720. Capital improvement expenditures recommended from the State General Fund in the current year increase by \$1,080,000, and recommended capital improvement expenditures from all funding sources increase by \$11,661,770.

FY 1999. The Omnibus Appropriations bill increases FY 1999 State General Fund operating expenditures by \$21,602,608 and reduces operating expenditures from all funding sources in FY 1999 by \$14,416,541. Capital improvement expenditures recommended from the State General Fund in FY 1999 increase by \$180,000, and recommended capital improvement expenditures from all funding sources increase by \$3,519,217.

FY 1998 and FY 1999. The net change in expenditures from the State General Fund for both \underline{FY} 1998 and \underline{FY} 1999 is an increase of \$21,706,827 while the net change in expenditures from all funding sources for both \underline{FY} 1998 and \underline{FY} 1999 is a reduction of \$39,452,274.
