Chairman Hardenburger advised the Committee that Senator Bond had asked that an amendment to **SB-68** be considered to allow legislators and the governor to solicit funds between January 1 and sine die to offset the expense of holding meetings sponsored by national, non-profit, non-partisan organizations whose purpose is educating and strengthening state legislatures and executive branches. The Committee discussed whether it would be a national non-profit organization related to legislative type meetings.

Senator Becker moved that the amendment to SB-68 be approved favorably, seconded by Senator Praeger. Motion carried..

Senator Praeger moved that SB-68 be moved out favorably as amended, seconded by Senator Becker. Motion carried.

Chairman Hardenburger opened continued discussion on SB-62 concerning authorizing closed or executive sessions to discuss security measures of building or facilities.

The Committee discussed if utility functions are to be included in this bill.

Staff informed the Committee that it would be better to have the language parallel in the Open Meeting Act with language in the Open Records Act.

The Committee also questioned the wording of the language and the grammatical wording of the amendment to the bill status.

The Committee discussed what information could be discussed in a closed meeting which would have to be voted on in an open meeting.

Senator Vidricksen moved that SB-62 be moved our favorably as written, seconded by Senator Gooch. Motion carried.

SENATE BILL No. 68

9 AN ACT concerning state governmental ethics; amending K.S.A. 1998
10 Supp. 46-236 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 46-236 is hereby amended to read as follows: 46-236. No state officer or employee, candidate for state office or state officer elect shall solicit any economic opportunity, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, favor, hospitality, or service from any person known to have a special interest, under circumstances where such officer, employee, candidate or state officer elect knows or should know that a major purpose of the donor in granting the same could be to influence the performance of the official duties or prospective official duties of such officer, employee, candidate or state officer elect.

Except when a particular course of official action is to be followed as a condition thereon, this section shall not apply to: (1) Any contribution reported in compliance with the campaign finance act; (2) a commercially reasonable loan or other commercial transaction in the ordinary course of business; [67](3) any solicitation for the benefit of any charitable organization which is required to file a registration statement with the secretary of state pursuant to K.S.A. 17-1740 17-1761, and amendments thereto, or which is exempted from filing such statement pursuant to K.S.A. 17-1741 17-1762, and amendments thereto, or for the benefit of any educational institution or such institution's endowment association, if such association has qualified as a nonprofit organization under paragraph (3) of subsection (c) of section 501 of the internal revenue code of 1986, as amended.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 46-236 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
