MINUTES OF THE HOUSE REDISTRICTING COMMITTEE.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Michael R. O'Neal at 7:00 a..m. on February 13, 2002 in Room 313-S of the Capitol.

HB 3012 - Congressional Redistricting

Chairman O'Neal drew the committee's attention to HR Congress 4 map (<u>Attachment 1</u>) which addresses concerns raised at the March 12, 2002 meeting. The map is essentially the Congress 1 map with the third district from the Caucus J map. The committee has essentially seen everything that is being proposed in HR Congress 4 map.

Duane Simpson added that since there were already a couple of split VTD in Caucus J the proposed map splits a VTD in northeast Harvey county and one Lawrence to bring the deviation numbers down.

Representative Findley expressed appreciation for the work done on the proposed map but was still concerned with the split of Lawrence and North Newton. <u>He made the motion to substitute Congressional 1 map for **HB 3012**. Representative Crow seconded the motion.</u>

Chairman O'Neal expressed his concerns with Reno County being placed back into the 4th District in Congressional 1. This is something that the community is not interested in. The plan also splits six counties.

The motion failed 8-10.

Representative Krehbiel made the motion to substitute Caucus J Kingman TR map for **HB 3012.** Representative Wilson seconded the motion. The motion failed.

Representative Nichols provided the committee with the Meadowlark map (<u>Attachment 2</u>). He explained that the plan would: address the Chairman's concerns about placing Reno County into the 4th district, by it keeping it in the 1st; leave the 2nd & 3rd districts intact; addresses the Kingman/Harvey County issues and the concerns about keeping the tri-county area together; and places all of Wyandotte, northern Johnson County and all the city of Lawrence in the 3rd district.

Representative Nichols made the motion to substitute Meadowlark map for **HB 3012.** Representative Findley seconded the motion.

Representative Crow supported the motion because it keeps cities together.

Representative Ballou asked if Representative Nichols considered placing Johnson County totally in the 3^{rd} district with Lawrence and placing all of Wyandotte County in the 2^{nd} .

While Representative Nichols understood the unique concerns with the number of voters in Johnson County, he reminded the committee that Wyandotte County is it's own political subdivision, and because it's a Unified Government, Wyandotte County it cannot be split.

Chairman O'Neal stated that this was a much better product than Congressional 1 but he was also concerned with the Johnson County split.

The motion failed 9-12.

Representative Aurand expressed his support for Congress 3 because the core districts remain very close to the current Congressional Districts; it's compact; keeps the forts together; and keeps Ft. Riley and Junction City together.

<u>Representative Neufeld made the motion to amend Congress 1 with the 4th district from HR Congress 4 map.</u>
<u>Representative Aurand seconded the motion.</u>

Representative Nichols commented that he thought that all maps had to go through technical review before they were offered. Chairman O'Neal explained that both maps, Congress 1 & Congress 4 had gone through technical review and that the Neufeld amendment would simply be a swap of Kingman and Harvey Counties.

Some members expressed their concern about splitting Lawrence down Massachusetts street. Representative Neufeld stated that the proposed map would be low in deviation and reminded members that the courts split a city down main street, *ie.*, Peabody, in the last redistricting process.

The motion failed.


Representative Vickrey made the motion to substitute HR Congress 4 in **HB 3012**. Representative Howell seconded the motion. The motion carried 12-9.

Representative Wilson made the motion to amend HR Congress 4, with the 4th district being taken from Meadowlark. The motion died for lack of a second.


Representative Mays made the motion to report **Substitute HB 3012** favorably for passage. Representative Ballou seconded the motion. The motion carried 9-12.

The committee meeting adjourned at 8:00 a.m.






Black lines show boundaries of existing 1992 Congressional Districts.






Black lines show boundaries of existing 1992 Congressional Districts.











Meadowlark Detail of Douglas County









Meadowlark Detail of Johnson County
