1) Non-Hispanic Black population ranges are established by the single race Black population category at the low end and the sum of all multirace datagories that include non-Hispanic Black at the high end. Among existing Senate districts, District 4 has the highest percentage non-Hispanic Black population at 52.3% - 53.5%. The corresponding voting age population (18 years of age and older) of that district ranges from 50.0% - 50.8%.

Among existing districts, Senate District 39 has the highest Hispanic population at 36.0%. The corresponding voting age population in that district is 30.5%.

- 2) For each proposed district, one can identify a primary source district, that is, the district from which the largest block of population comes. That primary source district may not always have the same district number as the new district.
- 3) The existing Senate districts split 21 counties. When enacted, the 1992 Senate districts split 7 VTDs. Those split VTDs were in Shawnee (5), Sedgwick (1), and Sumner (1) counties.
- 4) The Roeck measure is an area-based measure that compares each district to a circle, which is considered to be the most compact shape possible. For each district, the Roeck test computes the ratio of the area of the district to the area of the minimum enclosing circle for the district. The measure is always between 0 and 1, with 1 being the most compact. The Roeck test computes one number for each district and the minimum, maximum, mean, and standard deviation for the plan. For the current Senate districts (1992) the minimum is 0.31 and the
