Introduction of bills

Senator Steineger requested introduction of a bill which would require the Division of Vehicles issue notices of expiration/renewal dates on drivers licenses. This is current practice, but is not required by law. Senator Gooch moved to introduce the bill. Senator Schodorf seconded the motion. Motion carried.

On behalf of the Department, Sheila Walker, Director, Division of Vehicles, Kansas Department of Revenue, requested introduction of a bill to allow boat trailers to be sold or transferred on a notarized bill of sale (<u>Attachment 1</u>). <u>Senator Goodwin moved to introduce the bill. Senator Lyon seconded the motion. Motion carried</u>.

Ms. Walker further requested an additional cleanup measure which would do two things. First, waive the \$.50 reflectorized plate fee on disabled veteran plate, making it truly free of cost to disabled veterans. Second, add accredited private colleges to the list of educational institutions that can get specialty license plates for their schools. Such schools used to be on the eligible list but were inadvertently left off during a recent session (Attachment 2). Senator Schodorf moved to introduce such a bill. Senator Salmans seconded the motion. Motion carried.

SB 410: RE Division of Vehicles; concerning certain records

Staff briefly reviewed information provided in the January 29, 2002 hearing on **SB 410**. Basically, it allows Division records to be opened more easily if there is a court order. On a normal basis this material, otherwise, would not be available. Ms. Walker also provided information regarding entities currently eligible to obtain records and an explanation of the administrative costs (<u>Attachment 3</u>). Members discussed requested information. <u>Senator Goodwin moved **SB 410** be passed. Senator Schodorf seconded the motion. Motion carried.</u>

Approval of minutes

Senator Salmans moved to approve minutes of January 29 and January 31, 2002 meetings. Senator Lyon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 9:15 a.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for February 6, 2002.

SUBJECT:

Kansas Division of Vehicles' Legislative Proposal on Titling Trailers

The Kansas Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) respectfully requests introduction of a bill that would allow boat trailers to be sold or transferred on a notarized bill of sale, provided that a Kansas title for the trailer has not previously been issued. A motor vehicle inspection, conducted by the Kansas Highway Patrol, would be required.

When owners who maintain their boats on private property decide to sell their boat trailers, and they do not have the proper documents, they currently either go to court to file a "quiet title" action or they sell their boat trailers in other states where it is permissible to transfer ownership on a notarized bill of sale.

This measure is designed to improve customer service and convenience for the citizens of Kansas, as well as the boating industry.

The Division of Vehicles appreciates your considering this bill introduction.

Disabled Veteran and Educational Institution Cleanup Bill

The Kansas Division of Vehicles would appreciate if the Senate Transportation Committee could carry a cleanup measure on our behalf. This bill would do two things:

Disabled Veterans

Waive the \$.50 reflectorized plate fee on the disabled veteran plate. making it truly "free" to the disabled veteran. The fiscal impact on the state highway fund would be minimal (an estimated \$605 over the fiveyear cycle of the plate).

Ed Institutions

Amend K.S.A. 8-1,142 to include accredited schools (such as Baker University, Bethany College, Bethel College, and others) to the list of educational institutions that can get specialty license plates for their schools. These accredited schools used to be on the eligible list, but were inadvertently excluded during a recent legislative session.

Attached is the list of entities that are currently eligible to obtain motor vehicle records under the federal Driver's Privacy Protection Act. See the complete list of "Exception codes..." (A - M).

The Department's Open Records Custodian has also prepared a memo (attached), explaining the administrative costs that would be passed on to other state and federal agencies in exchange for motor vehicle records under this bill. There currently are no such cooperative measures in the law. We are often told that the fees outlined by current statute are cost-prohibitive to other agencies.

Administrative Costs

In Senate Bill No. 410 we are proposing to allow motor vehicle records, pursuant to a contract, to be provided to state and federal agencies at administrative cost. The administrative costs associated with each request will vary greatly depending on what the request is for, how the information will be submitted to KDOR, what information the other agency wants in return and in what format the information will be provided.

Having said that let me give an example of what the charges would be using a recent request that I received. In this situation the requesting party would be providing the department with approximately 200 to 300 names and their Date of Birth. In return they want the height and weight information for each driver. This request will take an estimated four (4) hours of programming, and approximately one (1) hour of my time. At \$60.00 per hour of programming time and \$25.00 per hour for my time the total administrative cost for this project would be \$265.00.
