Chairman Edmonds opened the meeting calling for bill introductions. There were none and the Chairman directed the committee's attention to Subcommittee report on **HB 2834** (<u>Attachment</u>).

Representative O'Malley, chairman of the subcommittee, reported that they came to the conclusion that no immediate action should be taken on **HB 2834** and requested interim study on issues relating to Excise Tax vs. Impact Fee.

Representative Larkin related that this bill has been around for two to three years and is to help low income people better manage their money and have money available for unforseen needs. He thinks it is a good idea. Representative Larkin made a motion to pass the bill out favorably. The motion was seconded by Representative O'Malley.

Chris Courtwright, Legislative Research Department, suggested technical amendments regarding the dates

<u>Representative Larkin made a motion to amend HB 2409 with the recommended technical corrections.</u>

<u>Representative Thull made a second to the motion.</u> Vote was taken. Motion carried.
