The minutes of the meeting held on February 21, 2002 were approved.

### HB 2905: Kansas commission on health; creating; powers, duties and function

Chairman Mayans opened the meeting for consideration of proposed amendments to **HB 2905.**Representative Bethell explained that the recommended list of members for the Kansas Commission on Health set out on <u>Attachment 1</u> was developed from testimony and suggestions gathered in the committee hearing held on February 21, 2002 on **HB 2905**. Representative McClure noted that the list does not include seniors. The Chairman indicated that question will be addressed as the committee proceeds.

Chairman Mayans stated other recommendations from conferees had been considered and reflected in the balloon amendment that is ready for consideration (see <a href="Attachment 2">Attachment 2</a>). Sherman Parks reviewed the proposed amendments. Representative Sloan asked if pharmacists were represented on the Commission; and Mr. Parks answered it was intended that those licensed to perform medical and surgical procedures would be included. Representative Lane noted a typographical change on page 1, line 18, and suggested adding a period after the word "Kansas". He asked if the bracketed words throughout were ones to be deleted (which they were).

Representative Horst stated legislators receive many reports each year and asked if clarification is needed as to who should receive annual reports and to indicate how copies could be procured. She noted the e-Government Committee is considering a recommendation that agency reports be placed on the internet and made available to anyone through electronic means. Perhaps an agency (such as SRS) should be designated as the source to obtain such reports.

Representative DiVita suggested the words "and recommendations" be added on page 3, line 5, after the word "activities". She also recommended a specific central agency be designated the depository for the report and the agency's address be posted on the Internet so the report will be available to the public. Representative DiVita so moved, Representative McClure seconded, and the motion was adopted.

Representative Ray questioned the funding for the commission, especially the production of the annual report. It was noted that expenses of the commission would be a policy question for the legislature's consideration. Representative McClure suggested deleting the word "shall" on page 3, line 4.

Representative Sloan moved the adoption of the balloon amendments shown on Attachment 1. Representative Horst seconded the motion; and the motion was unanimously adopted.

The Chairman indicated other changes had been discussed and asked if there was further comment. Chairman Mayans related his conversation with the Speaker of the House about having specific Senate Bills referred to the committee and noted, until any bills or other projects are referred, the committee will stand at ease.

The meeting was adjourned.

#### **HOUSE BILL No. 2905**

By Committee on Kansas Futures

2-13

AN ACT relating to the public health and welfare of all Kansans: creating the Kansas commission on health: providing for the powers, duties and functions thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas

Section 1. There is hereby created the Kansas commission on health, hereinafter referred to as the "commission," to oversee the necessary changes in state laws and regulations in order for the commission to reach its goal to be able to examine and make recommendation on all aspects of health in Kansas with an emphasis on prevention, health promotion and the reduction of health disparities in the overall Kansas population.

Sec. 2. ia The commission shall be composed of 16 members. With an emphasis and consideration of the member's ethnicity, gender and geographic area, the members of the commission shall be as follows: Two members of the house of representatives, one appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and one member appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives: two members of the senate, one appointed by the president of the senate and one member of the senate appointed by the minority leader of the senate: the remaining [12] members of the commission shall be appointed by the governor who shall appoint these members from the following categories: Two/members/representing large self-insured employers, two members representing the medical community one member representing the health care commission, one member representing small business, one member representing a local health department, one member representing organized labor, one member who is a consumer of health care, one member representing a major insurance company, one member representing public health academia and one member representing kindergarten to 12th grade education. The secretary of health and environment, the secretary of social and rehabilitation services and the secretary of aging shall be advisors to the commission. L

(b) Any person who is appointed to the commission shall serve until July 1, 2006. After that date, the appointing authority shall appoint members to the commission to serve until July 1, 2007. Members may be reappointed. In order to be a member of the commission, each member

The commission shall make a determination of what should be the appropriate levels and delivery of services in Kansas, transcending the scope of practice of all providers of healthcare. A focus on both mental and physical health is to be included. The underserved areas of Kansas and the total aspect of the delivery of healthcare in Kansas, including telemedicine shall also be reviewed. Finally, the commission shall place

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Since every state agency of Kansas has a stake in the health of all Kansans, the commission may call upon, request and recover information from any state agency.

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must continue to maintain such member's status from the category from which such person was appointed. If a member of the commission resigns, no longer resides in the state of Kansas, is no longer qualified to represent the category from which such member was appointed, dies, or, as it pertains to each of the four legislative members of the commission, is no longer an elected or appointed member of the Kansas legislature, then in each situation the appointing authority shall fill the vacancy on the commission, and the person so appointed shall serve the remaining term of that party.

- (c) A quorum of the commission shall be nine. All action of the commission may be taken by a majority of those present when there is a quorum. The chairperson and the vice-chairperson shall be elected from the 16 members of the commission. The vice-chairperson shall exercise all the powers of the chairperson in the absence of the chairperson. The commission may appoint advisory subcommittees as it deems appropriate. All subcommittees shall meet and report at the direction of the commission. All meetings shall be subject to the Kansas open meetings act.
- (d) Funding of operations of the commission shall be from moneys received from grants and contributions made from foundations, nonprofit organizations and other entities or persons who have common goals of the commission. All officers and employees of the state, and the departments of health and environment, social and rehabilitation services, and aging shall pursue grants and contributions to fund the activities of the commission.
- (e) The Kansas commission on health shall meet on call of the chairperson. All such meetings shall be held in Topeka unless authorized to be held in a different place by the commission.
- (f) The commission shall work cooperatively with all relevant state and federal agencies, health care providers, payors and consumer groups in the development of [an] integrated health [plan] for all Kansans. The commission shall accomplish this by identifying measurable health goals and treatment based upon evidence the commission gathers. The commission shall have the power to recommend priorities to state agencies with regard to health spending.
- Sec. 3. (a) From moneys received by the commission, the commission shall employ an executive secretary who shall receive compensation as approved by the commission. The executive secretary shall act as staff to the commission and its subcommittees and shall serve as liaison with state agencies and the office of the governor.
- (b) All officers and employees of the state of Kansas shall provide such information and assistance as may be deemed necessary by the commission Administrative support for the commission shall be provided by the division of legislative administrative services. Other staff assistance

Interactive electronic meetings may also be used by the commission to expand involvement throughout the state.

The executive secretary and the commission may use office space provided by the state of Kansas or any philanthropic organization. The commission shall make the final decision as to where the commission's office will be located.
