Representative Merrick moved to introduce legislation regarding uniform policy provisions. The motion was seconded by Representative Hutchins. Motion carried.

Alan Conroy, Kansas Legislative Research Department, presented a report from the Subcommittee reviewing the State Pay Plan on the Governor's recommendation for the pay package for state employees for FY 2007.

Representative Schwartz moved to adopt the Subcommittee report on the Governor's recommendation for the State Employees Pay Plan for FY 2007 (Attachment 1) and include approval for the Legislative Coordinating Council (LCC) to fund a consultant to perform a study of a new pay matrix and pay plan. The motion was seconded by Representative Feuerborn. Motion carried.

Discussion and Action on HB 2957 - Appropriations for FY2007 and FY2008 for capital improvements for various state agencies; HB 2958 - Appropriations for FY2006 and FY2007, supplemental appropriations for various state agencies; HB 2968 - Appropriations for FY2007 for state agencies; and HB 2950 - Appropriations for FY 2006 for Kansas racing and gaming commission.

The Fiscal Analyst Staff of the Kansas Legislative Research Department presented and explained the following documents:

- State Water Plan Fund: FY 2006-FY 2007 (Attachment 7).
- Children's Initiatives Fund FY 2005-FY 2007 (<u>Attachment 8</u>).
- Comparison of FY 2006 Budget as approved by the 2005 Legislature, and as Recommended by the Governor and the House Committee (Attachment 9).
- Comparison of FY 2007 Budget, Baseline Budget and Budget as Recommended by the Governor and the House Committee (<u>Attachment 10</u>).

Representative Feuerborn moved for an amendment to add \$338,860 to the Legislative Coordinating Council budget for FY 2007 for a consultant to perform a study of the pay matrix and pay plan of state employees. The motion was seconded by Representative Landwehr. Motion carried.

Representative Landwehr moved for an amendment to shift funding of \$250,000 State General Fund for FY 2007 from the Smart Start program in the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services to the Department of Health and Environment - Health, to fund the phenylketonuria (PKU) and hemophilia program for FY 2007. The motion was seconded by Representative Bethell. Motion carried.

Representative Landwehr moved for an amendment to shift a proviso pertaining to children's eye exams, passed by the Committee on March 9, 2006, from the Kansas Health Policy Authority budget to the Department of Education budget. The motion was seconded by Representative Bethell. Motion carried.

Representative Powell moved for an amendment to delete \$1 million of the funding from the Kansas Health Policy Authority budget for FY 2007 for the Child Support Enforcement (CSE) customer service center. The motion was seconded by Representative Pilcher-Cook. Motion carried on a 14-8 vote.

Representative Powell moved for an amendment to add a proviso to the Department of Wildlife and Parks for FY 2007 that no expenditure can be made to pump ground water from playa lakes or wetlands. The motion was seconded by Representative Schwartz. Motion carried on 12-8 vote.

Representative Henry moved for an amendment to add \$3,206,914 State General Fund (SGF), to

the FY 2007 budgets of the Mental Health Hospitals and the Developmental Disabilities Institutions to be allocated as \$2,137,538 for Larned State Hospital; \$422,627 for Osamatomie State Hospital; \$11,304 for Rainbow Hospital; \$599,445 for Kansas Neurological Institute (KNI); and \$36,000 for Parsons State Hospital. The motion was seconded by Representative Sharp. Motion withdrawn with the approval of the second.

The Committee discussed the recently passed Budget Reconciliation Act and its effect on Medicaid funding. The state has approximately 800 to 900 residents who are currently in institutions who could now be eligible for an 80 percent match of federal Medicaid funds to move these individuals into the communities. If the state participates in this program and develops a state plan, it was noted that not all of this funding may be needed.

Representative Henry moved for an amendment to add \$2,206,914 State General Fund (SGF) to the FY 2007 budgets of the Mental Health Hospitals and the Developmental Disabilities Institutions proportionally and further review at Omnibus. The motion was seconded by Representative Landwehr. Motion carried.

Representative Schwartz moved for an amendment to add a proviso in the Attorney General's budget for FY 2007 to allow the Attorney General to negotiate a loan agreement with Groundwater Management District No. 3 from the Interstate Water Litigation Fund to the State General Fund (SGF) for purposes related to water rights. The motion was seconded by Representative Light. Motion carried.

Representative Tafanelli moved for an amendment to add a proviso to request an interim study on veterans' funding issues, specifically how veterans' service organizations are funded. The motion was seconded by Representative Henry. Motion carried.

Representative Gatewood moved for an amendment to add \$50,000 State General Fund (SGF) to the Attorney General's budget for FY 2007 along with the provisions in **HB 2797** which creates an investigative position for worker's compensation fraud. The motion was seconded by Representative Feuerborn. Motion failed.

Representative Ballard moved for an amendment to add \$1.5 million All Funds to reduce the waiting list for Developmental Disabilities of which \$600,000 is State General Fund (SGF). The motion was seconded by Representative Feuerborn. Motion carried.

Representative Schwartz moved for an amendment to request a report by Omnibus from the Kansas Water Office on the number of new or replacement stream gauges the agency anticipates purchasing in coordination with USGS. The motion was seconded by Representative Powell. Motion carried.

Representative Bethell moved for an amendment to add a proviso to the University of Kansas budget for FY 2007 with language stating that "on July 1, 2006, if no bill has been passed by the legislature during the 2006 regular session and enacted into law to establish the University of Kansas Cancer Center by statute, then the amount of \$5 million appropriated for the University of Kansas Medical Center by subsection (a) of this section from the state general fund in the cancer center account, is hereby lapsed". The motion was seconded by Representative Landwehr. Motion carried on a 13-9 vote.

Representative Sharp moved for an amendment to add \$1.2 million State General Fund (SGF) for the Center for Independent Living for FY 2007. The motion was seconded by Representative Ballard. Motion failed on a 9-12 vote.

Representative Sawyer moved for an amendment to amend the State Universities for FY 2007 by restoring the \$2,388,172 for personal computer purchases. The motion was seconded by Representative McLeland. Motion failed on a 8-13 vote.

Representative Lane moved for an amendment to amend the Department of Administration budget for FY 2007 by adding \$192,170 State General Fund (SGF) for KPTS-TV in Wichita for upgrades.

The motion was seconded by Representative Pottorff. Motion failed on a 8-13 vote.

Representative Feuerborn moved for an amendment to amend the Department of Education budget for FY 2006 by deleting \$364,746 from the State General Fund (SGF) for 7.0 FTE positions to begin a multi-year project to develop the Enterprise Data Warehouse. The motion was seconded by Representative Lane. Motion failed on a 8 - 14 vote.

Information from Bob Corkins, Commissioner of Education, with regard to the Enterprise Data Warehouse project, was distributed to the Committee (Attachment 11).

Representative Hutchins moved for an amendment to revise the language in the Department of Education budget for FY 2006 to change the 7.0 FTE for the Enterprise Data Warehouse project to unclassified-temporary positions. The motion was seconded by Representative Merrick. Motion carried.

Representative Gatewood moved for an amendment to add \$600,000 for the Center for Independent Living for FY 2007 to be proportionally distributed. The motion was seconded by Representative Sharp. Motion failed on a 8-14 vote.

Representative Sawyer moved for an amendment to add a proviso to the Secretary of State's budget for FY 2007 to allow for advance voting by satellite voting center as addressed in **HB 2744** (Attachment 12). The motion was seconded by Representative Gatewood. Motion withdrawn with approval of the second.

Jim Wilson, Office of Revisor of Statutes, indicated that the Committee could not act on the proviso because it is not within the subject of the bill for state constitutional purposes.

Representative Hutchins moved for an amendment to delete a \$20,000 enhancement in the budget of the Kansas Humanities Council for FY 2007 for the "Kansans Tell Their Stories". The motion was seconded by Representative Huy. Motion carried.

Representative Pottorff moved to move the contents of **HB 2950** into **HB 2958**. The motion was seconded by Representative Feuerborn. Motion carried.

Representative Landwehr moved to recommend **HB 2968**, **HB 2957** and **HB 2958** favorable for passage as amended and allow staff to make technical adjustments as necessary. The motion was seconded by Representative Hutchins. Motion carried.

Chairman Neufeld, on behalf of the Committee, thanked the staffs of the Kansas Legislative Research Department and the Office of the Revisor of Statutes for their diligence and hard work in working with the Committee in the preparation of the budgets.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:20 p.m. The next meeting of the Committee will be held at 9:00 a.m. on March 13, 2006.

The Chairperson of the House Appropriations Committee appointed the State Employee Pay Subcommittee to review and make any necessary adjustments to the Governor's recommended FY 2007 state employee salary enhancements.

The Subcommittee held three meetings and received information from the Kansas Association of Public Employees (KAPE), the State Employee Association of Kansas (SEAK), the Department of Corrections, and the Division of Personnel Services, Department of Administration.

Governor's Recommendation

Staff reviewed the FY 2007 Governor's recommended pay plan enhancements. The major components of the Governor's FY 2007 pay package include:

- Base Salary Adjustment. For classified employees of the Executive Branch, the Governor recommends a 2.5 percent base salary adjustment effective June 13, 2006. For unclassified Executive Branch employees, including Regents faculty, Judicial Branch employees, and non-elected employees of the Legislative Branch a 2.5 percent unclassified merit pool, to be distributed on the basis of merit. In addition, the Governor recommends a 2.5 percent salary increase for statewide elected officials (i.e., Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, State Treasurer, and Commissioner of Insurance) and Justices and judges of the Judicial Branch. Cost \$50.0 million from all funds, including \$24.8 million from the State General Fund.
- Longevity. Funding for longevity bonuses (\$40 a year for each year of service for those classified employees that have at least ten years of service up to a maximum of 25 years). Cost – Incremental increase above FY 2006 is \$0.3 million from all funds, including \$0.1 million from the State General Fund.
- Correctional Officer Enhancement Package. Combine the Corrections Officers IA, IB, and II position classes into a single Corrections Officer class on pay grade 20 of the classified pay matrix. Cost \$3.2 million, entirely from the State General Fund.
- <u>Building Trades Retention Incentive</u>. Provide a retention incentive of approximately 2.0 percent for skilled trades job classes, such as carpenters, plumbers, painters, electricians, power plant operators, and utility workers. Cost—\$0.9 million from all funds, including \$0.5 million from the State General Fund.

Subcommittee Recommendations

After considerable discussion, the Subcommittee recommends the following items for the FY 2007 state employee salary enhancements:

- Step movement (2.5 percent) for Executive Branch classified employees, including Regents classified:
 - Movement on September 10, 2006 (six bi-weekly pay periods into the fiscal year);
 - o Funding for Step 16 (2,069 employees) effective September 10, 2006; and
 - 2.5 percent increase for those employees (258) above pay grade, effective September 10, 2006.
- A 1.5 percent base salary adjustment for all Executive Branch classified employees (including Regents) at the beginning of the fiscal year.
- An additional 2.5 percent increase (for a total of 6.0 percent, once step movement takes place) at the beginning of FY 2007 for:
 - Uniformed Correctional Officers of the Department of Corrections;
 - Juvenile Correctional Officers of the Juvenile Justice Authority; and
 - Maximum State Security Hospital Employees (121) who currently earn hazardous duty pay.
- Add \$0.30 per hour retention pay for building trades retention incentive at the beginning of FY 2007.
- Unclassified employees 2.0 percent merit pool at the beginning of the fiscal year:
 - Executive Branch unclassified employees, including statewide elected officials and Regents faculty;
 - Judicial Branch employees, including Justices and judges; and
 - Legislative Branch employees, including legislators.
- Add additional Kansas Bureau of Investigation Agents (projected to be at least four additional agents); and
- Increase the entry level Correctional Officer salary to \$25,820 from \$24,211 (Pay Grade 17, Step 6 from Pay Grade 17, Step 4) at the beginning of FY 2007.

The following table reflects the State General Fund impact on the preceding recommendations, which total \$28,031,013. This amount is \$338,860 less than the Governor recommended.

^{1.} This amount is transferred to the State General Fund as part of a transfer of special revenue funds from amounts not required for the pay plan and KPERS death and disability rates increase due to adjustments by the Legislature.

^{2.} The Governor recommends this funding for agency operations.

^{3.} The Governor recommends this item as a one-time expenditure to establish a child Support Enforcement Customer Service Center. The funding will be matched with \$1.32 million from the federal Child Support Enforcement Administration Fund, for total FY 2007 expenditures of \$2.0 million.

^{4.} These expenditures have been shifted to the State General Fund.

^{5.} The Governor's recommendation reflects a full year of funding for multiple projects in FY 2007. The FY 2006 funding covered only one project.

Economic Development Initiatives Fund (EDIF) Overview

The statutes governing the EDIF provide that it shall be used to finance programs "... supporting and enhancing the existing economic foundation of the state and fostering growth ... to the state's economic foundation." With the exception of a statutory \$2.0 million transfer from the EDIF to the State Water Plan Fund, the Legislature annually appropriates the EDIF for individual projects and programs deemed to support and enhance the state's economic foundation.

The EDIF is funded through the State Gaming Revenue Fund (SGRF). A portion of state revenue from both the Lottery and parimutuel wagering is transferred to the SGRF. That fund is used essentially as a holding fund from which further transfers are made on a monthly basis. No more than \$50.0 million may be credited to the SGRF in any fiscal year. Amounts in excess of \$50.0 million are credited to the State General Fund.

The initial transfers from the State Gaming Revenue Fund, which began in 1986, were as follows:

- 1. County Reappraisal Fund (until June 30, 1989) 30.0%
- 2. Split between Juvenile Detention Facilities Fund and Correctional Institutions Building Fund (Actual amount to be determined by appropriations act) 10.0%
- 3. Economic Development Initiatives Fund (to be increased to 90.0% as of July 1, 1989) 60.0%

During the 1988 Session, the Legislature delayed the increase in the transfer to the EDIF until July 1, 1990.

During the 1994 Session, the Legislature changed the transfers as of July 1, 1995 to the following:


- 1. Correctional Institutions Building Fund 10.0%
- 2. Juvenile Detention Facilities Fund 5.0%
- 3. Economic Development Initiatives Fund 85.0%

During the 2000 Session, the Legislature changed the transfers to the following:

- 1. Economic Development Initiatives Fund—\$42,432,000;
- 2. Correctional Institutions Building Fund—\$4,992,000;
- 3. Juvenile Detention Facilities Fund—\$2,496,000; and
- 4. Problem Gambling Grant Fund—\$80,000.

¹⁾ In addition to this amount, the Legislature directed that \$200,000 from Smart Start be granted to the Infants and Toddlers program (Tiny K), for total funding of \$1,000,000 in FY 2005 and FY 2006. The Governor recommends a direct appropriation of CIF funding for FY 2007.

²⁾ These programs were transferred to the Division of Health Policy and Finance in FY 2006 under the provisions of 2005 SB 272. The bill provided that the programs would transfer to the Health Policy Authority beginning in FY 2007. The Governor recommends the programs remain at DHPF for FY 2007. The House Committee recommends the programs transfer to the Authority as provided in the bill.

Use of Children's Initiatives Fund Money

KSA 38-2102(b) directs the use of the Children's Initiatives Fund (CIF) as follows:

- CIF funds ".... shall be used for the purposes of providing additional funding for programs, projects, improvements, services and other purposes directly or indirectly beneficial to the physical and mental health, welfare, safety and overall well-being of children in Kansas..."
- In allocating funding, the Legislature "...shall emphasize programs and services that are data-driven and outcomes-based and may emphasize programs and services that are generally directed toward improving the lives of children and youth by combating community-identified risk factors associated with children and youth becoming involved in tobacco, alcohol, drugs or juvenile delinquency."
- All programs must have a clearly articulated objective, be supported by credible research, constitute best practices in the field, have data available to benchmark the program's desired outcomes, have an evaluation and assessment component as part of the program design.
- CIF dollars "...shall not be used to replace or substitute for moneys appropriated from the state general fund in the immediately preceding fiscal year."

The Kansas State Board of Education is requesting \$2.4 million over four fiscal years to design and implement an Enterprise Data Warehouse. This system will integrate approximately 80 major databases in the agency to decrease the reporting burden on schools, streamline federal reporting, improve public access to school academic and financial data, guide data-driven decision making, foster data sharing, and position the department to implement growth modeling. Growth modeling will allow the state to measure the academic progress of individual students longitudinally to ensure that all Kansas children learn what is expected of them.

To begin development of this project, the State Board is requesting a supplemental appropriation in FY 2006 of \$364,746, including salaries for seven new unclassified-temporary positions. For FY 2007, the Board is requesting \$375,167 (above the Governor's recommendation of \$109,388) which will, in part, fund an eighth new unclassified-temporary position. We are requesting unclassified-temporary positions to facilitate the elimination of any staff that are no longer needed once the system is up and running.

The State Board is also requesting \$300,000 per year over a three-year period to continue operation of the KAL-Tech Leadership Academy which has been funded the past four and a half years through a private grant received from the Gates Foundation. Although the focus of the Gates Grant was on superintendents and principals, the State Board would like to extend this training to other school personnel, including teachers demonstrating promising leadership skills. An estimated 200 school leaders would receive leadership training annually through this program.

Research suggests that leadership can account for as much as 25 percent of the student learning that takes place in the classroom. KAL-Tech encourages school leaders to think "outside the box" in redesigning educational delivery systems that meet the needs of all students. It also promotes technology, innovation and best practice, as well as successful leadership strategies. The State Board is requesting 1.5 FTE positions to deliver this program, including the coordination of statewide leadership sessions and follow-up meetings.

Before inspection of any advance voting ballot application list, the person desiring to make such inspection shall provide to the county election officer identification in the form of driver's license or other reliable identification and shall sign a log book or application form maintained by such officer stating such person's name and address and showing the date and time of inspection. All records made by the county election officer shall be subject to public inspection, except that the voter identification information required by subsections (b) and (c) and the identifying number on ballots and ballot envelopes and records of such numbers shall not be made public.

- (i) If a person on the permanent advance voting list fails to vote in two consecutive general elections held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year, the county election officer may mail a notice to such voter. Such notice shall inform the voter that the voter's name will be removed from the permanent advance voting list unless the voter renews the application for permanent advance voting status within 30 days after the notice is mailed. If the voter fails to renew such application, the county election officer shall remove the voter's name from the permanent advance voting list. Failure to renew the application for permanent advance voting status shall not result in removal of the voter's name from the voter registration list.
- (j) For the purposes of this section, "first-time voter" means a registered voter who has not previously voted in any election in the county in which the voter desires to vote. First-time voter includes a person whose name was removed from the county registration list in accordance with K.S.A. 25-2316c, and amendments thereto, and who has reregistered.
- 30 (k) The secretary of state may adopt rules and regulations defining valid forms of identification.

AN ACT concerning elections; relating to advance voting; amending K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 25-1122 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 25-1122 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-1122. (a) Any registered voter may file with the county election officer where such person is a resident, or where such person is authorized by law to vote as a former precinct resident, an application for an advance voting ballot. The signed application shall be transmitted only to the county election officer by personal delivery, mail, facsimile or as otherwise provided by law.

- (b) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to be transmitted in person, and such voter is a first-time voter, such voter shall provide a form of valid identification such as a current and valid Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification card, utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check or other government document containing the voter's current name and address as indicated on the registration book. Such voter shall not be required to provide identification if such voter has previously provided current and valid identification in the county where registered.
- (c) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to be transmitted by mail, and such voter is a first-time voter, such voter shall provide on the application for an advance voting ballot the voter's current and valid Kansas driver's license number, nondriver's identification card number or the last four digits of the voter's social security number, or shall provide with the application a copy of the voter's current and valid Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification card, utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check or other government document containing the voter's current name and address as indicated on the registration book. Such voter shall not be required to provide identification if such voter has previously provided current and valid identification in the county where registered.
- (d) If a first-time voter is unable or refuses to provide current and valid identification, or if the name and address do not match the voter's name and address on the registration book, the voter may vote a provi-

(e) Applications for advance voting ballots to be transmitted to the voter by mail shall be filed only at the following times:

(1) For the primary election occurring on the first Tuesday in August in even-numbered years, between April 1 of such year and the last business day of the week preceding such primary election.

(2) For the general election occurring on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November in even-numbered years, between 90 days prior to such election and the last business day of the week preceding such general election.

(3) For the primary election held five weeks preceding the first Tuesday in April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the last business day of the week preceding such primary election.

(4) For the general election occurring on the first Tuesday in April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the last business day of the week preceding such general election.

(5) For question submitted elections occurring on the date of a primary or general election, the same as is provided for ballots for election of officers at such election.

- (6) For question submitted elections not occurring on the date of a primary or general election, between the time of the first published notice thereof and the last business day of the week preceding such question submitted election, except that if the question submitted election is held on a day other than a Tuesday, the county election officer shall determine the final date for mailing of advance voting ballots, but such date shall not be more than three business days before such election.
- (7) For any special election of officers, at such time as is specified by the secretary of state.
- (8) For the presidential preference primary, between January 1 of the year in which such primary is held and the last business day of the week preceding such primary election.

The county election officer of any county may receive applications prior to the time specified in this subsection (e) and hold such applications until the beginning of the prescribed application period. Such applications shall be treated as filed on that date.

(f) Unless an earlier date is designated by the county election office, applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in person in the office of the county election officer shall be filed on the Tuesday next preceding the election and on each subsequent business day until no later than 12:00 noon on the day preceding such election. If the county election officer so provides, applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in person in the office of the county election officer also may be filed on the Saturday preceding the election. Upon receipt of any such properly executed application, the county election officer shall deliver to the voter such ballots and instructions as are provided for in this act.

An application for an advance voting ballot filed by a voter who has a temporary illness or disability or who is not proficient in reading the English language or by a person rendering assistance to such voter may be filed during the regular advance ballot application periods until the close of the polls on election day.

In any county having a population exceeding 250,000, The county election officer may designate places other than the central county election office as satellite advance voting sites. At any satellite advance voting site, a registered voter may obtain an application for advance voting ballots, such ballots and instructions shall be delivered to the voter in the same manner and subject to the same limitations as otherwise provided by this subsection.

- (g) Any person having a permanent disability or an illness which has been diagnosed as a permanent illness is hereby authorized to make an application for permanent advance voting status. Applications for permanent advance voting status shall be in the form and contain such information as is required for application for advance voting ballots and also shall contain information which establishes the voter's right to permanent advance voting status.
- (h) On receipt of any application filed under the provisions of this section, the county election officer shall prepare and maintain in such officer's office a list of the names of all persons who have filed such applications, together with their correct post office address and the precinct, ward, township or voting area in which such persons claim to be registered voters or to be authorized by law to vote as former precinct residents and the present resident address of each applicant. Such names and addresses shall remain so listed until the day of such election. The county election officer shall maintain a separate listing of the names ar' addresses of persons qualifying for permanent advance voting status such lists shall be available for inspection upon request in complia.
