Discussion of bills

SB 89 - concerning local units of government; relating to rent control

Testimony by Natalie G. Haag Chief Legal Counsel Director of Governmental Affairs Senate Bill 171

Madam Chairman and members of the committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide additional information to the committee regarding Senate Bill 171. Senator Adkins has raised an excellent concern regarding the safety of our State's governor. The proposed statutory language in Senate Bill 171 would address the issues of travel for Governor Graves. However, requiring our governor to reimburse the State of Kansas for expenses of travel when the governor engages in a political or personal activity during the trip has the potential to restrict use of the aircraft to governor's with personal wealth sufficient to cover these expenses.

Obviously, Senator Adkins did not intend such a consequence. After discussions with Senator Adkins and Governor Graves, the Governor's office is proposing a substitute bill that would amend K.S.A. 74-2105(a) by clarifying the duties of the superintendent of the Kansas Highway Patrol regarding the travel of the governor.

K.S.A. 74-2105 provides that the superintendent may designate members of the Highway Patrol to perform security duties for public officials. The proposed substitute bill would insert the language:

The superintendent shall provide such transportation deemed necessary by the superintendent or his designee for the purpose of providing security for the governor and the governor's family. When the governor elects to travel by state owned vehicle or aircraft for political or personal business and the superintendent has not deemed such transportation necessary for the security of the governor or the governor's family, the governor may use such vehicle or aircraft and reimburse the State of Kansas for its use in an amount determined by the Secretary of Administration.

The first sentence of the proposed language codifies current laws and practices. The Highway Patrol follows this practice based upon Governmental Ethics Commission Opinion No. 1997-35. The second sentence would address those circumstances discussed by Senator Adkins and Lindsay Olsen in their testimony before this committee.

AN ACT concerning the governor; relating to travel on state aircraft

11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) The governor may use any aircraft owned by the state for personal use including campaigning in support or in opposition to any candidate for national, state or local office. The governor shall reimburse the state for personal use of such aircraft owned by the state at a rate fixed by the secretary of administration.

(b) If the governor uses an aircraft owned by the state for a trip made in part for a public purpose and in part for a personal purpose, the governor shall reimburse the state for the portion of the trip attributable to

(c) The secretary of administration shall adopt policies necessary to implement the provisions of this section and shall fix, charge and collect fees for travel by the governor authorized under this section.

Sec. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

K.S.A. 74-2105 is hereby amended to read as follows:

74-2105. Principal function of highway patrol; uniforms required, exceptions; security for public officials; superintendent to supervise and manage capitol area security patrol; advise with legislative coordinating council; management functions for burgan of emergency medical services. (a) The principal function of the Kansas highway patrol shall be enforcement of the traffic and other laws of this state relating to highways, vehicles and drivers of vehicles except as otherwise provided in this subsection (a). The superintendent and members of the highway patrol in performing their duties under this act shall wear badges and uniforms of office. The superintendent may designate members to perform security duties for public officials and other duties as directed by the superintendent. The superintendent may perform duties under this act whether or not wearing a badge and uniform. Such members may serve without uniform and without open display of badges. Officers and employees of the bureau of emergency medical services shall not wear badges and uniforms of office.

(b) In addition to the duties otherwise prescribed by law, the superintendent of the highway patrol shall supervise and manage the capitol area security patrol. In the supervision and management of the duties of the capitol area security patrol in and around the state capitol building, the superintendent of the highway patrol shall advise with the legislative coordinating council.

(c) In addition to other duties, the superintendent of the highway patrol shall provide budgeting, purchasing and related management functions for the bureau of emergency medical services of the Kansas highway patrol as may be provided by law and shall perform other functions and duties pertaining to emergency medical services as may be specified by law.

(2) The superintendent shall provide such transportation deemed necessary by the superintendent or his designee for the purpose of providing security for the governor and the governor's family.
