# MINUTES OF THE SENATE WAYS & MEANS.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Dave Kerr at 9:00 a.m. on January 7, 2000 in Room 123-S of the Capitol.

Chairman Kerr called the meeting to order and informed members that it would be his plan to deliberate the Governor's proposed budget changes for FY 2000 which were distributed in bill draft form.

(Attachment 1) Following deliberations, he would entertain motions to amend the proposed legislation and to introduce it as amended. It is noted here that a joint meeting of the House Appropriations and Senate Ways and Means Committees was held on January 6, 2000 at 10:00 a.m. in the Old Supreme Court Chambers for the purpose of reviewing the Governor's proposed budget amendments and hearing public testimony on them. The minutes for that meeting were recorded by the Appropriations Committee staff. However, because members referred to a document distributed by the Division of the Budget frequently, it is included in this document. (Attachment 2)

At the request of the Chair, Duane Goossen, Director of the Budget, appeared before the Committee to answer questions regarding the Governor's recommendations. There was some concern regarding the recommended \$850,221 adjustment in salaries and wages for the Kansas Bureau of Investigation. (Attachment 2-82) . Concern was expressed that the adjustment might affect the opening of the Wyandotte County lab. Mr. Goossen explained that the \$850,221 was made up of two parts:

- 1) KBI had identified \$215,000 associated with salaries and wages which the department wanted to shift. The Division of the Budget identified that amount as savings of SGF monies.
- 2) The balance of the \$850,221 was associated with 38 unclassified temporary positions.

Additional information regarding the 38 special project/temporary positions was distributed by Mr. Kyle Smith, KBI. (<u>Attachment 3</u>) It was noted that 32 of the temporary positions were funded by grants and only six of the positions were funded by the State General Fund.

There were questions and committee discussion regarding funding adjustments in the State Water Plan Fund, in the Department of Health and Environment for environmental protection and vaccines, in Wildlife and Parks regarding the possibility of creating diversion problems, in the State Fair, in the Department of Corrections regarding funding for prison staff and for community corrections, and in the Juvenile Justice Authority regarding community vendor payments and intervention/graduated sanctions grants. In answer to a question, it was stated that the nearly half million dollar reduction in community corrections grant awards (Department of Corrections - Attachment 2-63) would be replaced at the local level with carryover monies from FY 99 and that the additional \$2.5 million for purchase of services within the JJA (Attachment 2-72) will be used to purchase services for youth because of additional providers and beds.

It was noted that the total budget for the current fiscal year with the Governor's recommendations is 4.6% above FY 99. In answer to a request, Mr. Goossen stated that he would analyze the budgets to determine if any were being asked to operate below their FY 99 budgeted amounts.

The Chairman opened the floor to amendments to the Governor's recommendations (<u>Attachment 1</u>). <u>It</u> was moved by Senator Jordan and seconded by Senator Lawrence that subsections (c), (j), and (k) of Sec. <u>36 be deleted from the bill draft</u>. The effect of this motion would be to revert to current law regarding general state aid and supplemental base state aid, and that no reduction would be made in the amount of monies made available for juveniles in detention facilities. <u>The motion carried on a voice vote.</u>

It was moved by Senator Feleciano and seconded by Senator Gilstrap that the Governor's recommendation for the Kansas Bureau of Investigation regarding salary and wage adjustments be amended to reflect a reduction of \$444,000 from the SGF. It was noted that this amount reflects the total of \$215,000 as identified by the agency in salary savings and \$229,000 associated with salaries and wages for those 6 special project/temporary positions funded with state general funds.

There was discussion about the level of funding that would be necessary to insure the future of the Wyandotte County lab. Senator Ranson offered a substitute motion which was seconded by Senator Gilstrap to reduce the approved KBI budget for salaries and wages by \$250,000. The substitute motion failed on a voice vote.

The original motion carried on a voice vote.

The Chairman told members that the Death & Disability portion of the Kansas Public Employees Retirement System (KPERS) is actuarily overfunded by \$41 million. Though monies cannot be taken from the fund, the contribution rate could be reduced for the fourth quarter of FY 2000 by proviso which would result in a \$5 million savings from the SGF (Attachment 4), and follow-up legislation would be recommended to address the issue. Members discussed the legalities of suspending the employer contribution, and it was noted by a representative from KPERS that the language should be structured so that the money never flows through KPERS. The immediate and longterm impact of the proposed action was also discussed. It was moved by Senator Ranson and seconded by Senator Salisbury that the bill draft be amended by including language that would suspend the employer contribution rate through the balance of FY 2000. The motion carried on a voice vote.

It was moved by Senator Lawrence and seconded by Senator Jordan that a technical amendments in section 45 of the bill draft be allowed. The motion carried on a voice vote.

It was moved by Senator Salmans and seconded by Senator Lawrence that technical amendments by staff in the bill draft be allowed. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Morris moved, Senator Lawrence seconded, that the bill draft as amended be introduced. Members discussed whether to give the public and agencies more time to respond to the Governor's budget adjustments to finalize the budget for FY 2000 before addressing the budget for FY 2001. It was noted that few or no agency requests for supplemental appropriations are expected. Senator Gilstrap offered a substitute motion which was seconded by Senator Petty to postpone consideration until January 14, 2000. The substitute motion failed on a voice vote.

The primary motion to introduce the bill draft as amended carried on a voice vote.

A motion was made by Senator Jordan and seconded by Senator Morris that a conceptual trailer bill be introduced to address the issue of suspending fourth quarter payments to the Death and Disability Fund within KPERS. The motion carried on a voice vote.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting at 12:05 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, January 12, 2000.

(a) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital improvements projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in sections 3 through 73 of this act.

- (b) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in sections 2, 3, 4, 71 and 72 of this act.
- (c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of subsection (a) of K.S.A. 75-6702 and amendments thereto.

- (g) On the effective date of this act, the amount of the unencumbered balance appropriated for the above agency for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, by section 169(g) of chapter 132 of the 1999 Session Laws of Kansas from the state budget stabilization fund in each of the following accounts is hereby lapsed: State budget stabilization fund ADA capital improvements; state budget stabilization fund ADA accessibility.

## DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

- (a) On the effective date of this act, the expenditure limitation established by section 4(c) of chapter 160 of the 1999 Session Laws of Kansas on the agency operations account of the state highway fund is hereby decreased from \$212,487,075 to \$206,946,902.
- (b) On the effective date of this act, if the aggregate of the amounts transferred from the state general fund to the state highway fund prior to the effective date of this act during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, pursuant to K.S.A. 79-34,147 and amendments thereto, exceeds \$62,240,428, then the director of accounts and reports shall transfer from the state highway fund to the state general fund the amount equal to the difference between such aggregate of the amounts transferred to the state highway fund and \$62,240,428.

Sec. 70. K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 79-34,147 is hereby amended to read as follows: 79-34,147. (a)

- (1) On July 1, 1999, and quarterly thereafter the secretary of revenue shall certify to the director of accounts and reports the amount equal to 7.628% of the total revenues received by the secretary from the taxes imposed under the Kansas retailers' sales tax act and deposited in the state treasury and credited to the state general fund during the preceding three calendar months.
- (2) On July 1, 2001, and quarterly thereafter, the secretary of revenue shall certify to the director of accounts and reports the amount equal to 9.5% of the total revenues received by the secretary from the taxes imposed under the Kansas retailers' sales tax act and deposited in the state treasury and credited to the state general fund during the preceding three calendar months.
- (3) On July 1, 2002, and quarterly thereafter, the secretary of revenue shall certify to the director of accounts and reports the amount equal to 11% of the total revenues received by the secretary from the taxes imposed under the Kansas retailers' sales tax act and deposited in the state treasury and credited to the state general fund during the preceding three calendar months.
- (4) On July 1, 2003, and quarterly thereafter, the secretary of revenue shall certify to the director of accounts and reports the amount equal to 11.25% of the total revenues received by the secretary from the taxes imposed under the Kansas retailers' sales tax act and deposited in the state treasury and credited to the state general fund during the preceding three calendar months.
- (5) On July 1, 2004, and quarterly thereafter, the secretary of revenue shall certify to the director of accounts and reports the amount equal to 12% of the total revenues received by the secretary from the taxes imposed under the Kansas retailers' sales tax act and deposited in the state treasury and credited to the state general fund during the preceding three calendar months.
- (b) Upon receipt of each certification under subsection (a), the director of accounts and reports shall transfer from the state general fund to the state highway fund an amount equal to the amount so certified, on each July 1, October 1, January 1 and April 1, except that (1)(A) the amount of the transfer on each such date during state fiscal year 2000 shall not exceed the amount equal to 101.7% of the amount of the transfer on each such date during state fiscal year 1999 and (B) the aggregate amount of all such transfers during state fiscal year 2000 shall not exceed \$62,240,428; and (2) the amount of the transfer on each such date during state fiscal year 2001 shall not exceed the amount equal to 101.7% of the amount transferred on the same date during state fiscal year 2000. All transfers made pursuant to this section are subject to reduction under K.S.A. 75-6704, and amendments thereto.
  - (c) All transfers made in accordance with the provisions of this section shall be considered

to be demand transfers from the state general fund.

- Sec. 71. Appeals to exceed position limitations. (a) The limitations imposed by this act on the number of full-time and regular part-time positions equated to full-time, excluding seasonal and temporary positions, paid from appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, made in this act or in any appropriation act of the 1999 regular session of the legislature or in any other appropriation act of the 2000 regular session of the legislature may be exceeded upon approval of the state finance council.
- (b) The limitations imposed by this act on the number of full-time and regular part-time positions equated to full-time, excluding seasonal and temporary positions, paid from appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001, made in this act or in any other appropriation act of the 2000 regular session of the legislature may be exceeded upon approval of the state finance council.
- Sec. 72. Appeals to exceed limitations. Upon written application to the governor and approval of the state finance council, expenditures from special revenue funds may exceed the amounts specified in this act.
  - Sec. 73. K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 79-34,147 is hereby repealed.
- Sec. 74. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.

Attached is a legal opinion from Department of Administration which determined that KBI special project positions are to be authorized by the Attorney General's office, since the KBI is a division of that office. Each of these 38 positions was duly authorized.

Appointment of Special Project Positions

Kathy Metcalf and Lois Ryan of your staff contacted me regarding the appointment of a Special Project Position for the Kansas Bureau of Investigation. Specifically they asked whether the Governor had to approve the establishment of a new special project position for K.B.I.

The statutory basis for special project positions is contained in K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 75-2935 which provides in pertinent part as follows:

"The civil service of the state of Kansas is hereby divided into the unclassified and the classified services.

- (1) The unclassified services comprises positions held by state officers or employees who are: ...
  - persons temporarily employed or designated by the Legislature or by a Legislative Committee or Commission or other competent authority to make or conduct a special inquiry, investigation, examination or installation; ... " (Emphasis added)

Because of a desire to control the growth of special project positions, the Governor has put an approval process into place for unclassified special project positions over which he has salary approval authority.

The Governor's salary approval authority is set forth in K.S.A. 75-2935(b); which in portinent part provides as follows:

"Salaries and other compensation of all persons who are within the unclassified service of the Kansas Civil Service Act, in which salaries and other compensation

are not fixed by statute, shall be subject to the approval of the Governor and such salaries and other compensation shall not be paid until approved by the Governor. The provisions of this section shall not apply to ... officers and employees of elected state officials...."

The question of whether the Governor must approve the salary of an unclassified special project employee of the K.B.I. turns on whether such a position is an employee of the Attorney General.

Statutory provisions relating to the K.B.I. are set forth in K.S.A. 75-711, which in part provides as follows:

"There it is hereby established, under the jurisdiction of the Attorney General, a division to be known as the Kansas Bureau of Investigation. The director of the bureau shall be appointed by the Attorney General, subject to confirmation by the Senate... In accordance with the appropriation act the director shall appoint agents... The director shall appoint an assistant director... The director may also appoint a special assistant and, in accordance with appropriation acts such administrative employees as are necessary... In addition to such agents and administrative employees and in accordance with appropriation acts, the director may appoint additional agents..." (Emphasis added)

Highly summarized, the statute makes the KBI a division of the Attorney General's office. So long as the Attorney General has approved a special project appointment for a position in the K.B.I., the approval of the Governor is not required. This results because the Governor does not approve the salaries of employees of elected state officials. KBI employees are employees of an elected state official, the Attorney General, by virtue of the language of K.S.A. 75-711 quoted above which provides the KBI as a division under the jurisdiction of the Attorney General.
