The joint House and senate Education Committees, chaired by Representative Ralph Tanner and Senator Barbara Lawrence, met for a presentation by the Jason Foundation.

Chairman Tanner welcomed all committee members and the audience to the meeting. Chairman Tanner called on Representative Jim Morrison, to introduce our presenter. Following his brief remarks Representative Morrison introduced Terry Smith, Consultant for the Jason Project.

Terry Smith, gave background information on the Jason Foundation. The Jason Foundation for education is a not for profit educational foundation that was created in 1988 by Dr. Robert Ballard, a noted oceanographer. When Dr. Ballard returned from this tour after discovering the Titanic and started answering all his mail, most of the questions were asked by students was "How can I grow up like you?". Dr. Ballard felt obligated to answer the mail and discovered that he would answer the letters by developing a program that would enable him to take students on his future scientific expeditions .

Because of Dr. Ballard and who he is, he was able to gain the interest of CEO's and chairman of the boards to participate from a variety of major national corporation of non profit and government agencys. There was a seven minute video of an overview of the Jason foundation and the mission statement: The mission of the JASON Foundation for Education is to excite and engage students in science and technology, and to motivate and provide professional development for their teachers through the use of advanced telecommunications.

The committee participated in a leaf litter activity to give them an idea of what types of science excerices the students would participate in. The program focuses on grades 4 - 9 and offers a web site with chats with scientists, and is used as a backup tool for the teacher. The meeting was opened for questions and discussion.

The Chairman thanked Terry Smith for the presentation.

The Chairman welcomed Dale Dennis, State Board of Education, he asked the teachers of the Milken Foundations to introduce themselves and give a brief comment.

Keith Hall - 1997 Milken National Educator USD #271, Stockton. He felt that technology can connect with children, and especially felt those children that have troubles.

Rex Babcock, 1993 Milken National Educator USD #413, Chanute. He felt that technology is important in the classroom, and realizes that technology can't do everything, but it can make a big improvement.

Linda Herbel, 1996 Milken National Educator, USD #497, Lawrence. She said that technology was leading the way, and that she hoped it would be an equable systematic plan.

Janet Jump, 1998 Milken National Educator, USD #259, Wichita. She stated that her school is at a 52% poverty level, and that technology has made a big difference in the students and parents.

Dana Sprinkle, USD #307, Ell-Saline. She said that they only have three computers and the students only get 45 minutes a week, funding for technology is a must to develop skills.

Janet Hards, 1998 Milken National Educator, USD #437, Auburn-Washburn. She said that students won't be
