Chairman Hardenburger opened discussion on <u>SB 463 concerning the term of office for certain elected state officials and repealing the existing section</u>.

Legislative staff explained the balloon for SB 463. (Attachment #1)

Chairman Hardenburger explained to the Committee that the statute is being changed for Lt. Governor only, and the other state executive office holders are brought into the bill for clarification of the Governor's role to appoint them..

Staff informed the Committee that the changes proposed by the balloons for the appointments of the State treasurer and Insurance Commissioner would only be until the next general election.

Senator Lawrence moved that SB 463 be passed out favorably as amended, seconded by Senator Becker. Motion carried.

Chairman Hardenburger opened discussion on **SB 464 concerning campaign finance**; establishing requirements for electronic filing of reporting of campaign contributions.

Dan Hermes, Director of Governmental Affairs, Governor's office explained to the Committee the balloon for **SB 464.** (Attachment #2)

The Committee discussed the meaning of electronic filing.

Senator Becker moved that **SB** 464 be passed out favorably as amended, seconded by Senator Lawrence. Motion carried.

Chairman Hardenburger opened discussion on <u>SB 558</u> concerning governmental ethics; relating to contracts involving state officers or employees, and repealing the existing section. She said this is to close the loopholes on the ethics laws concerning contracts involving state employees, and would cover a contract comprised of competitive bidding and negotiations for state contracts.

Staff recommended technical changes to the bill.

Senator Becker moved to technically amend SB 558, seconded by Senator Praeger. Motion carried.

Senator Becker moved to pass out SB 558 favorably as amended, seconded by Senator Steineger. Motion carried.

Meeting was adjourned at 2:05 p.m. Next meeting is scheduled for February 21, 2000.

SENATE BILL No. 463

By Committee on Elections and Local Covernment

AN ACT concerning the term of office for certain elected state officials: amending K.S.A. 25-101a and 25-101b and repealing the existing sections. 12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 25-101a is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-101a. (a) On the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November in 1978, and each four (4) years thereafter, there shall be elected a governor and lieutenant governor running together, a secretary of state, an attorney general, a state treasurer and a state commissioner of insurance. (b) If a vacancy occurs in the office of lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general or state treasurer, the governor shall appoint some suitable person to serve for the unexpired term and until a successor is elected and qualified. Sec. 2. K.S.A. 25-101b is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-101b. At the general election held in 1978 and each four (+) years thereafter, there shall be elected a treasurer for the state of Kansas, whose term of office shall be four (4) years beginning on the second Monday in January next succeeding such treasurer's election. In case of a vacancy in such office, the governor shall appoint some suitable person to serve for the unexpired term and until a successor is elected and qualified. K.S.A. 25-101a and 25-101b are hereby repealed.

This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its in the statute book.

- (c) If a vacancy occurs in the office of secretary of state or attorney general, the governor shall fill the vacancy by appointment for the remainder of the term.
- (d) If a vacancy occurs in the office of the state treasurer or the commissioner of insurance, the governor shall appoint some suitable person to serve until the next general election after such vacancy occurs, when such vacancy shall be filled by election.

Sec. 3 K.S.A. 40-106 is hereby amended to read as follows: 40-106.

40-106. Commissioner, election, term; vacancy. At the general election held in 1978 and each four (4) years thereafter, there shall be elected a commissioner of insurance for the state of Kansas, whose term of office shall be four (4) years beginning on the second Monday in January next succeeding such commissioner's election. In case of a vacancy in such office

the governor shall appoint some suitable person to serve for the unexpired term and until a successor is elected and qualified.
