MINUTES OF THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Mike O'Neal at 3:30 P.M. on March 2, 2006 in Room 313-S of the Capitol.

Chairman O'Neal opened the hearing on <u>SB 397 - adoption of a child born in a foreign country; evidence of US Citizenship</u>.

Senator Terry Bruce appeared as the sponsor of the bill. He explained that if a couple adopts a child from another country, that child's birth certificate would state that "This is not evidence of US citizenship". However, the US Department of Justice does issue to those who are foreign adopted a Certificate of Citizenship, but it can not be taken to the Kansas Department of Health & Environment to get a birth certificate without the above statement. Kansas had 1,356 foreign adoptions in 2000, with a little less than 200 receiving birth certificates from Kansas. (Attachment 1)

Dr. Lorne Phillips, Department of Health & Environment, appeared in opposition to the bill. Most all states use the same statement on their birth certificates. By removing it Kansas would be determining who is a US citizen and only the Department of Justice can do that. (Attachment 2)

Committee discussion centered on the fact that if the Department of Justice has issued a Certificate of Citizenship, why would a foreign adopted child not be able to receive a Kansas birth certificate without that statement, since the Department of Justice has certified they are a citizen.

The hearing on **SB 397** was closed.

The hearing on <u>SB 297 - sale of beer & wine by the drink on the state fairgrounds during the Kansas State Fair</u>, was opened.

Philip Bradley, Kansas Licensed Beverage Association, explained that the bill would simply allow the Kansas State Fair to enter into a contract with individuals to sell wine and alcoholic products during the Fair. The Fair promotes Kansas products and Kansas now has a large selection of wineries whom could possibly benefit from the enactment of such a bill. (Attachment 3)

Tuck Duncan, Kansas Wine & Sprits Wholesalers, was also in support of the proposed bill because it would add a venue for those who do not drink beer but would like to drink wine at the fair. (Attachment 4)

Written testimony in support of the bill was provided by Kansas Department of Commerce, Agriculture marketing Division. (Attachment 5)

The hearing on **SB 297** was closed.

The committee meeting adjourned at 5:15 p.m. The next meeting was scheduled for 3:30 p.m. on March 6, 2006 in room 313-S.

Senate Bill 397

Chairman O'Neal and members of the House Judiciary Committee,

I appreciate the opportunity to testify in favor of SB 397. I have submitted my written testimony in a summary type outline for your convenience. If you have any questions based on my written or oral testimony, I would be more than willing to address any concerns when deemed appropriate by the Chair.

Current Federal Law

Pursuant to the Citizenship Act, all foreign adopted children entering the US on an IR-3 Visa are automatic citizens of the United States upon entry. Such foreign adoptions will allow for a Certificate of Citizenship to be provided to the adopted child. This is a very hard to get document that is illegal to copy.

Current State Law

Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2423(b), the phrase "This certificate is not evidence of United States citizenship" must be placed on a foreign born adopted birth certificate. A hand full of states has this phrase on their foreign born birth certificates. Several states do not have this listed. One state does not mention this phrase, and they will substitute where the adoptee is living for the place of birth as opposed to listing the foreign country.

State of Affairs

According to the 2000 Census figures provided by the U.S. Census Bureau, a total of 1,586,004 adopted children live in the United States. Out of that figure, 199,136 are of foreign birth. Kansas has 19,733 adopted children of which 1,356 are of foreign birth.

These numbers are growing each year given the increase in foreign adoptions. On average, out of the approximately 2,000 new Kansas adoptions each year, a little less than 200 foreign born birth certificates are granted in Kansas each year.

The current status of having the phrase "This certificate is not evidence of United States citizenship" presents three problems to an ever growing population of our State. First, when these children reach the age to go to elementary school, it creates confusion between parents and school staff that require a "valid birth

certificate" for enrollment purposes. Second, although not intended to be offensive, it does produce a stigma on a portion of our population that may already feel different because of the circumstances of their nationality. Third, when these children become old enough to work, what employer will hire a person that has such a statement on the bottom of their birth certificate?

Concerns with the change to K.S.A. 65-2423(b)

States do not grant citizenship. Only the federal government has that authority. Even though these adopted children are by federal government standards U.S. citizens, there is concern that a black-market can be made to falsify foreign born birth certificates, which will lead to security breaches.

Evidently, some federal officials have said they may, at some undisclosed future date, not recognize as being valid a state's foreign born birth certificate that does not have the phrase "This is not evidence of United States citizenship" mentioned on them.

Options for the committee

I am a firm believer in the principle that the state of Kansas should make the policy for the state of Kansas. If the committee wants to pass SB 397, it should do so rather than wait for what mandate might come from the federal government. Additionally, if the federal government, prompted by the Department of Homeland Security, requires the phrase in question, that will be the least of our concern as such a mandate will most likely also require many more changes to how we document foreign born residents.

Testimony on Evidence of U. S. Citizenship on Foreign Born Certificates (Senate Bill 397)

Chairperson O'Neal and members of the Judiciary Committee, I thank you for the opportunity to appear before you today to discuss the need to retain the citizenship language on the Foreign Born Certificates.

K.S.A. 65-2423(b) provides for the filing of a Foreign Born Certificate when a child is born in a foreign country and adopted in Kansas by Kansas residents or is born and adopted in a foreign country by Kansas residents and the adoption is filed in Kansas. This certificate is a courtesy document, originally created for foreign born adopted children who have no birth certificate recorded in their country of birth. The Foreign Born Certificate includes the statement, "This certificate is not evidence of United States citizenship". This statement is crucial for clarifying the intent of the certificate.

The Foreign Born Certificate created and issued by the Office of Vital Statistics is affirming and attesting to the adoption which has been filed and completed in the state of Kansas, not to the citizenship status of the child. The basis for the creation of the certificate is the Report of Adoption forwarded by the county district court where the adoption is filed. The Office of Vital Statistics has no authority or basis to make determinations of citizenship. This is a federal responsibility that is designated to United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. The Child Citizenship Act of 2000 allows a foreign born adopted child to acquire citizenship after meeting certain requirements (at least one parent is a U.S. citizen; the child is under 18 years of age; a full and final adoption of the child; the child is admitted to the U.S. as an immigrant). The adoptive parents may obtain evidence of the child's citizenship by applying for a Certificate of Citizenship issued by United States Citizenship and Immigration Services.

Removing the statement on the Kansas Foreign Born Certificate would give the document the appearance of carrying the same probative value as the Standard Certificate of Live Birth. This is misleading and could lead to citizenship status and benefits applied incorrectly or fraudulently at the local, state, and federal level. There is no time constraint on filing a Foreign Born Certificate. These

Concern has been expressed over the difference in appearance of a Kansas Standard Certificate of Live Birth and the Certificate of Birth created for foreign born adoptees. In Kansas, these two documents are very similar, even with the citizenship language, as you can see by viewing the attached samples. Also attached are examples from other states, providing evidence of foreign born birth certificates with language clearly distinguishing them from standard certificates of birth. Also, a U.S. citizen who gives birth abroad cannot file the birth with a state vital records office. Proof of birth and citizenship is obtained from the U.S. State Department's issuance of a Consular Report of Birth Abroad. This document looks very different from the birth certificate copies issued by state vital records offices.

In addition, the Intelligence Reform and Terrorism Prevention Act of 2004 addresses the filing and issuing of birth certificates in light of national security concerns. Foreign Born Certificates are specifically addressed and the current language proposal states, "A certificate of foreign birth should be annotated on the face of the document with the statement, 'This is not proof of U.S. citizenship'." The promulgation of the Regulations for this Act is projected for 2007. If Kansas does not comply with Intelligence Reform mandates, federal agencies would refuse to accept Kansas birth certificates as documentary evidence for the application of Social Security benefits, passports, low income housing, or any federal programs requiring submission of a birth certificate.

We recommend that K.S.A. 65-2423 not be amended to remove the citizenship language. The Foreign Born Certificate provides verification of adoption and the after adoption information (child's name, adoptive parents' names, etc.). It is used to provide proof of date of birth and parentage. Evidence of citizenship is provided by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. If, however, the Committee determines the language is to be removed, we request the recommendation of changing the certificate title from "Certificate of Birth" to "Certificate of Foreign Birth".

I thank you for the opportunity to appear before the Judiciary Committee and will gladly stand for questions the committee may have on this topic.




In order to avoid problems that have resulted in numerous lawsuits in other states and the US Supreme Court decision, when advantages are shown to instate vs out-state products by the regulatory or legislative bodies, this bill has been amended to allow the possibility for the temporary permit holder to sell all those alcohol products that are legal for sale on premise in Kansas. It is worthy to note that although this allows for all those items to be offered for sale, the State Fair Board could limit the items that the venue could offer under their contract.

Therefore, we ask and urge you to pass SB-297.

Good morning, Chairman O'Neal and members of the Committee. I am Janna Dunbar, Agritourism Program Manager of the Ag Marketing Division of the Kansas Department of Commerce, and I want to thank you for this opportunity to offer our support for SB 297.

Our Division has a statutory obligation to assist with the domestic and international marketing of Kansas agricultural commodities and processed food products. One of the ways we have been able to assist the vineyards and wine makers in the state is through the Kansas State Fair. This past September we held the second annual grape stomp & wine judging. The grape stomp has garnered substantial media attention to this once vibrant industry. The Kansas State Fair Board has been extremely helpful in the organization and promotion of the event as well as the Department of Agriculture in supporting the growth of this industry.

However our Kansas farm wineries are unable to market their products at the fair due to prohibitions in current law. SB 297 would allow these farm wineries to sell their products to a large audience.
