MINUTES OF THE HOUSE BUSINESS, COMMERCE AND LABOR COMMITTEE.

Introduction of Bills:

No one was present to introduce a bill.

Presentation by Karla Pierce, Secretary, Department of Revenue on Electronic Filing of Sales Tax

Chairman Lane introduced Secretary Karla Pierce, Department of Revenue. She gave the committee an overview of all the different types of electronic tax filings available through the department. In January the Center for Digital Government recognized Kansas as Number 1, with a perfect score of 100, in E-Taxation. The state offers a variety of options for taxpayers to use to get services by electronic means. The changes came about after five years of development. They went across the state asking what Kansas citizens wanted from the Department of Revenue. They wanted simple forms and plain language. (See Attachment 1)

They used this information to build a number of applications that are electronic forms, although there will still be paper forms available. Different methods of filing are available by telephone, over the Internet with a PC, or using types of software that can be bought off the shelf. They feel they have gone a long way to satisfy the taxpayer who wants simple forms and plain language. In tax year 1998, there were 271,856 electronic tax filings of individual income tax, showing an increase in this type of filing of 28%. For this year there already is an increase of 34%.

In October, 1999, they implemented electronic filing for Sales Tax. It was simplified to list only gross sales. You can also pay over the telefile system by giving them a bank account number and they will make a withdrawal from your account. It has been very successful. At the time they implemented this system they named this at the preferred method to file your sales tax return if you are a monthly taxpayer. 58% of the eligible population used this method in November, 1999.

Secretary Pierce finished her presentation by answering questions from the committee.

Chairman Lane adjourned the meeting at 9:53 a.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for January 26, 2000.







 - TY 98 62,617
- PC File
 - TY 98 8,114 (initial year)
- Efile(fed/state)
 - TY 98 200,125
- Summary Total
 - TY 98 271,856, an increase of 28% in electronic tax filing





Electronic Filing - Sales Tax

- Telefile
 - Implemented October, 1999
 - ST-16, monthly filers
 - 10,358 original returns filed for November tax period, 58% of eligible population
- · PC File
 - ST-36, available February 1, 2000

- 81% Motor Fuel Distributors Filing Via EDI
- House Bill 2161 Mandated Electronic Filing
- Senate Bill 418 329 Credits Issued to MF Distributors-\$2.6 Million

Electronic Funds Transfer Activity

- ELECTRONIC FUNDS TRANSFER (EFT)
 - WITHHOLDING TAX
 - 4% of W/H Taxpayers remit 57% of all receipts
 - MINERAL TAX
 - 23% of Mineral Tax Taxpayers remit 85% of receipts
 - MOTOR FUEL- 11% filing, remit \$3.1M per month
 - SALES TAX 53% of telefilers remit \$11.5M monthly

Direct Deposit

- Over 62,000 filers had their income tax refund directly deposited in their bank accounts in 1999
- Available only to electronic filers(Efile, Telefile and PC file)

New Initiatives on the Horizon

- Telefile sales quarterly filers, July 2000
- Required EFT for retailers sales taxpayers, February 2000
- EFT acceptance of additional tax types
- Paperless Business Registration Application
- Use of Internet(web-based) for Filing, Payments, & Billing
- EDI Alcoholic Beverage Control Supplier / Distributor Return & Schedule Information, Control Brand and Licensee Registration

Electronic Commerce Filing Strategies


- Target highest volume trading partners initially
