MINUTES OF THE e-GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Deena Horst at 3:35 p.m. on January 23, 2001, in Room 526-S of the Capitol.

The minutes for the January 18, 2001, meeting were approved as printed. (Motion, Representative Gatewood, seconded by Representative Levinson)

Bobbi Mariani, Director of Personnel Services for the Department of Administration, outlined information from the annual Kansas Workforce Report. (Attachment 1) She said Kansas is recognized nationally for its state government human resources programs. She stated that the Workforce Report enables the Personnel Division to be aware of trends in state government, addressing present and future staff requirements in the state agencies and in various job classifications. She highlighted rates of turnover (13%), salary rank compared with neighboring states (29th), retirement statistics (more than 60% of the state workforce over 40 years of age) and strategies for retention and recruitment, the last of which includes developing competency models rather than merely evaluating education and experience. Ms. Mariani discussed the benefits and drawbacks of the state's salary matrix, noting that it was increasingly difficult to compete with the private sector at entry-level positions. (Attachment 2) She said some states use a modified matrix that provides changes at selected points of the matrix without requiring full-spectrum adjustments.

Answering questions, Ms. Mariani noted that low unemployment has impinged on the pool of applications to state government. She said longevity bonuses, employee benefits and job stability help retain employees. Prospective employees in targeted jobs receive up-front bonuses. She replied that the Workforce Report includes Regents' schools statistics. She said she could not provide information for positions funded but not filled; she offered to provide an agency-by-agency list of actual employees. She expressed concern that with the increase in retirements, the state will find it more difficult to provide services for its citizens. She said her office compares the state salary matrix to market figures; however, the rigidity of the matrix obviates much flexibility. She noted that the 40% spread of ranges is adequate, making additional steps above step 15 untenable. She said the report is also available on the Division's web-site.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:40 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, January 25, 2001, at 3:30 p.m. in Room 526-S, to discuss <u>HB 2004.</u>

Introduction

The Division of Personnel Services is pleased to present the fourth annual State of Kansas Workforce Report.

The Fiscal Year 2000 report presents financial facts and statistics, employment and agency trends and characteristics of the Kansas state government workforce. The report provides information from both statewide and agency perspectives. The purpose of the report is to provide useful fact-based data for human resource planning and decision-making.

The size of the state workforce has declined by more than 11% since Fiscal Year 1995. The reduction, in large part, is the result of the Governor's initiative for state agencies to find ways to reduce the size of state government and agency program changes. Due to the decline, the State of Kansas, as other employers, must continue to improve services with fewer employees. To meet our goals, our efforts will focus on the necessity to attract and retain a quality workforce through new and revised programs.

The Division of Personnel Services has enhanced its ability to conduct workforce analysis due, in large part, to use of the Statewide Human Resource and Payroll system (SHARP) and the Microsoft Access database software. SHARP is an integrated database which provides information that enables state agencies as well as the legislature to make proactive human resource decisions based on detailed information. Data regarding retirement projections, turnover assessments and recruitment analyses are included in this report.

The information presented in this report was gathered from SHARP; annual reports containing KIPPS (Kansas Integrated Personnel and Payroll System) data for Fiscal Year 1995; information published by the Division of Budget, State of Kansas; Kansas Department of Human Resources; and the U.S. Census Bureau.




Workforce Characteristics

Section One of this report illustrates employment data encompassing a six-year period. The data provides information using statewide and agency perspectives. The following comments are in regards to classified state employees only.

- The number of employees in the 50-59 age category **increased 6%** since 1995, while the number of employees in the below 30 age category **decreased 18%** during the same time frame.
- Similar trends are occurring in the annual salary categories. The number of employees earning over \$40,000 has **increased 48%** since 1995. Those earning between \$10,000 and \$19,999 have **decreased 49%** since 1995.
- Since 1995, there has been a 29% increase in the number of employees with 20-29 years of service. Conversely, the number of employees with 5-9 years of service has decreased 35% since 1995.

The number of employees earning less than \$10,000 annually have remained constant at less than 1% of total employees for the past five years. The number of part-time employees has remained fairly constant for the last four years declining by only 1%.


Number of State Government Employees



Comments: The number of classified and unclassified employees has decreased by 11.3% since the end of Fiscal Year 1995. The percentages noted in parentheses reflect the percentage of change from the previous fiscal year. Facility closures, the Retirement Reduction program and program privatization have contributed in large part to the decrease in the number of state employees.



Recruitment/employee development intiatives should be designed and implemented to reduce the disruption caused by these vacancies. The average classified state employee is 45 years of age with 12 years of service and earns \$28,842 annually.

Classfied Employees Aging Trends FY 1994 to FY 2000



Classified Employees by Age Group



Classified Employees by Annual Salary




Comments: The number of classified employees falling within the \$10,000-\$19,999 and \$20,000-\$29,999 salary category has decreased 12% and 2% respectively since 1995. The number of classified employees in the \$30,000-\$39,999 and over \$40,000 salary categories have experienced increases of 7% since 1995. Factors influencing changes include minimum wage and cost of living increases, annual step movement increases and promotions. The under \$10,000 category was intentionally excluded from this chart due to the low numbers of employees (less than 1%).

Comments: Positions by Agency reflects the total number of positions authorized for each state agency. Total positions are divided into FTE positions and unclassified temporary positions. The number of FTE positions for each agency is typically constrained by a limitation included in appropriation bills. Positions in legislative and judicial agencies along with several agencies of the executive branch, such as Regents institutions and the Board of Indigent's Defense, are not constrained by a limitation. Similarly, unclassified temporary positions are not subject to a position limitation.

The reported number of positions in Fiscal Year 1996 increased from the previous year as part of the Governor's intent to report the full size of the state workforce. In prior years, "special project" positions were not included in determining the number of state employees. In Fiscal Year 1996, some of these positions were converted to FTE positions. The remaining "special project" positions are now defined as "unclassified temporary" positions. In addition, certain positions formerly called "classified part-time intermittents" were added to the position count as part of the changes necessary to implement the state's personnel payroll system (SHARP).

Workforce Trends

Section Two of this report illustrates fundamental trends with the State of Kansas and how our state compares to other state governments. The information in this section supports the fact that many agencies' characteristics are similar. The similarities across different agencies illustrate the concept of the State of Kansas as a single employer.

55.3 days is the average number of days from when a vacancy appears
on the Notice of Vacancies until the new employee's first day on the job.
A vacancy is typically posted for ten days. The remainder of this time is
used to complete the interview process and the normal two week notice
given to a current employer.

Effective November 8, 1999, the Governor implemented a ninety day hiring freeze on vacant positions, a suspension of all position reallocations and the use of temporary appointments due to fiscal constraints. A waiver procedure was put in place to assure that this action did not impact public safety or workers who provided direct care to Kansans. The freeze ended February 5, 2000.

• **63%** of the classified, regular employees who left state service (excluding retirements) in Fiscal Year 2000 had 1-5 years of service.

The current turnover rate for classified employees is **13.01%**. This has remained relatively unchanged for several years.

- **17.8%** of the current State of Kansas workforce will be retirement eligible as of December 2005.
- Average salaries for classified employees are consistently below the Central States averages. The variables identified are attributed to the State of Kansas' emphasis on allocating the salary budget to individual employee higher step movement as opposed to maintaining the pay structure.
- The State of Kansas employs a greater percentage of minorities in the classified service than what is represented in the available Kansas workforce.




Average Number of Days to Fill a Vacancy by Job Category January 1, 1999 to March 31, 2000







Workforce Trends FY 1994 to FY 2000





January 1996-May 2000







Comments: Various factors contribute to change in the average annual salary. Many employees are eligible for step movement within the pay plan each year, approximately a 2.5% increase. Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA) are based on legislative approval. The State of Kansas has historically allocated the majority of the annual salary budget to fund longevity based programs (step movement and longevity payment). This has resulted in marginal annual adjustments to the pay structure. The cumulative effect has eroded the state's ability to provide competitive wages and hinders recruitment efforts. In contrast, other employers have maintained the competitive status of their pay structures by annually allocating the majority of their annual salary budget to pay structure adjustments.









Shared Leave

Fiscal Year 2000

The Kansas Shared Leave Program is a means to transfer vacation and sick leave to a qualifying employee experiencing a serious medical condition, either personally or by a family member, and provides some income protection for employees who will be absent from work for a prolonged period of time and have exhausted all paid leave. The Shared Leave Program was amended effective June 16, 2000 to exempt employees leaving state service, who wish to donate leave to another employee, from the regulation's minimum leave balance requirements.





Glossary

Agency: a unit of state government assigned a unique department indentification number.

Central States Association: the Central States' Compensation Association formed to enable state governments to share data and issues concerning employee compensation.

Classified Service: all positions in the state service, except those which are specifically placed in the unclassified service by K.S.A. 75-2935, as amended, or other sections of the statutes.

Demotion: a change of an employee from a position in one class to a position in another class having a lower pay grade.

Established Position: a position which is in the budget as approved by the legislature, and which has been allocated (may or may not have ever been filled).

Fiscal Year: the time period from July 1 to June 30.

Full-Time Equivalency (FTE): a unit of measurement equivalent to one full-time position.

Interview Right (IR): classified, regular employees laid off from approved state institutions have a right to an interview for any position in the same or higher pay grade than the pay grade on which the eligible employee was paid at the time of the layoff. IR expires two years from the layoff date.

K.A.R.: Kansas Administrative Regulation

K.S.A.: Kansas Statutes Annotated

KIPPS: Kansas Integrated Personnel and Payroll System, replaced by SHARP in December 1995.

Length of Service: total time working in the classified service or unclassified service, with certain exclusions per K.A.R. 1-2-46.

Notice of Vacancies (NOV): the centralized statewide listing of all classified job vacancies announced weekly to all applicants. Unclassified and temporary vacancies may be listed. NOV is available on the Internet, at personnel offices of larger state agencies, at the Department of Human Resources Workforce Centers, and at the Civil Service Employment Information office in Topeka.

Pay Grade: a salary and wage range in the pay plan prepared by the Director of Personnel. Services as required by K.S.A. 75-2938.

Position: a group of duties and responsibilities, assigned or delegated by an appointing authority, requiring the services of an employee on a full-time basis or, in some cases, on a less than full-time basis.

Promotion: a change of an employee from a position in one class to a position in another class having a higher pay grade, by an employee who meets the required selection criteria for promotion.

Rehire: any person hired by the state who was previously employed by the state.

Resignation: the voluntary termination of employment by an employee.

Retirement: one of the following four criteria must be met to be considered retirement eligible: age 65 or over; age 65 or over with 10 years of qualifying service; qualifying under the "85-point" plan; age 55 or over with ten years of service taking early retirement with reduced benefits. The 85-point plan is age plus length of service in years equaling at least 85 points (for example, 55 years old with 30 years of service).

Right of First Refusal (ROFR): classified, regular employees laid off from approved institutions may exercise the ROFR for any position in the same or lower pay grade than the pay grade on which the eligible employee was paid at the time of layoff. ROFR expires two years from the layoff date.

SHARP: Statewide Human Resource and Payroll system implemented in December, 1995.

Student Position: a position filled by a student at a regents institution.

Temporary Position (classified service): a position which is limited to not more than 999 hours of employment in a 12-month period. Temporary positions do not affect the position limitation of an agency.

Temporary Position (unclassified service): a position filled by a person temporarily or designated by the legislature or by a legislative committee or commission or other competent authority to make or conduct a special inquiry, investigation, examination or installation.

Transfer: a change by an employee from one position with a close similarity of duties, essentially the same basic qualifications, and the same pay grade.

Unclassified Service: position specifically designated as unclassified by K.S.A. 75-2935, as amended, or other section of the statutes.

Fiscal Year 1995-2000 Legislative Summary

This summary contains legislative highlights with regards to the creation of new agencies, the abolition of existing agencies and FTE approvals affecting greater than 5.0 FTE. The FTE revisions illustrate both increases and decreases in agency FTE's. Following the legislative summary is a chart depicting the number of positions affected by the Retirement Reduction plan, implemented by 1993 HB 2211.

Fiscal Year 1995

- 1994 HB 2573 established the Kansas Information Resources Council and the Office of the Chief Information Architect. The council is comprised of 20 executives representing various state agencies and the private sector.
- 10.0 FTE positions were added to Judiciary due to new crime legislation; plus 3 judgeships to manage the overall growth in judicial caseloads.
- 63.0 limited term FTE positions were added to the Youth Center at Larned to accommodate increases in the length-of-stay for juveniles at the state youth centers.
- 40.0 FTE positions were added for the Adjutant General's Retro Europe Repair Site located at Ft. Riley.
- 35.0 FTE positions were deleted from the Topeka Correctional Facility because of an anticipated decrease in minimum-security inmate population.
- 9.0 FTE positions and 62.0 special project positions were added to Social and Rehabilitation Services to implement welfare reform.
- 9.0 special project positions were added to the Youth Center at Topeka to conduct a Physical Training Program. This program will require that juveniles located at the youth center participate in a physical exercise training program similar in style to programs operated at boot camps.

Fiscal Year 1996

- January 1, 1996, all state employees were placed on a bi-weekly pay cycle. (Prior to 1-1-96 the majority of state employees were on a monthly pay cycle.)
- 1,096.2 part-time (.49) classified intermittent and special project positions were converted to FTE positions to better reflect the true size of the state workforce.
- The Kansas Youth Authority was authorized. The Authority consists of 7 members appointed by the Governor and is responsible for development of confinement and dispositional alternatives for juvenile offenders.
- The Kansas Guardianship Program was created. The program provides recruitment, training, monitoring and support for volunteers willing to become court-appointed guardians for clients identified as being in need of these services. This function was transferred from a private, not-for-profit corporation that was funded through grants administered by Social and Rehabilitation Services.
- 43.0 FTE positions were added at Winfield, Lansing, Topeka, El Dorado and Hutchinson Correctional Facilities to manage projected increases in the inmate population.
- 9.0 FTE positions were deleted from the Kansas Corporation Commission. The Legislature left it to the discretion of the Commission to determine which positions would be eliminated with the understanding that none should be associated with the Commission's abandoned well-plugging activities.
- The Farmers' Assistance, Counseling, and Training Program (FACTS) was transferred from the Department of Agriculture to Kansas State University's Cooperative Extension Service, where current resources will provide various educational, legal, and mediation services. This deleted 7.0 FTE positions from the Department of Agriculture.

Fiscal Year 1997

- Topeka State Hospital and Winfield State Hospital and Training Center closed.
- 32.4 FTE positions were added for Medicaid fraud and abuse and court debt collections in the Attorney General's Office, contracts for retired judges and administration of Access to Justice Program in the Judiciary, an assistant investment officer for Kansas Public Employees Retirement System, telecommunications analysts and legal staff in the Kansas Corporation Commission, blood alcohol content administration and legal staff in the Kansas Corporation Commission, blood alcohol content administration in the Department of Revenue, and an auditor of local elected officials in the Commission on Governmental Standards.

- The Executive Director's position of the Parole Board was eliminated. The Board's administrative functions were consolidated with the Parole and Post-Release Supervision Program of the Department of Corrections.
- 120.0 FTE positions were reduced from Department of Corrections due to the privatization of food service operations in the system's nine correctional facilities.
- 23.0 FTE positions were shifted from the Winfield Correctional Facility to the Lansing Correctional Facility because of increased inmate population.

Fiscal Year 1998

- The transfer of Long Term Care Programs for the Elderly from the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services to the Department on Aging.
- The Winfield Veterans Home was established on the grounds of the Winfield State Hospital and Training Center after its closure. 2.0 FTE positions were approved for the agency to begin basic operation in the second half of Fiscal Year 1998.
- The Grain Inspection Department was abolished effective September 1, 1997. This inspection and grading of grain became the responsibility of a private entity. The authority and responsibility of the Department's Warehouse Program was transferred to the Secretary of Agriculture.
- The Juvenile Justice Authority was created to implement the Juvenile Justice Reform Act, which is intended to strengthen the juvenile system. The Authority was given 30.0 FTE positions, excluding the juvenile correctional facilities' personnel. The services for juvenile offenders transerred from other agencies, such as the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services.
- 24.0 FTE positions were added to the Department of Administration for the operation of the Topeka State Hospital Grounds.
- 20.5 FTE positions were transferred from the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services to Kansas
 Department of Health and Environment. The authority for licensure inspection of family foster homes, child
 placement agencies, 24-hour care residential facilities and detention facilities was transferred from the
 Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services to Kansas Department of Health and Environment. This
 was done to provide neutral oversight of the quality of inspection of those facilities.
- 17.1 FTE positions were added to Pittsburg State University's Technology Center due to a change in the servicing of new buildings formula for staffing.

Fiscal Year 1999

- The KU Hospital portion of the KU Medical Center became a public authority and no longer part of a state agency in October 1998 (1998 SB 373). Approximately half of the KU Medical Center's FTE was transferred to the public authority.
- 23.0 FTE positions were added to the Sex Predator Treatment Program at Larned State Hospital to provide staff necessary for expanding the program. The new positions were hired as additional residents are added to the program. The positions to be added include direct care staff, a Psychologist III, a Social Worker and a Registered Nurse.
- 14.0 FTE positions were added to the Highway Patrol, 7 troopers to patrol the highways and 7 to implement the Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS).
- 11.0 FTE positions were added to the Division of Environment of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment enhanced funding for inspections of large swine feeding facilities is intended to ensure the protection of the environment by monitoring the state's air, landscape and water resources.
- 10.0 FTE positions were added to the Judiciary to assist the courts in dealing with increasing caseloads throughout the states.
- 10.0 FTE positions were added to the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission to allow the Commission to complete its own background investigations.
- 7.0 FTE positions were added to the Department of Revenue to implement provisions included in the 1998
 Tax Relief Act.
- 7.0 FTE positions were added to the Board of Tax Appeals. A small claims division was established within the Board and creates a new executive director position.
- Transferred the Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman from the Department on Aging to the Department of Administration. This included 5.5 FTE positions. The transfer was intended to ensure impartiality in the investigations that the Ombudsman conducts.

- 9.0 FTE positions were added to the Racing and Gaming Commission for the opening of a new racetrack.
- 12.0 FTE positions were added to the Department of Corrections for work crew supervisors.
- 11.0 FTE positions were added to Larned Correctional Mental Health Facility for security staff and drug treatment personnel.
- 60.5 FTE positions were transferred from the Topeka Correctional Facility to El Dorado Correctional Facility for the relocation of the Reception and Diagnostic Unit. The affected employees were given ROFR and IR.
- 16.0 FTE positions were added to the Highway Patrol for new troopers for the Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program.
- 21.0 FTE positions were reduced from the Department of Revenue. 17 positions will be eliminated through restructuring regional tax offices and 4.0 to be eliminated through restructuring of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division.
- 1.3 FTE positions were reduced from the Department of Agriculture for the privatization of the Grain Commodity Commission.
- 8.0 FTE positions abolished for the privatization of the Kansas Wheat Commission.
- As of January 1, 2000, positions that had been vacant for four years or more as determined by the Director of the Budget in consultation with the Director of Personnel Services were abolished.
- An additional 38.8 FTE positions will be deleted in FY 2001. This was accomplished by abolishing all FTE positions that, as of March 1, 2000, had been vacant for three years or more.
- A non-judicial salary initiative fund to be used for compensation of non-judicial officers and employees in the
 judicial branch as approved by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court was established in the state treasury.

Fiscal Year 2001

During the 2000 Legislative session, the Legislature approved changes that will affect all state agencies. These changes will take effect on the first day of Fiscal Year 2001.

- The Kansas Wheat Commission was privatized. As a result, the 8.0 FTE positions at the Kansas Wheat Commission were abolished and 1.3 FTE positions at the Department of Agriculture were reduced.
- The Legislature abolished FTE positions that, as of January 1, 2000, had been vacant for four years or more as determined by the Director of the Budget in consultation with the Director of Personnel Services. This action resulted in the deletion of 37.7 FTE positions in eight state agencies.
- An additional 38.3 FTE positions will be deleted in FY 2001. This was accomplished by abolishing all FTE positions that, as of March 1, 2000, had been vacant for three years or more.
