The meeting was called to order by Chairman Pete Brungardt at 10:45a.m. on Wednesday, March 16, 2005, in Room 231-N of the Capitol.

Chairman Brungardt announced the revisions on tomorrow's agenda and next week's agenda due to late arriving bills. Copies of additional information was furnished the committee members from Phil Bradley in response to questions raised regarding fees paid to the state during the hearing on March 9 on <u>SB 274</u>. Final Action on:

SB 276 - Transitional licenses for appraisers

Chairman Brungardt called for discussion and final action on <u>SB 276</u>. The Chairman explained the bill which was a technical change in order for the Kansas appraisers to be in line with the same interval years as in the federal statute. The Revisor suggested the committee might want to make it effective on publication of the Kansas Register.

Senator Reitz made a motion to amend SB 276 by making it effective on the date of publication in the Kansas Register, and to move it out favorably as amended. Senator Gilstrap seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

SB 274 - Microbreweries; packaging and warehousing license, Sunday hours; sales of Kansas wine by the drink at the state fair

Chairman Brungardt called for discussion and final action on <u>SB 274</u>. He reviewed the bill regarding the establishment and allowing a warehouse to exist in addition to the primary premise where the microbrew was made. It also involved making Sunday hours conform to the hours that municipalities are maintaining for Sunday sales. The Revisor explained that Sections 3 and 4 were deleted, and will be drafted as a separate bill. The Revisor noted on page 3, line 29, the reference to microbrewery packaging and warehouse license, should read as "microbrewery packaging and warehouse facility license." The word "facility" had been left out in the drafting and should be inserted. Also, the committee discussed that the wording "beer enthusiasts" should be deleted on page 2, line 20.

Senator Vratil moved to amend SB 274 to have the annual fee for the microbrewery packaging and warehouse facility license be changed to \$100 instead of \$50 to cover the administrative costs. Senator Reitz seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Senator Vratil made a motion to adopt all the suggested amendments as explained by the Chairman in reviewing the bill, seconded by Senator Reitz, and the motion carried.

Senator Vratil moved the adoption of the bill as amended and pass it out favorably, seconded by Senator Reitz, and the motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:55 a.m. The next meeting scheduled is Thursday, March 17, 2005.
