Chairman Beggs and members of the Tourism Committee. Thank you for allowing my testimony on HB 2515.

This bill concerns cities and counties; relating to convention and tourism committees. It would amend K.S.A. 12-1695 from shall to may establish a convention and tourism committee to make recommendations concerning the programs and expenditures for promotion of conventions and tourism. It also allows that if the governing body decides to appoint a committee it shall appoint 10 members.

Another amendment is that the governing body of any city or county which levies a transient guest tax pursuant to this act <u>may</u> as opposed to <u>shall</u> establish a convention and tourism committee to make recommendations concerning the programs and expenditures for promotion of convention and tourism committees.
