Dear Senator Morris:

This is to advise the Committee of SRS's position with regard to the payments authorized in Sections 5(a) and (b) of Senate Bill No. 517.

SRS presented testimony in opposition to the claims of Scott and Susan House and Clair and Shirley Gordon when the Joint Committee on Special Claims held hearings in December 14. 2001.

We would ask the Committee consider the public policy implications of awarding claims based on the court's resolution of a disagreement over the best interests of a particular child. Is it appropriate to award litigants who ultimately prevail? If so, should this be dependent upon individual claims to the joint committee or routinely provided to all prevailing parties in every child in need of care action?

Agency staff and law enforcement are required by law to receive and investigate allegations of abuse and neglect of children. Evidence gathered is provided to the prosecutor. The prosecutor independently determines whether or not to file a petition. Only a judge may order out of home placement and custody to the Secretary. Information continues to be gathered and provided to the court. Much like criminal prosecutions and civil litigation, the court ultimately must make a decision. In most cases, the child returns to parental custody.

The court is required to appoint counsel for the child and, when the parent is indigent, the parent. While grandparents are automatically parties, they are not entitled to court appointed attorneys. Currently the county is responsible for the cost of appointed counsel representing the child and for indigent parents. When the final decision is to return the child to the custody of parents, should the cost of retained counsel for all parties be reimbursed? This, of course, is not the practice in other civil litigation or in criminal prosecutions.

Sec. Agency Est./Governor's Recommendation

The School for the Blind requests a total of \$4,941,743 for agency operating expenditures in FY 2003, of which \$4,572,995 is from the State General Fund. The total includes \$38,000 from the State General Fund for an enhancement (parity salary increases for teachers) and \$59,435 from the State Institutions Building Fund for capital improvements (rehabilitation and repair projects).

The Governor recommends expenditures of \$4,864,484, of which \$4,434,536 is from the State General Fund. The recommendation is a reduction of \$136,694 from the request and includes the requested funding for capital improvements (\$59,435). The Governor does not recommend additional funding for teacher parity salary increases.

Senate Subcommittee Recommendations

The Senate Subcommittee concurs with the recommendations of the Governor, with the following exception:

The Subcommittee observes that, while the School for the Blind is not part of the state system of unified school districts, it is a public institution that competes with school districts for teachers. For that reason, the Subcommittee recommends that, if enhanced funding is recommended for public school districts, the same percentage increase should be

appropriated to the School for the Blind so that it may remain competitive with public schools in the same job market.

Agency Req./Governor's Recommendation

The School for the Deaf requests a total of \$8,077,123 for operating expenditures, of which \$7,747,334 is from the State General Fund, including \$414,143 for enhancements. Requested enhancements consist of decreased shrinkage (\$109,923), parity increases fo teachers (\$83,375), a Technology Specialist position (\$60,845), and 5.0 FTE positions to begin a new program for multi-disabled deaf students (\$160,000). In addition, the School requests capital improvements projects totaling \$1,023,512 from the State Institutions Building Fund.

The Governor recommends operating expenditures of \$7,498,040, of which \$7,168,251 is from the State General Fund. The amount from the State General Fund is \$98,107 less than in the current year and is a reduction of \$579,083 from the request. The Governor does not recommend any of the operating budget enhancements. Of the requested \$1,023,512 for capital improvements, the Governor recommends \$492,792.

Senate Subcommittee Recommendations

The Senate Subcommittee concurs with the recommendations of the Governor, with the following exceptions:

- Concur with the recommendations of the Senate Subcommittee on Capital Improvements and add \$139,885 from the State Institutions Building Fund to replace roofs on the Parks-Bilger Vocational Building (\$70,035) and the Taylor Gym (\$69,850).
- The Subcommittee observes that, while the School for the Deaf is not part of the state system of unified school districts, it is a public institution that competes with school districts for teachers. For that reason, the Subcommittee recommends that, if enhanced funding is recommended for public school districts, the same percentage increase should be appropriated to the School for the Deaf so that it may remain competitive with public schools in the same job market.

Agency Est./Governor's Recommendation

The Historical Society estimates expenditures of \$8,432,782 in FY 2002. Included in the total is \$100,000 from the State General Fund requested as a supplemental appropriation to meet a projected shortfall in salaries. (Since submitting its budget, the shortfall has been revised downward to between \$60,000 and \$70,000.) Although the agency is holding some vacant positions open six months to a year, it still is experiencing a shortfall of between \$3,000 and \$4,000 on each payroll. The estimate for FY 2002 also includes requested expenditure limitation increases of \$10,000 on expenditures from the Microfilm Fees Fund for a project to copy negatives from the master microfilm archives and an increase of \$14,217 from the Heritage Trust Fund for operating expenditures.

The Governor recommends expenditures of \$8,515,762, which includes requested increases in expenditures limitations on the Microfilm Fees Fund and the Heritage Trust Fund. The Governor does not approve a supplemental appropriation for salaries.

Senate Subcommittee Recommendation

The Senate Subcommittee concurs with the recommendations of the Governor.

Agency Req./Governor's Recommendation

For FY 2003, the Historical Society requests a total of \$8,606,639 for state operating expenditures. The amount includes \$1,347,377 for enhancements, of which \$778,869 is for capital improvements.

The Governor recommends a total of \$8,294,670 for state operations, of which \$6,161,960 is from the State General Fund. The only capital improvement recommended by the Governor is \$221,092 in federal funds for restoration of the William Allan White Home.

Senate Subcommittee Recommendations

The Senate Subcommittee concurs with recommendation of the Governor, with the following exceptions:

- Add \$30,000 from the State General Fund to reduce shrinkage on salaries in FY 2003 from 11.2 percent to 10.7 percent, which is the rate for FY 2002. Even the lower rate of 10.7 percent, which is being forced in order to stay within available resources, is causing a shortfall of between \$3,000 and \$4,000 each payroll period, has resulted in a hiring freeze of between six months to a year on vacant positions, and could cause a furlough of employees by the end of the year. Despite this, the Subcommittee believes the 10.7 percent rate is preferable to the higher rate of 11.2 percent.
- Add \$50,000 from the State General Fund for the Kansas Territorial Sesquicentennial Commission. The 2001 Legislature enacted legislation (HB 2532) to create the Kansas Territorial Sesquicentennial Commission consisting of nine members appointed by the Governor. The legislation also creates a 31-member advisory board to the Commission comprised of five ex officio state agency representatives, 15 appointees of the Governor, eight appointees of the Legislature, and three other appointees. The Commission is charged with making recommendations to the Governor by July 1, 2002, regarding the Sesquicentennial.

The Subcommittee considers commemoration in 2004 of the anniversary of Kansas becoming a territory a milestone in our state's history and believes the Legislature should honor its commitment to fund a commission it created.

- Add \$75,000 from the State General Fund for emergency repairs for construction and other costs necessary to keep building components and systems in good working order. Historical Society officials cannot recall a year in which no funding has been made available for repairs. The Subcommittee believes it is regrettable enough when any public building is damaged, but, in the case of the Historical Society, most of its facilities are part of the state's heritage and damage to some of them literally is irreparable.
- The Historical Society contracts with the Highway Patrol for to provide security at the Kansas History Center. The cost of the contract has increased each year and one reason is that, whatever salary increase members of the Highway Patrol receive, the same increase has to be given to the Highway Patrol security officers at the History Center. This increase, over which the Historical Society has no control, causes difficulty because even after the Historical Society negotiates a contract, more money has to be added for salaries. To address the situation, the Subcommittee recommends that whatever salary increase is approved by the 2002 Legislature for members of the Highway Patrol, the same increase should be added to the Historical Society's budget in the Omnibus Bill in order to increase the salaries of the officers who are assigned to the Kansas History Center.
- Recommend that those subcommittees that consider appropriations from the Economic Developments Initiatives Fund (EDIF) consider appropriating a grant

of \$50,000 to the Kansas Humanities Council for the "Kansas Chautauqua," a commemoration of the 150th anniversary of Kansas becoming a territory. Events will take place in Junction City, Colby, Fort Scott, and Lawrence. The state appropriation would be used to hire scholars, develop educational materials, market the event, and develop ancillary programs. It would be used to leverage private grants in order to pay for the commemorative activities, which are expected to total \$150,000.

The agency estimates \$2,151,727 (16,55,236 SGF) which is an increase of \$61,399 (2.9 percent) from the FY 2001 approved budget. The estimate includes \$402,959 for salaries and wages; \$116,807 for contractual services; \$4,748 for commodities; \$5,264 for capital outlay; \$1,590,949 for aid to local units; and \$31,000 for other assistance.

The Governor concurs with the agency's estimate.

Agency Request/Governor's Recommendation

The agency requests \$2,552,224 (\$2,088,334 SGF) for FY 2003 which is an increase of \$400,497 (18.6 percent) from the FY 2002 estimate. The request includes: \$430,132 for salaries and wages; \$219,577 for contractual services; \$4,748 for commodities; \$1,866,767 for aid to local units; and \$31,000 for other assistance. The request includes enhancements totaling \$430,723.

The Governor recommends \$2,059,829 (\$1,591,305 SGF) for FY 2003 which is a decrease of \$91,898 (4.3 percent) from the FY 2002 recommendation. The recommendation includes: \$412,536 for salaries and wages; \$116,807 for contractual services; \$4,748 for commodities; \$1,494,738 for aid to local units; and \$31,000 for other assistance. The Governor does not recommend the enhancements. The Governor does recommend a reduction package of \$66,304 from State General Fund which is a 4.0 percent reduction of to aid to local units and aid to qualified state organizations.

Senate Subcommittee Recommendation

The Senate Subcommittee concurs with the Governor's recommendations with the following adjustments:

1. The Subcommittee recommends the restoration of the 4.0 percent package (\$66,304 from the State General Fund). This reduction would reduce funding for aid to local units and aid to qualified state organizations. According to the agency, every dollar of reduction for aid to local units from the State General Fund results in a \$19 loss in arts programming funding.

Agency Request/Governor's Recommendation

The agency requests FY 2003 expenditures of \$9,633,745 which is an increase of \$2,630,727 (37.6 percent) from the FY 2002 agency request. The request includes: \$1,112,717 for salaries and wages; \$981,749 for contractual services; \$179,599 for commodities; \$92,989 for capital outlay; \$6,873,528 for aid to local units; and \$393,163 for other assistance. The request includes enhancement packages of \$2,620,982 SGF including \$2,570,982 for state aid to local libraries and \$50,000 for research and information services.

The Governor recommends FY 2003 expenditures of \$6,814,981 which is a decrease of \$188,037 (2.7 percent) from the FY 2002 revised recommendation. The request includes: \$1,131,469 for salaries and wages; \$981,749 for contractual services; \$65,761 for commodities; \$92,989 for capital outlay; \$4,149,850 for aid to local units; and \$393,163 for other assistance. The Governor does not recommend the enhancement packages. The Governor recommends reduction packages of \$216,534 from the State General Fund including a 4.0 percent reduction of other operating expenditures totaling \$63,838 and a 4.0 percent reduction in aid to local libraries totaling \$152,696.

The Senate Subcommittee Recommendation

The Senate Subcommittee concurs with the Governor's recommendation with the following adjustments:

- 1. The Subcommittee recommends the restoration of the 4.0 percent reduction in aid to local libraries totaling \$152,696 from the State General Fund. The reduction would reduce the capability of libraries to provide hours of services, information technology, and other public services.
- 2. The State Library, during its presentation to the Subcommittee offered the suggestion of a surcharge on Kansas Turnpike traffic as an alternative funding source for state aid to local libraries. Although the Subcommittee does not recommend the introduction of any legislation, the Subcommittee feels the matter deserves further consideration, as it would be one method to shift the current \$3.8 million in state aid from the State General Fund to an alternative source of revenue. Attached is a table indicating the agency's estimate of the amount of revenue turnpike traffic could generate for state aid to local libraries.
