HB2188--Community colleges, scholarships, student fees

Sheila Frahm, KACCT, presented an amendment which provides the opportunity to assure that the locally elected trustees have the authority to collect fees and to determine what their colleges will do in the collection of fees.

Senator Vratil thanked Sheila for the group of people she brought together to work out a compromise on the bill. The amendment will make it clear that community colleges do have the authority to access student fees and make it clear that those student fees are not private funds. It would clearly indicate that those student fees could be used for scholarships, either academic or athletic as long as it is approved by the board of trustees and acknowledged by the student government. It does not have to be approved by student government, but it must be acknowledged by them. The acknowledgment should be done as part of a formal process, in writing, so that there is a record of it and that written document is intended to reflect the student knowledge of it.

Senator Vratil made a motion to amend HB2188 in accordance with the balloon provided by Sheila Frahm. (Attachment 1) Seconded by Senator Teichman. Motion carried.

Senator Corbin made a motion to pass out favorably HB2188 as amended. Seconded by Senator Schodorf. Motion carried.

HB2094--School districts, definition of juvenile detention facility for services and state grants

Chairman Umbarger asked if anyone was present in the Committee that wished to make any comments on HB2094. There was no response so Chairman Umbarger asked Ben Barrett to brief the Committee to refresh memories.

It was discussed again regarding notification of school districts in a timely manner. Richard Kline from Juvenile Justice Authority agreed to notify school districts when a facility is being opened in their district. On February 27th, an amendment was approved to include the Clarence M. Kelly Transitional Living Center in the definition of the bill.

Senator Corbin made a motion to pass out favorably HB2094 as amended. Seconded by Senator Schodorf. Motion carried.

Chairman Umbarger reminded the Committee that they needed to be ready to work on a school finance plan.

Meeting was adjourned at 2:02 p.m.

AN ACT concerning community colleges; relating to expenditures for scholarships; authorizing the charging of fees; amending K.S.A. 71-203 10 and K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 71-301 and repealing the existing sections. 11 12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 13 Section 1. K.S.A. 71-203 is hereby amended to read as follows: 71-14 203. No The board of trustees of any a community college shall not authorize or permit the expenditure of any public funds, either directly or 16 indirectly, for scholarships for students who reside outside of the com-17 munity college district. No public funds shall be expended for athletic 18 scholarships either within or without any community college district. For the purpose of this section, moneys received from sale of admissions to activities which the community college sponsors, student fees, and moneys received from private sector persons or organizations shall not be deemed to be public funds. Athletic scholarships shall not be granted to nonres idents of the state of Kansas 25

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 71-301 is hereby amended to read as follows: 71-301. The board of trustees shall charge to and collect from each student tuition at rates per credit hour enrolled which shall be established by the board of trustees. In addition to tuition, the board of trustees may charge to and collect from each student fees at rates which shall be established by the board of trustees.

31 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 71-203 and K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 71-301 are hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
