Chairman Oleen called the committee's attention to paperwork that was handed out at the previous meeting on two individuals, Robert H. Miller (Attachment 1) and Keith A. Palmer, (Attachment 2) presently serving on the Racing and Gaming Commission, who are up for reappointment for four year terms and need to be confirmed by the Senate. Chairman Oleen noted that both of these individuals had appeared before this committee on their initial confirmation process. She ask the committee members if they wanted to recommend to the Senate that they be confirmed without appearing in a second time. Senator Becker moved to recommend the confirmation of Robert H. Miller and Keith A. Palmer for reappointment to the Racing and Gaming Commission to the full Senate without hearing. Senator Vratil seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Chairman Oleen asked the committee to review bills that had been heard in the committee but no action had been taken.

A subcommittee has met on <u>SB 16-liquor recodification</u> and the interested parties are working together with the intent to bring something back next session for the committee's consideration next session.

Chairman Oleen asked the committee to look at <u>SB 26</u>, <u>State Library</u>. The committee held a hearing on this bill and because of a concern that was brought to the committee attention about administrating grants being made by the legislature to local libraries. <u>Senator Vratil moved to report SB 26 unfavorably</u>. <u>Senator Harrington seconded the motion</u>. <u>The motion passed</u>. <u>Senator Jones and Senator Gooch requested that the record show they voted no on this motion</u>.

Chairman Oleen stated that <u>SB 197 keg registration</u> had received a hearing by the committee and in that hearing it was noted that the ability to administer key registration programs could be done on the local level. Chairman Oleen recommended that a letter to the appropriate local groups be sent from the committee to reiterate that it is a local decision rather than to approach it as a state mandate. <u>Senator Jones moved that the bill be reported unfavorably and that the committee issue a letter to local entities concerning keg registrations.</u> <u>Senator Vratil seconded the motion</u>. <u>After discussion by the committee the motion passed.</u>

<u>SB 322- medical paroles</u> received a hearing and Chairman Oleen noted that Senator Gooch has been working with Mr. Madden the legal counsel for the Department of Corrections on corrected language for the bill. Senator Harrington noted that victim notification needed to be added also and that clarification of non-violent offenders be included in the language. Chairman Oleen stated that the bill would remain in the committee to allow Senator Gooch to report back on the progress being made.

Chairman Oleen stated that she had talked with all parties involved regarding <u>SB 337</u>, both proponents and opponents, and had ask them to get together. Representatives of the Attorney Generals Office, the industry and ABC have presented to the committee a Senate Concurrent Resolution to establish this training on a voluntary basis. <u>Senator Biggs requested the introduction of a Senate Concurrent Resolution concerning server permits</u>. <u>Senator Becker seconded the motion</u>. <u>The motion carried</u>. <u>Senator Harrington moved to report the Senate Concurrent Resolution directly to the Senate Floor</u>. <u>Senator Gooch seconded the motion</u>. <u>The motion carried</u>.

noney ses or nound ations , and, astate zation of waol for other d reg(z) "Parimutuel wagering" means a form of wagering on the outcome of horse and greyhound races in which those who wager purchase tickets of various denominations on one or more horses or greyhounds and all wagers for each race are pooled and the winning ticket holders are paid prizes from such pool in amounts proportional to the total receipts in the pool.

(aa) "Race meeting" means the entire period of time for which an organization licensee has been approved by the commission to hold live or simulcast horse or greyhound races at which parimutuel wagering is conducted, including such additional time as designated by the commission for the conduct of official business before and after the races.

(bb) "Racetrack facility" means a racetrack within Kansas used for the racing of horses or greyhounds, or both, including the track surface, grandstands, clubhouse, all animal housing and handling areas, other areas in which a person may enter only upon payment of an admission fee or upon presentation of authorized credentials and such additional areas as designated by the commission.

(cc) "Racing jurisdiction" or "jurisdiction" means a governmental authority which is responsible for the regulation of live or simulcast racing

in its jurisdiction.

(dd) "Racing or wagering equipment or services licensee" means any person, partnership, corporation or association licensed by the commission to provide integral racing or wagering equipment or services, as designated by the commission, to an organization licensee.

(ee) "Recognized greyhound owners' group" means the duly recognized group elected in accordance with rules and regulations of the commission by a majority of the Kansas licensed greyhound owners at the racetrack facility voting in the election. The commission may designate an organization such as the national greyhound association of Abilene, Kansas, to conduct the election.

(ff) "Recognized horsemen's group" means the duly recognized group, representing the breeds of horses running at a racetrack facility, elected in accordance with rules and regulations of the commission by a majority of the licensed owners and trainers at the racetrack facility voting in the election. If the licensee does not have a recognized horsemen's group, the commission shall designate as the recognized horsemen's

group one that serves another organization licensee, but not one that serves a fair association organization licensee.

(gg) "Simulcast" means a live audio-visual broadcast of an actual horse or greyhound race at the time it is run.

(hh) "Takeout" means the total amount of money withheld from each parimutuel pool for the payment of purses, taxes and the share to be kept by the organization licensee. Takeout does not include the breakage. The balance of each pool less the breakage is distributed to the holders of winning parimutuel tickets.

74-8803. Kansas racing and gaming commission. (a) There is hereby created the Kansas racing and gaming commission, consisting of five members who shall be appointed by the governor, subject to confirmation by the senate as provided by K.S.A. 75-4315b and amendments thereto. Except as provided by K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 46-2601 and amendments thereto, no person appointed to the commission shall exercise any power, duty or function as a member of the commission until confirmed by the senate.

(b) Before appointing any person as a member of the commission, the governor shall cause the Kansas bureau of investigation to conduct a criminal history record check and background investigation of the person.

(c) The members of the commission shall

meet the following qualifications:

(1) Each member shall be a citizen of the United States and an actual resident of Kansas at the time of appointment and during such member's term of office with the commission;

- (2) each member shall have been a resident of Kansas for a continuous period of not less than five years immediately preceding appointment to the commission; and
- (3) no member shall have been convicted of a felony under the laws of any state or of the United States at any time prior to appointment or during such member's term of office with the commission.

- (d) The governor shall make appointments to the commission in such a manner that:
- (1) Not more than three members belong to the same political party at the time of appointment and during their terms of office with the commission; and
- (2) subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 75-4315c and amendments thereto each congressional district has at least one member residing in such district at the time of appointment.
- (e) Except as provided by subsection (f), each member appointed before July 1, 1995, shall be appointed for a term of three years and until a successor is appointed and confirmed. Each member appointed on or after July 1, 1995, shall be appointed for a term of four years and until a successor is appointed and confirmed.
- (f) The terms of members who are serving on the commission on the effective date of this act shall expire on January 15, of the year in which such member's term would have expired under the provisions of this section prior to amendment by this act. Thereafter, members shall be appointed for terms of four years and until their successors are appointed and confirmed.
- (g) A vacancy on the commission shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment by the governor.
- (h) The commission shall meet at such times and places within this state as the chairperson or a majority of the commission members determines. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of commission business.
- (i) The governor shall designate a member of the commission as chairperson of the commission, to serve in that capacity at the pleasure of the governor. The members of the commission annually shall elect a vice-chairperson and secretary from the membership of the commission.
- (j) Members of the commission shall receive such compensation as determined by the governor, subject to the limitations of appropriations therefor, and, when attending meetings of the commission, or a subcommittee meeting thereof approved by the commission, shall be paid subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223 and amendments thereto.

(b) On and after the effective date of this act, whenever the Kansas racing commission, or words of like effect, is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other document, created before the effective date of this act, such reference or designation shall mean and apply to the Kansas racing and gaming commission.

(c) Nothing in this act shall be construed as abolishing or reestablishing the Kansas racing commission.

74-8804. Powers and duties of commission. (a) During race meetings, the commission and its designated employees may observe and inspect all racetrack facilities operated by licensees and all racetracks simulcasting races to racetrack facilities in Kansas, including but not limited to all machines, equipment and facilities used for parimutuel wagering.

(b) Commission members and hearing officers designated by the commission may administer oaths and take depositions to the same extent and subject to the same limitations as would apply if the deposition was in aid of a civil action in the district court.

- (c) The commission may examine, or cause to be examined by any agent or representative designated by the commission, any books, papers, records or memoranda of any licensee, or of any racetrack or business involved in simulcasting races to racetrack facilities in Kansas, for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with any provision of this act or any rule and regulation adopted hereunder.
- (d) The commission may issue subpoenas to compel access to or for the production of any books, papers, records or memoranda in the custody or control of any licensee or officer, member, employee or agent of any licensee, or to compel the appearance of any licensee or officer, member, employee or agent of any licensee, or of any racetrack or business involved in simulcasting races to racetrack facilities in this state, for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with any of the provisions of this act or any rule and regulation adopted hereunder. Subpoenas issued pursuant to this subsection may be served upon individuals and corporations in the same manner provided in

noney ses or nound ations , and, rastate zation of walol for other ad reg(z) "Parimutuel wagering" means a form of wagering on the outcome of horse and greyhound races in which those who wager purchase tickets of various denominations on one or more horses or greyhounds and all wagers for each race are pooled and the winning ticket holders are paid prizes from such pool in amounts proportional to the total receipts in the pool.

(aa) "Race meeting" means the entire period of time for which an organization licensee has been approved by the commission to hold live or simulcast horse or greyhound races at which parimutuel wagering is conducted, including such additional time as designated by the commission for the conduct of official business before and after the races.

(bb) "Racetrack facility" means a racetrack within Kansas used for the racing of horses or greyhounds, or both, including the track surface, grandstands, clubhouse, all animal housing and handling areas, other areas in which a person may enter only upon payment of an admission fee or upon presentation of authorized credentials and such additional areas as designated by the commission

(cc) "Racing jurisdiction" or "jurisdiction" means a governmental authority which is responsible for the regulation of live or simulcast racing in its jurisdiction.

(dd) "Racing or wagering equipment or services licensee" means any person, partnership, corporation or association licensed by the commission to provide integral racing or wagering equipment or services, as designated by the commission, to an organization licensee.

(ee) "Recognized greyhound owners' group" means the duly recognized group elected in accordance with rules and regulations of the commission by a majority of the Kansas licensed greyhound owners at the racetrack facility voting in the election. The commission may designate an organization such as the national greyhound association of Abilene, Kansas, to conduct the election

(ff) "Recognized horsemen's group" means the duly recognized group, representing the breeds of horses running at a racetrack facility, elected in accordance with rules and regulations of the commission by a majority of the licensed owners and trainers at the racetrack facility voting in the election. If the licensee does not have a recognized horsemen's group, the commission shall designate as the recognized horsemen's

group one that serves another organization licensee, but not one that serves a fair association organization licensee.

(gg) "Simulcast" means a live audio-visual broadcast of an actual horse or greyhound race at the time it is run.

(hh) "Takeout" means the total amount of money withheld from each parimutuel pool for the payment of purses, taxes and the share to be kept by the organization licensee. Takeout does not include the breakage. The balance of each pool less the breakage is distributed to the holders of winning parimutuel tickets.

74-8803. Kansas racing and gaming commission. (a) There is hereby created the Kansas racing and gaming commission, consisting of five members who shall be appointed by the governor, subject to confirmation by the senate as provided by K.S.A. 75-4315b and amendments thereto. Except as provided by K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 46-2601 and amendments thereto, no person appointed to the commission shall exercise any power, duty or function as a member of the commission until confirmed by the senate.

(b) Before appointing any person as a member of the commission, the governor shall cause the Kansas bureau of investigation to conduct a criminal history record check and background investigation of the person.

(c) The members of the commission shall meet the following qualifications:

(1) Each member shall be a citizen of the United States and an actual resident of Kansas at the time of appointment and during such member's term of office with the commission;

(2) each member shall have been a resident of Kansas for a continuous period of not less than five years immediately preceding appointment to the commission; and

(3) no member shall have been convicted of a felony under the laws of any state or of the United States at any time prior to appointment or during such member's term of office with the commission.

- (d): The governor shall make appointments to the commission in such a manner that:
- (1) Not more than three members belong to the same political party at the time of appointment and during their terms of office with the commission; and
- (2) subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 75-4315c and amendments thereto each congressional district has at least one member residing in such district at the time of appointment.
- (e) Except as provided by subsection (f), each member appointed before July 1, 1995, shall be appointed for a term of three years and until a successor is appointed and confirmed. Each member appointed on or after July 1, 1995, shall be appointed for a term of four years and until a successor is appointed and confirmed.
- (f) The terms of members who are serving on the commission on the effective date of this act shall expire on January 15, of the year in which such member's term would have expired under the provisions of this section prior to amendment by this act. Thereafter, members shall be appointed for terms of four years and until their successors are appointed and confirmed.
- (g) A vacancy on the commission shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment by the governor.
- (h) The commission shall meet at such times and places within this state as the chairperson or a majority of the commission members determines. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of commission business.
- (i) The governor shall designate a member of the commission as chairperson of the commission, to serve in that capacity at the pleasure of the governor. The members of the commission annually shall elect a vice-chairperson and secretary from the membership of the commission.
- (j) Members of the commission shall receive such compensation as determined by the governor, subject to the limitations of appropriations therefor, and, when attending meetings of the commission, or a subcommittee meeting thereof approved by the commission, shall be paid subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223 and amendments thereto.

(b) On and after the effective date of this act, whenever the Kansas racing commission, or words of like effect, is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other document, created before the effective date of this act, such reference or designation shall mean and apply to the Kansas racing and gaming commission.

(c) Nothing in this act shall be construed as abolishing or reestablishing the Kansas racing commission.

74-8804. Powers and duties of commission. (a) During race meetings, the commission and its designated employees may observe and inspect all racetrack facilities operated by licensees and all racetracks simulcasting races to racetrack facilities in Kansas, including but not limited to all machines, equipment and facilities used for parimutuel wagering.

- (b) Commission members and hearing officers designated by the commission may administer oaths and take depositions to the same extent and subject to the same limitations as would apply if the deposition was in aid of a civil action in the district court.
- (c) The commission may examine, or cause to be examined by any agent or representative designated by the commission, any books, papers, records or memoranda of any licensee, or of any racetrack or business involved in simulcasting races to racetrack facilities in Kansas, for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with any provision of this act or any rule and regulation adopted hereunder.
- (d) The commission may issue subpoenas to compel access to or for the production of any books, papers, records or memoranda in the custody or control of any licensee or officer, member, employee or agent of any licensee, or to compel the appearance of any licensee or officer, member, employee or agent of any licensee, or of any racetrack or business involved in simulcasting races to racetrack facilities in this state, for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with any of the provisions of this act or any rule and regulation adopted hereunder. Subpoenas issued pursuant to this subsection may be served upon individuals and corporations in the same manner provided in
