Chairman Sloan directed the committee's attention to three sets of minutes from previous meetings and asked them to read the minutes and let the committee secretary know by 5 p.m. on Tuesday, February 21 if there are any changes to be made. Chairman Sloan opened the floor for discussion on <u>HB 2775 - Three tuition levels at state educational institutions</u>. He drew the committee's attention to amendatory language proposed by Representative Owens creating a pilot program, limiting the program to voluntary participation, limiting the number of students per year in the program at each institution, and granting the Kansas Board of Regents the power to adjust nonresident rates of tuition to make the legislation revenue neutral. Representatives Phelps, Craft, Huff, Johnson, Pottorf, and Winn asked questions and offered their opinions on the language.

The motion carried.

Representative Carlin moved that **HB 2694** be taken off the table. Representative Phelps seconded the motion.

The motion failed 9 to 5.

9 AN ACT concerning nonresident tuition; fees and charges at state edu cational institutions

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a)In carrying out its duties relating to fixing tuition, fees and charges at state educational institutions pursuant to K.S.A. 76-719, and amendments thereto, the state board of regents shall fix the amounts of tuition in accordance with subsection (b).

- (b) There shall be three levels of tuition as follows:
- (1) The highest tuition level shall be the nonresident rate:
- (2)—the middle tuition level shall be the Kansas commitment rate, as described in subsection (c); and
 - (3) the lowest tuition level shall be the resident rate.
- (c) The Kansas commitment tuition rate applies to any person who agrees to reside in Kansas for at least five years after graduation from a state educational institution with a bachelor's degree and agrees to work in Kansas for five years after graduation. Any person who fails to abide by the five-year employment requirement shall owe the state of Kansas the difference between the nonresident rate and the Kansas commitment rate, plus interest. The state board of regents shall establish the rate of interest not to exceed the contract rate provided for in K.S.A. 16-207, and amendments thereto. In the event a graduate seeks full-time studies for an advanced degree study program, the five-year employment requirement shall not begin to run until the student finishes the advanced degree work or ceases to be a full-time student.
- (d) The state board of regents is authorized to adopt rules and regulations and policies relating to tuition, fees and charges, the collection of tuition and circumstances under which the five-year employment requirement is postponed or deemed satisfied.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

For school year 2006-2007 and three subsequent school years,

Each state educational institution shall have the discretion to offer the Kansas commitment rate.

No more than 250 students per year shall be authorized at any one institution. The estimated costs of administration of this act may be factored into the Kansas commitment rate.

(e) The board of regents may adjust the nonresident rate to make revenue neutral any estimated loss of revenues attributable to the Kansas commitment rate.
