## MORNING SESSION 9:00 A.M.

Representative Clark Shultz moved that the Committee introduce legislation to change the date of final state payment to school districts to the first July. The motion was seconded by Representative McLeland. Motion carried.

The Chair recognized J. G. Scott, Legislative Research Department, to give the Committee an update on any budget progress made by the House, as well as progress from the Senate, compared to the Governor's recommendations, as well as House Adjustments to the Governor's Recommendation for FY 2003 and FY 2004 (Attachment 1).

## <u>Discussion and Action on HB 2444–Appropriations for FY 2003, FY 2004, and FY 2005 for state agencies and biennially-budgeted agencies</u>

Representative Bethell moved to amend the FY 2004 Children's Initiatives Fund budget by removing \$1 million from Smart Start Kansas - Children's Cabinet and adding \$300,000 to the Infants and Toddlers Program for a total of \$800,000 and adding \$700,000 to Juvenile Justice Authority's (JJA) Juvenile Prevention Program Grants so that the Commissioner of Juvenile Justice can purchase beds from foster care contractors to allow for flexibility to meet the purposes of the program grants in that area (Attachment 2). The motion was seconded by Representative Landwehr. Motion carried.

Representative Landwehr moved to delete the funding of the FY 2004 Ombudsman of Corrections budget in the amount of \$169,745 from the State General Fund and \$15,000 All Other Funds, for a total of \$184,745 (Page 4 of the House Adjustments to the Governor's Recommendations—Attachment 1), The motion was seconded by Representative Bethell. The motion carried.

Representative Feuerborn moved to add funding of \$180,000 to fund the Visitor Centers at the four major correctional centers. The motion was seconded by Representative Minor. The motion failed.

Representative Merrick moved to add a proviso to prevent KUMC from transferring control of the Landon Center on Aging to the Department of Neurology; "No expenditures may be made from any funds appropriated to the above agency for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2003, and June 30, 2004, for the purpose of transferring control of any physical, fiscal or operational assets currently under the control of the Theo and Alfred Landon Geriatric Center on Aging to any other center, program or division of the University of Kansas Medical Center" (Attachment 3). The motion was seconded by Representative Gatewood. The motion carried.

Representative McCreary moved to add a proviso to disallow any expenditures from the Department of Health and Environment for FY 2003, FY 2004 and FY 2005 for the purpose of issuing any permits for landfills within five miles of any surface water in Kansas (Attachment 4). The motion was seconded by Representative Shriver.

With the permission of the second, Representative McCreary amended his motion by striking line 8 and line 9 of the proviso and replacing with "of any surface water in Harper County which contains exceptional state water as defined by Kansas Administrative Regulation No. 28-16-28(b) and amendments thereto." The motion failed.

Representative Light moved to direct the \$32,906 rent savings from unused building space in the Attorney General's budget, to the budget of the Kansas Bureau of Investigation. The motion was seconded by Representative Minor. The motion carried.

A memo from the Legislative Research Department was distributed to the Committee which explains the amount of space not being used by the Attorney General and the amount of savings from the rent (Attachment 5).

Representative Landwehr moved to add a proviso regarding "Dispense as Written" to the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services (Attachment 6). The motion was seconded by Representative Bethell. The motion carried.

A memo from the Social and Rehabilitation Services, which opposes the "Dispense as Written" proviso, was distributed to the Committee (Attachment 7).

Representative Nichols moved to lapse the Governor's recommendation of a \$1,715,645 adjustment to the State Economic Development Initiatives Fund's (EDIF) Kansas Technology Enterprise Corporation (KTEC) FY 2003 budget and give the Director of the Budget, the authority to lapse this amount over the FY 2003 and FY 2004 budgets; \$110,000 would be appropriated to Department of Human Resources for the Neighborhood Improvement and Youth Employment Act and \$1,605,645 returned to the State General Fund (SGF). The motion was seconded by Representative Klein. The motion carried. Representative Gatewood and Representative Howell asked to be recorded as voting "no."

Representative Landwehr moved to amend **HB 2444** by adding \$300,000 to the FY 2004 Department of Health and Environment (DHE) budget (Attachment 9). The motion was seconded by Representative Howell. Division was called for. The motion carried.

Representative Nichols moved to adopt an amendment to clarify that the lapse money (\$1,715,645) taken from KTEC's budget would not come from the Centers for Excellence budget. The motion was seconded by Representative Gatewood. The motion carried.

Representative Campbell moved to amend the Budget Committee's report to include a request to have the Department of Transportation (DOT) report back to the Committee, prior to Omnibus, on the savings realized by using asphalt as opposed to concrete in DOT projects. The motion was seconded by Representative Osborne. The motion carried.

Representative Landwehr moved to adopt a proviso to prohibit DHE from making any expenditures from the SGF or any special revenue funds for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2003, and June 30, 2004, for the licensure requirements for after-school programs (Attachment 10). The motion was seconded by Representative Pottorff. The motion carried.

Representative Landwehr moved to adopt a proviso to allow hospitality expenditures for the Children's Cabinet Fund not to exceed \$1,500 (Attachment 11). The motion was seconded by Representative Nichols. The motion carried.

Because the 1.5% pay increase was omitted from the budget, the Chair explained that the Committee needed to give direction as to how it should be handled. The Committee asked to have the opportunity to visit with staff of the Division of the Budget before making a decision.

Representative Shultz moved to allow the Fiscal staff of the Legislative Research Department and Office of the Revisor of Statutes to make any technical adjustments as necessary to the budget documents. The motion was seconded by Representative Nichols. The motion carried.

The meeting was recessed and will reconvene at 1:30 p.m.

### **AFTERNOON SESSION**

Representative Minor moved to introduce legislation allowing state agencies and political subdivisions to sell naming rights. The motion was seconded by Representative Feuerborn. The motion carried.

Representative Light moved to introduce legislation allowing the Department of Corrections to donate land to the City of Hutchinson. The motion was seconded by Representative Pottorff. The motion carried.

<u>Continued Discussion and Action on HB 2444–Appropriations for FY 2003, FY 2004 and FY 2005 for state agencies and biennially-budgeted agencies.</u>

Representative Shultz moved to make funding available for thirty students in the Medical Student Loan Program at the University of Kansas Medical Center, from existing funds. The motion was seconded by Representative McLeland. The motion carried.

Representative Pottorff moved to adopt a proviso concerning Kansas, Inc.; To not make the transfer of any unencumbered balance from the operations account of the State Economic Development Initiatives Fund to the SGF (Attachment 12). The motion was seconded by Representative Shriver. Motion carried.

The Chair recognized Julian Efird, Legislative Research Department, who informed the Committee that there is a conflict in the Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) budget as they have historically been assigned to the Department of Revenue by statute. The Governor's report recommends moving ABC to the Kansas Highway Patrol (KHP) and shows their budget within the KHP budget to be funded from the State Highway Fund transfer to KHP. No legislation has been introduced to transfer the Alcoholic Beverage Control unit to the Kansas Highway Patrol.

Representative Klein moved to defer to Omnibus, the entire budget for Alcohol Beverage Control and leave it under the Department of Revenue. The motion was seconded by Representative Light. The motion carried.

Representative Pottorff moved to adopt an amendment concerning expenditures of the Department of Commerce and Housing (Attachment 13). Motion was seconded by Representative Howell. Motion carried.

Representative Nichols moved to approve the introduction a bill to address the special education and medicaid funding issue concerning the Kansas School for the Deaf. The motion was seconded by Representative Campbell. Motion carried.

After discussion, the Committee took no action on the Kansas Highway Patrol pay increase.

Representative Schwartz moved to adopt a proviso concerning the appropriation of moneys in the Interstate Water Litigation Fund (Attachment 14). The motion was seconded by Representative Osborne. Motion carried.

Representative Henry moved to amend the budget by dedicating \$1.3 million from the KTEC budget; dedicating \$400,000 to the Senior Care Act, \$400,000 to the Developmentally Disabled State Aid Grants Program, \$400,000 to the Kansas Mental Health Grant Program, and \$100,000 to the Prison Fellowship Program at Ellsworth Correctional Facility. The motion was seconded by Representative Feuerborn. Motion carried.

The Chair recognized Louis Chabira, Assistant Director, Division of the Budget, who responded to questions from the Committee on the proposed pay plan. Mr. Chabira explained that the Governor's recommendation is to develop the pay plan through the Finance Council; he also noted that there is no money appropriated in **HB 2444** regarding pay increases in the legislative or judiciary branches.

The meeting was recessed for Republican and Democrat Caucuses and reconvened at 2:45 p.m.

Representative Landwehr moved to request the General Govt & Commerce Budget Committee to review, before Omnibus, a recommendation made by the Senate Ways and Means to transfer \$300,000 from the Horse Fair Racing Benefit Fund, which is funded from one-third of the parimutuel tax for simulcast races, to the State General Fund to fund the Eureka and Anthony operating grants in the summer of 2004; and request the Budget Committee to make a recommendation to the Committee about a policy change (Attachment 15). The motion was seconded by Representative McLeland. Motion carried.

The Committee requested the Public Safety Budget Committee study the feasibility of converting the Kansas Juvenile Correctional Complex to an adult drug treatment facility. Representative Light indicated the issue

would be on the agenda at in the next meeting of the Public Safety Budget Committee.

Representative Landwehr moved to adopt a proviso concerning the proposed hospital closure. The motion was withdrawn.

Representative Klein moved to adopt a proviso concerning the hospital closure issue in the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services FY 2004 budget (Attachment 16) and to make technical adjustments to the proviso. (1) Line 8 - change 14 members to 9; change 10 members to 5 members; (2) (3) Page 3, Line 3 - insert "services and program" before the word "policies" (4) Page 3, Line 18, delete the words "eight members of". The motion was seconded by Representative Landwehr. Motion carried. Representative Nichols and Representative Howell asked to be recorded as "no" votes.

Representative Bethel moved to adopt a proviso directing the Secretary of Aging to implement a FY 2000 base-year model of reimbursement for nursing facilities beginning in FY 2004 (Attachment 17). The motion was seconded by Representative Landwehr. Motion carried.

Representative Shultz moved to delete \$1,076,232 from the FY 2003 Department of Education budget and add this amount to Moundridge USD 423; delete \$4,467,946 from the FY 2004 Department of Education budget and add this amount to Moundridge USD 423 to fund their Charter School. The motion was seconded by Representative Landwehr.

This amount of money is being withheld by the Department of Education from the Moundridge School District Charter School, because they reportedly were not following the guidelines of the Department of Education for charter schools. The funds to replace these funds in the Moundridge School District would come from the Department of Education's General State Aid appropriations.

With the approval of the Chair, Representative Nichols requested division of the motion into two separate motions:

Part A: The funding of the FY2003 Moundridge USD 423 Charter School from the FY 2003 Department of Education budget. Motion failed. Representative Landwehr asked to be recorded as a "yes" vote.

Part B: The funding of the FY 2004 Moundridge USD 423 Charter School. The motion was withdrawn.

Representative Shultz moved to revisit the FY 2003 and FY 2004 Moundridge USD 423 issue during Omnibus. The motion was seconded by Representative Nichols. Motion carried.

Representative Gatewood moved to use the \$35,000 deleted from the budget of the Ombudsman of Corrections budget to the Kansas Animal Health Department for the salary of an animal control officer. The motion was seconded by Representative Schwartz. Division was requested and the motion failed.

Jim Wilson, Revisor of Statutes' Office, advised the Committee that Section 130, Page 217 of **HB 2444** concerning expenditures of the Department of Human Resources is not among the matters permitted to be included within an appropriation act, under the Kansas Constitution and current case law advised the Committee the section may be unconstitutional.

Representative Howell moved to delete Section 130, Page 217 of **HB 2444** and introduce a bill by the Committee to cover the unemployment issue. The motion was seconded by Representative Pottorff. Division was requested; The motion carried. Representatives Klein, Henry, Minor, Shriver, Feuerborn, Nichols and Gatewood asked to be recorded as voting "no".

Representative Newton moved that any receipts over expenditures be dedicated to the ending balance or surpluses of the State budget. The motion was seconded by Representative Campbell. With permission from the second, the motion was withdrawn.

Representative Campbell moved to remove the proposed 1.5% pay increases for state employees from the

budget. The motion was seconded by Representative Light. Division was requested. The motion carried. The vote will be recorded as fourteen "yes" votes and seven "no" votes. Representatives Gatewood, Feuerborn, Nichols, Minor, Shriver, Henry and Klein asked to be reported as voting "no".

The Committee discussed funding for the Death and Disability within KPERS and asked to return to this issue at a later date.

Representative Landwehr moved to report HB 2444 as amended favorably for passage. The motion was seconded by Representative Shultz. Motion carried.

The Chair thanked the Committee for their hard and diligent work on HB 2444.

The Meeting was adjourned at 5:15 p.m. The next meeting will be March 21, 2003 at 9:00 a.m.

Re: Rent in the Attorney General's Budget

The \$32,906 that is being paid for 2,210 square feet of office space formerly used for victims rights programs would be from the **State General Fund** in FY 2004. While the programs were in the Attorney General's Office, rent for the space they occupied was paid from federal funds, but once the programs were transferred to the Governor's Office, federal funding no longer is available and rent has to be paid from the State General Fund.

To put the payments in perspective, a total of \$489,544 is budgeted for rent in FY 2004, of which \$300,969 (61.5 percent) is from the State General Fund. The proposal to shift \$32,906 from the Attorney General's budget to the KBI would reduce the portion of rent paid from the State General Fund to \$268,063.

Dear Appropriations Committee Members:

SRS is opposed to any actions which would limit the state's ability to contain the pharmaceutical costs within the Kansas Medicaid program. Medicaid expenditures are one of the fastest growing parts of the state budget in Kansas and in nearly every other state. According to a 2001 "Medicaid Survival Kit" produced by the National Conference of State Legislatures, "Unfortunately, there are no easy answers and no 'quick fixes' to the problem of health care financing for the poor." Numerous cost containment efforts have been implemented in the Kansas Medicaid pharmacy program over the last several years, and in these economic times, it is important that the state continue to have as many tools as possible available to limit state spending, while still providing the services and supports vulnerable Kansans need.

The current Dispense as Written provision expires at the end of fiscal year 2003. SRS does not support the continuation of this provision for two important reasons:

- 1. Continuing and/or expanding the Dispense as Written (DAW) provision would limit the state's ability to participate in a multi-state drug compact. On March 14th, Governor Sebelius announced that Kansas is pursuing a multi-state drug purchasing agreement which would combine the buying power of Michigan, South Carolina, Vermont, Wisconsin and Kansas. This multi-state compact would give Kansas access to many more tools which could save state dollars and help slow the growth of the Medicaid program. By continuing the DAW provision, Kansas' ability to take full advantage of such a multi-state agreement would be hindered.
- 2. The 2002 Legislature required SRS to create a Preferred Drug List (PDL) in order to ensure Medicaid beneficiaries can receive the pharmaceuticals they need, but at the lowest prices possible. The PDL was implemented in December 2002.

HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS

Continuing the DAW provision would greatly limit the projected savings which can be achieved as a result of the PDL.

SRS projects \$3.4 million (\$1.3 million SGF) will be saved through the PDL in state FY 2003 and \$5 million (\$1.975 million SGF) in state FY 2004.

The Preferred Drug List was developed with the assistance of an independent clinical advisory committee of practicing physicians and pharmacists who reviewed clinical evidence and determined if drugs within specific therapeutic drug classes are equivalent in terms of safety, efficacy and clinical outcomes. The advisory committee was not provided individual drug pricing information. Their recommendations were clinical in nature only. For the drugs determined by the advisory committee to be clinically equivalent, SRS then considered the net cost to the Medicaid program when establishing the PDL. The average cost for preferred drugs is significantly less than the average cost for non-preferred drugs.

Medicaid beneficiaries continue to have access to non-preferred drugs through the prior authorization (PA) process. That is, through the PA process, any beneficiary can receive any non-preferred drug if it is medically necessary. A PA can be for an extended period of time. Typically, a PA is granted for a 6 or 12-month period of time.

Since the implementation of the PDL the number of claims for preferred drugs has been increasing, while the number of claims for non-preferred drug has been decreasing. However, among the non-preferred drugs, claims written as "Dispense as Written" are increasing. In the first month of the PDL, of the claims that would have required prior authorization, about 40% were overridden with DAW from the prescriber. This has limited the savings which could be realized from the PDL.

The Dispense as Written provision impairs the clinical review process conducted by the independent PDL advisory committee and creates the potential for unnecessary and preventable over-utilization of more costly non-preferred drugs.

For these reasons, SRS does not support continuation of the Dispense as Written provision. We will be happy to provide the Committee with any additional information about the PDL or other pharmaceutical cost containment strategies we have employed.

Drop-in recreation programs that are for children five years and older provided by a municipality, the salvation army, the boys and girls club of America where the children are free to come and go from the premises without being escorted by a parent or responsible person and short-term educational programs or classes for children in which the supervision and care of the children are incidental to their participation in the activity or training in specific subjects including, but not limited to, music, dance, religion and the program provider does not assume responsibility for the provision of daily child care outside the scheduled program;

Day camping or recreation programs for children five years and older which have as the primary emphasis outdoor education and recreation and are operated between school terms for no more than seven hours per day or which are accredited by the American camping association or other national standard-setting agency or church camp accreditation programs which must provide standards equivalent to the American camping association standards;

This proviso section shall not preclude any person who is not required to be licensed under K.S.A. 65-501 *et seq.*, and amendments thereto, from applying for a license nor shall this section preclude the secretary from issuing a license to any person not required to be licensed.

Provided, That, in addition to the other purposes authorized by K.S.A. 82a-1802 and amendments thereto, expenditures may be made from the interstate water litigation fund for: (1) Litigation costs for the case of Kansas v. Colorado No. 105, Original in the Supreme Court of the United States, including repayment of past contributions; (2) expenses related to the appointment of a river master or such other official as may be appointed by the Supreme Court to administer, implement or enforce its decree or other orders of the Supreme Court related to this case; and (3) expenses incurred by agencies of the state of Kansas to monitor actions of the state of Colorado and its water users and to enforce any settlement, decree or order of the Supreme Court related to this case.

Horse Fair Racing Benefit Fund

You asked about a Senate Ways and Means recommendation to transfer \$300,000 from the Horse Fair Racing Benefit Fund to the State General Fund. The source of receipts to this fund is one-third of the parimutuel tax for simulcast races. After October 1, 2003, there will be sufficient reserves to transfer \$300,000 to the SGF because the revenue stream, based on the past 10 years, will be sufficient to fund the two operating grants in the summer of 2004. Further study of this fund could be conducted for Omnibus in order to research and determine if additional money might be diverted to the SGF. There are two fairs that have received grants (Eureka and Anthony) from this fund.
