MINUTES OF THE HOUSE TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Gary Hayzlett at 1:30 P.M. on January 27, 2005 in Room 519-S of the Capitol.

Chairman Hayzlett called for bill introductions. <u>Representative Long made a motion to introduce a bill that would restrict the use of a wireless telephone while driving. Representative Ballard seconded the motion and the motion carried.</u>

The Chairman recognized Carmen Alldritt, Director, Motor Vehicle Div., KS Department of Revenue, who introduced a bill to clarify language from 2003 legislation and create the hazmat fee fund. A motion was made by Representative Long to allow the introduction of the bill, Representative Yonally seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Chairman Hayzlett recognized Brad Smoot, appearing on behalf of Explore Information Services, L.L.C., a subsidiary of The Schwan Food Company of Salina KS. Mr. Smoot requested that the committee introduce a bill to allow access to certain public information contained on Kansas motor vehicle records, requiring an amendment to KSA 74-2012. According to Mr. Smoot, this information will help insurers identify undisclosed youthful drivers and generate some additional revenues for the State from the sale of these records. Representative Ballard made a motion to accept this bill introduction, Representative Humerickkhouse seconded and the motion carried.

There being no additional requests for bill introductions the Chairman opened hearings.

HB 2090 - Failure to show proof of insurance, citation issued to owner

Chairman Hayzlett opened the hearings on <u>HB 2090</u>. The Chairman introduced Representative Bob Bethell. According to Representative Bethell (<u>Attachment 1</u>) current law states that the owner of a vehicle in order to license that vehicle must show proof of insurance. However, if a non-owner driver of that vehicle is stopped for another infraction and cannot show proof of insurance, the driver is cited for the violation. <u>HB 2090</u> will place the accountability and responsibility of having insurance clearly on the owner of the vehicle - not the driver. Representative Bethell answered questions from the Committee.

There were no other proponents and no opponents.

Chairman Hayzlett closed the hearing on HB 2090.

HB 2109 - Child passenger safety, seat belts manufactured after 1968.

The Chairman opened the hearings on <u>HB 2109</u>. Chairman Hayzlett recognized Representative Bob Bethell. Representative Bethell said he was requesting that the law of Kansas be clarified with the specific language of <u>HB 2109</u> concerning the use of seat belts in vehicles older than 1968 (<u>Attachment 2</u>). He said that in 1968 on January 1, federal law was enacted to require all vehicles assembled from that time on be equipped with

seat belts. <u>HB 2109</u> is a clarification that will allow owners of vintage vehicles to operate them on the highways of Kansas without fear of being cited for not having seatbelts in the vehicle. The addition of seatbelts to some of these vehicles would not only be difficult but would reduce the value of the vehicle due to the modification. Representative Bethell stood for questions from the Committee. One of the questions concerned the date if it should remain January 1st, 1968 or the bill should be amended to state the date of manufacture. After some discussion it was decided the bill should not be amended because it mirrors federal law.

There were no other proponents and no opponents. The Chairman closed the hearing on HB 2109.

The Chairman called for Final Action on <u>HB 2090.</u> Representative O'Malley moved to pass this bill out favorably. Representative Humerickhouse seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Chairman Hayzlett called for Final Action on <u>HB 2109.</u> Representative Yonally made a motion to pass this bill out favorably, seconded by Representative Ballard, and the motion carried.

Representative Ballard made a motion to approve the Minutes of the Committee Meetings of January 18 and 19, 2005. This motion was seconded by Representative George and the motion carried.

There was a short discussion on touring the KDOT facilities. The Committee agreed it was something they would like to do so a tour will be arranged.

There being no further business the Chairman adjourned the meeting. The next meeting will be on Wednesday, February 1, 2005, in Room 519-S.
