## MINUTES OF THE SENATE ASSESSMENT AND TAXATION COMMITTEE.

Continued discussion on the Budget Solutions Working Group recommendations and the budget plan submitted by Senator Donovan.

Senator Corbin noted that the Senate Ways and Means Committee passed a budget proposal out of committee late yesterday. He commented that approximately \$320 million in new tax revenue is needed, and Senator Donovan's plan matches that amount. Staff had distributed a copy of a revision of Senator Donovan's plan with a new vehicle registration proposal. (Attachment 1) He went on to say that he would prefer that the Committee recommend passage of a budget proposal on April 5 unless some members feel more time is needed to work on a proposal.

He noted that the Budget Solutions Working Group discussed the possibility of the inclusion of Class C inheritance tax in a revenue proposal and that inclusion of Class C would raise an additional \$20 million. He pointed out that Class C is not part of Senator Donovan's proposal. In addition, he noted that the working group discussed the possibility of higher increases in the cigarette tax than in Senator Donovan's plan.

Senator Lee asked if the \$320 million figure quoted by Senator Corbin takes into consideration what is needed to replenish the highway program funding. Staff commented that Senator Donovan's proposal to increase motor fuel taxes and vehicle registration fees will replace some but not all of the highway program funding.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:55 p.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for April 5, 2002, at 8:30 a.m.
