Lynne Holt, Legislative Research Department, briefed the Committee on the Report of the Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF) Working Committee. (A copy on file in the office of the Legislative Research Department) The Committee included 22 members: representatives from various segments of the telecommunications industry; an Internet service provider; a representative from the Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board; a Kansas university faculty member with expertise in telecommunication technology; a representative of: elementary and secondary schools, a public library, a large business and a small business; and eight legislators (four House members, two from each party; four Senate members, two from each party).

The Committee was charged by the 1998 Legislature to discuss, identify, and develop recommendations regarding technology issues, KUSF funding regulatory procedures, modifications to enhanced universal service, including, but not limited to: (1) definition of enhanced universal service; (2) how and when enhanced universal service should be deployed; (3) the most appropriate mechanism for recovering capital costs; and (4) how to address Internet access in light of changing technology.

Ms. Holt reviewed the Report. The Committee recommendations are as follows:

- I. Definition of Enhanced Universal Service:
 - 1) Make two amendments to Public Policy statement of Kansas Act to: (a) ensure that conditions exist for consumers to benefit, and (b) strike at <u>reduced rates</u>;
 - 2) Introduce legislation to delete ISDN from definition of Enhanced Universal Service; and
 - 3) Request the KCC to expedite its review of the definitions of Basic Universal Service and Enhanced Universal Service.
- II. How and when Enhanced universal service should be deployed:
 - 1) Legislature should review deployment deadline based on: (a) the KCC's review of definition; and (b) any decisions from FCC Section 706 proceeding.
- III. The most appropriate mechanism for recovering capital costs:
 - 1) Legislature should: (a) create a framework to move away from the principle of revenue neutrality to a cost-based universal service funding mechanism; and (b) consider other revenue sources for funding universal service.
- IV. How to address Internet access in light of changing technology:

 No recommendations due to rapidly changing technology.

Senator Brownlee moved, seconded by Senator Feleciano, that 9rs0413 relating to telecommunications public policy be introduced as a Committee bill, and 9rs0056, amending the definition of enhanced universal service, be introduced as a Committee bill. The voice vote was in favor of the motion.
