### MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMERCE COMMITTEE.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Karin Brownlee at 8:30 a.m. on May 1, 2003 in Room 123-S of the Capitol.

Chairperson Brownlee welcomed Janet Buchanan from the Kansas Corporation Commission to brief the committee on the recent SBC report to the KCC on not fulfilling the requirements of DSL deployment in Docket Number 98-SWBT-677-GIT. Ms. Buchanan clarified to the committee that today she is not speaking on behalf of the Commission but on behalf of the Commission Staff. She is here to provide information regarding facts and disputed matters but cannot provide any information regarding how the Commissioners may rule on this matter. Senator Barone voiced his discomfort with having Ms. Buchanan speak on this topic. Chairperson Brownlee indicated that she invited Ms. Buchanan and that because telecommunication is a responsibility of this committee, it is important for the committee to be apprised of DSL deployment.

Ms. Buchanan read from her written testimony. She reviewed the history leading up to the docket, beginning in 1998. The docket was opened in 1998 in order to evaluate whether or not SBC-KS's level of KUSF support was appropriate or if its support should be modified. (See Attachment 1 for a detailed explanation of the docket history.) SBC made an agreement on January 6, 2000 regarding DSL deployment with a deadline of August 2003, which SBC has indicated they cannot meet. Commission Staff was puzzled that SBC-KS did not apply for an extension until April 23, 2003, though they knew for over three years that deployment must be completed by August 2003. Staff is concerned because prior reports from SBC-KS regarding DSL deployment provided to the Commission contained inaccurate numbers on deployed equipment. The committee did not have any questions for Ms. Buchanan.

Chairperson Brownlee asked Steve Weatherford, president of the Kansas Development Finance Authority, to introduce the two candidates for the KDFA board who are having confirmation hearings today. Mr. Weatherford introduced Dan Watkins, an attorney in Lawrence, and Brett Reber, an attorney in McPherson.

Daniel L. Watkins gave the committee brief background information on himself. (Attachment 2) He has lived in Lawrence for 30 years as an attorney. Senator Brownlee asked him what interests him in being on the KDFA board. Mr. Watkins responded that he has seen what bonds can do locally for schools, jails, and other things, and is excited about the possibility of these long-term capital markets. Senator Brownlee asked Mr. Watkins what his thought on ERO 30 is. He replied that it makes sense. Kansas may be the only state without a single family housing authority. He answered questions about his work on Governor Sebelius' campaign.

Brett A. Reber gave the committee brief background on himself. (Attachment 3) He grew up in Ellsworth, received his undergraduate degree from KU and his law degree from the University of Tulsa. He began his career as a litigator but is now in business law. Senator Brownlee asked Mr. Reber what he thinks of adding housing to KDFA and what expertise he brings to the board. He responded that he

believes the people in the housing department would like to be under KDFA. His expertise is in industrial revenue bonds in McPherson. He does not have any specific expertise in housing. Senator Kerr asked him if he sees any potential conflicts of interest because KDFA will have \$4.5 million annually in ten-year tax credits to distribute, handing out a total of \$50 million in tax credits per year. Mr. Reber did not see any potential conflict of interest.

Chairperson Brownlee had additional questions for Mr. Watkins on housing and the private sector. He responded that he has relatively little experience in housing, and without legislative authorization, government should not compete with the private sector.

Senator Barone moved to approve Brett Reber and Daniel Watkins's confirmations for the KDFA board. Senator Emler seconded. The motion carried.

Chairperson Brownlee mentioned that outside bond attorneys have noticed additional cleanup is needed on the Star Bond bill. Senator Kerr said that it is prohibited to change things in conference that have not been done in either chamber. Senator Brownlee stated that she is committed to only doing clean up changes and not policy changes.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:25 a.m.

Briefing of Recent Developments in Docket Number 98-SWBT-677-GIT Janet Buchanan, Chief of Telecommunications On behalf of Kansas Corporation Commission Staff

Before the Senate Commerce Committee May 1, 2003

Chairperson Brownlee and members of the Senate Commerce Committee:

I appear today at the request of Chairperson Brownlee. Because the information requested is related to an open proceeding in which decisions are pending, I wish to clarify that I appear on behalf of the Commission Staff. I can provide information regarding facts and disputed matters but cannot provide any information regarding how the Commissioners may rule on this matter. With that clarification, I will begin by providing some background regarding Docket Number 98-SWBT-677-GIT.

### Background

- On April 29, 1998, the Commission opened this docket of the purposes of evaluating whether SBC-KS's level of KUSF support was appropriate or if its support should be modified.
- Various disputes arose regarding the relevancy of the production of certain information, documents and studies. Those disputes were the subject of an appeal before the District Court of Shawnee County, Kansas, Division 11.
- In an effort to settle the discovery disputes and avoid further lengthy and costly delay, the parties to this proceeding entered into a Stipulation and Agreement on October 18, 1999. The Commission issued an order approving the Stipulation and Agreement on January 6, 2000.
- The Stipulation and Agreement contained several provisions. They are:

  SBC would make DSL available to Kansas customers in 40 wire centers in
  24 communities over a three year period beginning on August 1, 2000.

  DSL was to be provided near ubiquitously in Hays, Hutchinson, Kansas
  City, Lawrence, Manhattan, Salina, Topeka and Wichita. DSL was to be
  provided where technically feasible in Arkansas City, Bonner Springs,
  Coffeyville, Dodge City, El Dorado, Emporia, Garden City, Great Bend,

Independence, Leavenworth, Liberal, McPherson, Newton, Ottawa, Parsons and Pittsburg.

SBC-KS would provide a free 800 line to each public K-12 school and county seat within its service territory in which approximately 10% of the school's or county seat's constituents are required to make toll calls to gain access to such entity.

SBC-KS would provide Extended Area Service between Topeka and Rossville and forego the lost toll and access revenues.

SBC-KS would spend an additional \$250,000 for one calendar year to increase awareness of the availability of Lifeline service.

SBC-KS's KUSF support for high cost areas would be determined in Docket Number 99-GIMT-326-GIT. The company's KUSF support would be fully portable to any eligible telecommunications carrier who wins a customer from SBC-KS.

SBC-KS would permanently forgo \$15 million of the \$65 million in KUSF revenue the company had received prior to this docket. SBC-KS would be allowed to rebalance to local rates the difference between the KUSF support determined in Docket Number 99-GIMT-326-GIT and \$50 million. (That amount to be rebalanced to local rates was eventually determined to be approximately \$40 million.)

SBC-KS would be allowed to implement customer specific pricing for all toll and WATS services. Rates for those services would be priced above long-run incremental cost and imputed access charges.

Staff and CURB would not oppose an application by SBC-KS for price deregulation of Plexar services, Auto Redial and Speed Calling.

SBC-KS would file a collocation tariff in Kansas with terms and conditions that met FCC requirements. The tariff was to be based on the collocation tariff utilized at that time in Texas. The company would also file cost studies and supporting data to establish Kansas-specific pricing for collocations services.

SBC-KS would no longer be required to be the designated carrier for intraLATA toll in exchanges for which it is not the incumbent local exchange carrier.

SBC-KS would reduce access charges by \$4.7 million. The company would be allowed to rebalance the reduced revenue to local rates.

SBC-KS would dismiss without prejudice the discovery dispute appeal.

• Through letters to Staff, SBC-KS provided updates on its progress with DSL deployment on December 26, 2001 and September 6, 2002. Those letters contained information that led Staff to believe that deployment was proceeding at a reasonable pace.

### Recent Developments

- On March 17, 2003, the Commission issued an order in this docket (Docket Number 98-SWBT-677-GIT), directing SWBT to file reports regarding its compliance with the Commission's order approving the Stipulation and Agreement requiring SBC-KS to deploy DSL in 40 wire centers within 24 Kansas communities. The Commission requested that SBC-KS provide answers to specific questions contained in the Commission's order. SBC-KS would be required to file three reports regarding its progress using updated data for each report.
- On April 7, 2003, SBC-KS filed its first of three required reports. SBC-KS provided the following information that it believed to be responsive to the Commissions request.

For each wire center, SBC-KS reported the number of living units served by the wire center, the number of living units with access to DSL within 15,500 feet of the central office, the number of living units with access to DSL beyond 15,500 feet of the central office and the percentage of total living units that have access to DSL. SBC-KS noted that, theoretically, within 15,500 feet of the central office all customers should have access to DSL. However, there are some technological impediments that could prevent some customers from receiving that service. SBC-KS was not yet able to quantify the number of living units affected by the technological limitations.

The company also reported the number of remote terminals that had been deployed to provide service beyond 15,500 feet of the central office.

SBC-KS submitted maps of each wire center illustrating the availability of DSL. Data regarding investment in DSL facilities and revenue gained through the provision of DSL services was also reported.

SBC-KS made the Commission aware for the first time that the company would not meet the required deadline of August 2003 for deployment of DSL. The company expects to complete the required deployment by yearend of 2003.

SBC-KS also made the Commission aware for the first time that it had reported erroneous information to the Staff in letters dated December 26, 2001, and September 6, 2002.

- On April16, 2003, SBC-KS filed a motion for extension of time to meet the required deployment of DSL. The company indicated that it would need an additional five months to complete the required deployment in the near ubiquitous wire centers. SBC-KS cited several reasons for the delay. The company states that the Kansas deployment is a very large project and it is difficult to estimate the time necessary to complete the deployment. The company indicates that the telecommunications industry has experienced an economic downturn. SBC-KS has had to reallocate resources. SBC-KS indicated that it is interested in using a new vendor to provide some of the necessary equipment. The company believes this equipment will be more efficient. However, SBC-KS indicates that the equipment will not be available until some date in the future.
- On April 23, 2003, Staff filed a response to the report of SBC-KS. From the information provided by SBC-KS, Staff identified several issues for which it believes further clarification should be provided.

First, SBC-KS recently made Staff aware that one of the wire centers in the Kansas City metro area that was included in the Stipulation and Agreement serves no Kansas customers. SBC-KS provided the list of wire centers during the negotiation of the Stipulation and Agreement and presumably believed that Kansas customers were served by the wire center. Staff suggested that SBC-KS be required to clarify why the wire center was placed on the initial list. If it was placed on the list in error, Staff suggests that the Commission may wish to require additional deployment in another Kansas City metro area wire center to compensate for the deployment it had anticipated would benefit Kansas customers.

The information provided by SBC-KS also raised concerns for Staff regarding whether the company would be meeting the definitions of "technically feasible" and "nearly ubiquitous" as represented through written testimony and under examination at the hearing held regarding the Stipulation and Agreement. The maps provided by SBC-KS indicate there are many areas within near ubiquitous wire centers for which it has no plans to deploy DSL. It appears, from the level of detail provided, that some of those areas have residential development and for which deployment would have been contemplated under the terms of the Stipulation and Agreement. Staff requested that a greater level of detail be provided regarding these areas. Regarding the technically feasible deployment, Staff requested that greater detail be provided so that it could be verified that deployment met the level anticipated.

Staff was also concerned that prior reports regarding DSL deployment were inaccurate. From those reports, it appeared that SBC-KS was

making steady progress toward meeting its commitment. The magnitude of the error is significant. According to the information provided previously, SBC-KS would have deployed 424 remote terminals by August of 2002. In fact, as of February 1, 2003, only 254 remote terminals have been deployed. As yet, SBC-KS has not been able to provide an explanation for this reporting error. Staff suggested that a fine would be appropriate. However, Staff was uncertain whether K.S.A. 66-138 or K.S.A. 66-175 is applicable in this situation. Staff suggested that SBC-KS be required to produce a detailed explanation of the reporting error.

Staff was disturbed by the indication in the report that SBC-KS would not meet the required deadline for deployment. Staff accorded little value to the DSL provision of the Stipulation and Agreement other than the value of certainty in timing of deployment. Staff suggests that missing the deadline is a breech of the Stipulation and Agreement and a violation of a Commission order.

- On April 23, 2003, Staff also filed a response to SBC-KS' motion for an extension of time to deploy DSL. Staff does not disagree that the size of the deployment is large. However, the size of deployment was certainly a primary factor considered by the parties to the Stipulation and Agreement when determining the completion date. While SBC-KS has known for over three years that deployment must be completed by August 2003, and certainly if this deployment were a priority for SBC-KS then that time afforded the company flexibility in resource allocation. Staff was also puzzled that SBC-KS waited so long to make the Commission aware that it desired to use the more efficient equipment of a new vendor but that the equipment was not yet available. Staff believes it is prudent to use the most efficient technology available but believes SBC-KS should have notified Staff on a timely basis so that options could have been more fully explored. Staff suggests that the Commission impose penalties through K.S.A. 66-138 for violation of a Commission order. The statute provides for a penalty of between \$100 and \$1000 per offense. It also specifies that every day during which a company fails to comply with the order is a separate and distinct violation. Staff also suggests that each wire center for which deployment is delayed would also represent a separate violation. In the alternative, Staff suggests that SBC-KS could make amends for the belated completion of its DSL deployment by agreeing to extend deployment to additional communities.
- On April 24, 2003, the Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board (CURB) filed a response to the report and motion for an extension of time of SBC-KS. CURB's response highlighted many of the same issues raised by Staff. CURB also suggested that the request for an extension of time should be denied and remedies made. In addition to penalties that can be levied through K.S.A. 66-138, CURB suggests that a "rebalancing" of the terms of the Stipulation and Agreement is in order. CURB suggests that SBC-KS be required to provide a one-time refund, a

reduction in local rates, a reduction of local rates by increase KUSF support, additional DSL deployment or some combination of these suggestions.

- SBC-KS, Staff and CURB met April 30, 2003, to see if an agreement could be reached to resolve the issues in dispute. SBC-KS has agreed to provide additional information to Staff and CURB and further discussions are expected.
- At the May 1, 2003 Administrative Meeting, the Commission will discuss the report filed by SBC-KS, the responses to the report filed by Staff and CURB, the motion for an extension of time and the responses of Staff and CURB to that motion.
