### HB 2521 - Kansas Underground Utility Damage Prevention Act revision

The debate continued on <u>HB 2521</u>. Rep. Lightner moved to allow all water and sewer systems to opt out of the One-Call program. Rep. McLeland seconded the motion. The motion failed. Rep. Myers moved to allow city water systems to opt out of the program. Rep. McLeland seconded the motion and the motion failed. Rep. McLeland moved to strike the previously added amendment that allows rural water districts to opt out of the program. Rep. McLeland withdrew his motion. After discussion, Rep. McLeland withdrew his motion. Rep. Loyd moved to recommend HB 2521, as amended, favorable for passage. Rep. Dreher seconded the motion. The motion carried. Rep. ## HR 6011 - Consideration of life-cycle costs in the design of state buildings

## HCR 5013 - Constitutional amendment decreasing the property tax assessment rate for public utility property to 25%

Chairman Holmes reconvened the hearing on <u>HCR 5013</u>. Written testimony in opposition to <u>HCR 5013</u> was submitted by Judy Moler, General Counsel for the Kansas Association of Counties (<u>Attachment 1</u>). Gene L. # Kansas Association of Counties Testimony on HCR 5013 Before the House Utility Committee By Judy A. Moler, General Counsel/Legislative Services Director March 14, 2001

#### Chairman Holmes and Members of the Committee:

The Kansas Association of Counties is in opposition to the proposed constitutional amendment HCR 5013. Passage of this amendment would constitute a dramatic property tax shift. The tax shift to residential, agricultural use and commercial property owners could be as high as \$71,085,222 based upon the 1999 abstract. The shift would be felt most strongly in rural areas that do not have the diversity of taxing options that more urban counties have.

For these reasons, the Kansas Association of Counties oppose HCR 5013.

The Board of Coffey County Commissioners, on behalf of the citizens of Coffey County, has requested that I correspond with you and your committee members, to express its reservations and opposition to the proposal expressed by HCR 5013. As we understand it, this proposed constitutional amendment would effectively lower the property tax assessment rate for public utility property from 33% to 25%.

We believe the effect of such a tax policy change would be detrimental to the average citizens of the state. The effect of this proposal would simply be to shift the tax burden from utilities to residential property owners. To shift \$65 million in taxes to residential property owners would be bad policy both in the short and long term. Frankly, it would appear quite unlikely that a majority of Kansas taxpayers would support a constitutional amendment that would have this effect.

We appreciate the difficult work you and your committee members do on behalf of all Kansans you represent. We appreciate this opportunity to express our views on this important issue and we appreciate your consideration.
