Discussion and action on SB 436 - Fees and inspections of dams, levees, and other water obstructions.

Chairman Johnson opened the hearing on **SB 436**.

Raney Gilliland explained the technical amendments proposed by the Revisor at the April 4th meeting that would renumber certain sections of the bill. (April 4, 2002, Attachment 7) Representative Feuerborn moved to make the necessary technical changes. Seconded by Representative Dahl, the motion carried.

Representative Thimesch moved to amend SB 436 to require the Secretary of Agriculture and the Chief Engineer to evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of a watershed approach to the permitting of proposed dams and other stream obstructions with regard to clarifying the program's obligations to upstream and downstream landowners and make recommendations to the Legislature on or before January 1, 2003. Such evaluation and report shall include a review of the permit procedure; consultation with counties, cities and other stakeholders; and at least two public hearings. (Attachment 1) Representative Larkin seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Representative Thimesch moved to amend SB 436 on page 5, lines 3-18, by tripling the "Construction in Progress" fees. Seconded by Representative Larkin, the motion failed.

Representative Thimesch, seconded by Representative Larkin, moved to amend **SB 436** on page 5, lines 3-18, by doubling the "Construction in Progress" fees. The motion failed.

Chairman Johnson, on behalf of Representative Schwartz, moved to amend SB 436 on page 3, line 31, by deleting ", waste water or other liquids" Seconded by Representative Dahl, the motion failed.

Representative Ostmeyer moved to recommend SB 436, as amended, favorable for passage. Seconded by Representative Thimesch, the motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 2:22 p.m. No further meetings of the House Agriculture Committee are scheduled for the 2002 Legislative Session.

New Sec. . On or before January 1, 2003, the secretary of agriculture and the chief engineer shall evaluate the department's current policies and present a report outlining the strengths and weaknesses of a watershed approach to the permitting of proposed dams and other stream obstructions.
