Linda DeCoursey appeared on behalf of Kathleen Sebelius, Insurance Commissioner, requesting the introduction of proposed legislation regarding political contributions to the Insurance Commissioner or to candidates for that office (Attachment 1). Senator Gooch moved to recommend the introduction of a bill dealing with political contributions to the Insurance Commissioner seconded by Senator Gilstrap. The motion carried

Brad Bryant, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State, gave a briefing on election administration, covering there are four concepts; ballots, recounts, contests and voting systems. On ballots, Kansas has no punch cards, no certification, no grace periods for ballots to come in after election day, and no postmarked locations, Kansas counts all ballots that are cast legally and timely and a recount is one of two ways to repeat the procedure that gave the original count of totals. The recount statute in Kansas works well. Contests; a candidate who thinks the race was wrong, issues needed to be resolved along with the recount of the ballots, illegal votes, legal votes were cast but not counted, errors or fraud in tabulating or bribery in election are grounds for contesting an election. The fourth concept is the procedure for certification of voting equipment(Attachment 2).

The meeting was adjourned at 2:25 p.m.

Request for Bill Introduction

Madam Chairwoman and members of the Committee:

I am appearing today on behalf of Insurance Commissioner Kathleen Sebelius to request the introduction of a bill. The proposed legislation deals with making political contributions to the Insurance Commissioner or to candidates for that office.

The Commissioner imposed this restriction on herself when she became a candidate for insurance commissioner in 1994. She will continue that practice as long as she retains the office. The fact still disturbs her that there is no law preventing future insurance commissioners or commissioner candidates from shaking the industry down for campaign money.

The Insurance Commissioner's office is critical to all Kansans. The insurance industry needs to know that the office of the insurance commissioner has no list of contributors who get favorable regulatory treatment, and consumers should now that there are no financial ties between the insurance industry and the commissioner who regulates the business of insurance.

Thank you for your consideration of this possible legislation.

Procedure for Certification of Voting Equipment

March, 1999

The manufacturer or vendor sends a request for certification in writing to the Secretary of State, accompanied by a \$250 fee.

The Secretary of State requires that the equipment be certified by an independent testing authority. We request a copy of the ITA's report.

The Secretary of State reviews the equipment to ensure that it meets standards established by the Federal Election Commission and the requirements of Kansas law.

The Secretary of State conducts a public hearing in Topeka at which the manufacturer or vendor displays the equipment and members of the Secretary's staff and other interested persons test the equipment.

The Secretary of State may hire a private expert to review the equipment at the manufacturer's expense.

The Secretary of State contacts other jurisdictions in the United States that have certified and used the equipment to inquire about their experiences.

The Secretary of State may grant temporary conditional approval for the equipment to be used in a Kansas jurisdiction before granting final certification.

If the above conditions are met, the Secretary of State makes the final decision whether to grant certification and informs the manufacturer and vendor of the decision in writing.
