The Joint House and Senate Education Committees, chaired by Representative Ralph Tanner and Senator Barbara Lawrence, met in the Old Supreme Court Chamber to honor the Kansas Teacher of the Year and Finalists.

House Chairman Tanner welcomed all committee members and teachers to the meeting. He called on Dale Dennis, Deputy Education Commissioner, who made a few brief opening remarks and told how the selection process takes place. He introduced the Kansas Teacher of the Year, Carol Strickland.

Ms. Strickland stated that one of the teacher finalists, Mr. F. Gene Hampton, USD 512, could not be present because of a medical emergency in the family. She told of the process and events that took place that led up this point in time and asked each of the six finalists present to introduce themselves and make a few brief comments. Each finalists gave a short background and history, as well as the strategy involved that makes her classroom a success.

Chairperson Lawrence expressed her concerns about the teacher in the classroom and how those teachers that go from college to the classroom are prepared.

Several responses were shared by the finalists as they spoke of the standards today and how teachers apply approaches that work in a diversified and multi-cultural society. They spoke of strategic delivery techniques and mentorship to help those who are starting out in the real world situation who need support and guidance.

One of the joint committee members asked what the teachers needed most and how the legislators could help to address education needs. The response was that two of the most apparent needs are technology and staff development.

Discussion of the part the media plays in education was discussed; something good about education might be buried in the back pages of the newspaper, whereas a certain teacher situation might make front page headlines. Also how the disparity in schools and test scores is given a 'spin' by the media.

One of the joint committee questioned Andy Tompkins, Education Commissioner about the Jason Project. The member stated that to learn more about this important education project, it can be found on the World Wide Web at WWW.JASON.COM.

Chairperson Lawrence stated her concern for the gifted students and the motivation factor. The response was that the accountability factor has to be put back on the student.

Several further comments were made, touching on teacher shortages, test scores, school comparisons and mobile versus stationary population.

Chairman Tanner asked Mr. Dennis if he had any further comments.

Mr. Dennis responded by stating that it had been an honor to have been present today with these educators and that he appreciated the joint committee sharing this time with them.

Chairman Tanner thanked all present and adjourned the meeting.
